#### 1. DISCLOSURES OF INTEREST

(Members Code of Conduct - Part 4A of the Constitution)

- (4) Officers must disclose interests in accordance with Council Standing Order 44.

#### 2.7 Relevant Representations Received

#### **Responsible Authorities**

#### Environmental Health

A representation has been received from the Environmental Health Officer who has concerns that noise nuisance may cause problems for local residents. In order to address the prevention of public nuisance objective the Officer has requested that the following conditions are placed on the Licence;

1. The consumption of alcohol or food or any other drinks in the external areas of the premises shall not be allowed after 23.30 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.

2. All outward opening exit doors and all windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place other than for normal access and egress.

3. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

4. The Licensee shall patrol the area outside the premises during periods of entertainment to ensure that noise is not audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.

5. Removal of refuse and emptying of bottle bins within the curtilage of the licensed premises shall not take place between the hours of 23.00 and 07.00.

The applicant has agreed to the conditions being placed on the Licence.

#### Individual, Body or Business

A letter of representation has been received from a local resident which raises concerns of noise and disturbance from loud music emanating from the premises late at night.

The representation is attached at Appendix 4.

#### 3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

#### Legal Appraisal

- **3.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) the prevention of public nuisance
  - d) the protection of children from harm
- **3.2** The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- **3.3** Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- **3.4** Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- **3.5** Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

#### Statement of Policy Issues

- **3.6** The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of public nuisance).
- **3.7** The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.





#### 4. OPTIONS

#### 4.1 Members may:

- (a) Vary a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
- (b) Vary a premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
- (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- **4.2** Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.





REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

AUTHORISATION OF PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

**IRRESPONSIBLE PROMOTIONS** 

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to,

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)

b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective, Page 31 c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective,

d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner,

e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

#### DRINKING WATER

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

#### AGE VERIFICATION

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –

a) a holographic mark, or

b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### DRINKS MEASURES

The responsible person must ensure that:

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: half pint
(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml and
(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises, and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### DUTY & TAX

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:

(a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979,

(b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula 'P' equals 'D' plus ('D' times 'V'), where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,

(c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence,

(d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question, and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.



- The consumption of alcohol or food or any other drinks in the external areas of the premises shall not be allowed after 23.30 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.
- All outward opening exit doors and all windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place other than for normal access and egress.
- Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exists reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.
- The Licensee shall patrol the area outside the premises during periods of entertainment to ensure that noise is not audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- Removal of refuse and emptying of bottle bins within the curtilage of the licensed premises shall not take place between the hours of 23.00 and 07.00.

I would like to make a representation to the Council with regard to the above variation request submitted to the council on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2016, namely

Films/Indoor Sports/Boxing or Wrestling/Live Music/Recorded Music/Performance of Dance/Supply of Alcohol Monday to Sunday 09.00 to 02.00. 09.00 to 03.00 on Christmas Eve/Boxing Day/Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of Bank Holiday weekends. New Years Eve 09.00 until the start of permitted hours the following day.

My representation is on the grounds of Public Nuisance.

The Midland is a large public house in the centre of Ilkley. However it is also on the edge of the residential district with its car park linking it to Whitton Croft Road and Wells Road, Whitton Croft Road being primarily residential and Wells Road shops and offices with flats above. There are also flats directly above the other properties on Station Road which are adjacent to the Midland.

As a resident of Whitton Croft Road, I know that allowing the Midland to remain open to 2am/3am will have serious noise implications for myself and other residents. On 30<sup>th</sup> August last year I complained to the then Landlord because of noise from an event being held in the car park. It is not acceptable that people are unable to sit it their own garden or have the windows open on hot days because of loud music from pub. During the day it is bad enough but the prospect of it being extended into the early hours is completely unacceptable. I would ask that, if the Licensing Authority disregard the implications for the town as a whole of another late night drinking venue and is minded to grant the application, that they place restrictions on the use of the outdoor areas to minimise the noise nuisance, including the car park.

I would also like to say that the "notification" of the application may meet the legal requirement but it is not adequate to inform interested parties. I discovered it when a colleague at work asked if I was aware of it. I never have any reason to walk past the front of the Midland, the pavement is narrow and if I am shopping in Ilkley I either walk down Wells Road or Chantry Drive and use the pedestrian crossings on Station Road and Springs Lane. There is no reason for anyone living in the area behind the public house to walk past the notice.
