I have worked hard on raising Bradford's positive profile with Government and with other funders. Bradford has had a number of visits from Government ministers in the last year and during that time Bradford has held a role on the Executive of Key Cities, a national body where large cities and towns come together nationally.

I'm particularly pleased that the Arts Council England funding has increased by 65% to local arts organisations in Bradford this year. Our local organisations have worked very hard to achieve that but also as a place, Bradford has pulled together to raise our profile at national level and show what potential we have for cultural excellence if we receive the investment we need. Our collective voice has been heard.

In my own ward, I am full of admiration for Wrose Carnival and how it has brought people together for a fabulous event. As ward councillors we have helped with this as much as possible including helping on the day and clearing up after the event.

I continue to be motivated by those individual successes of helping people in my ward when they contact us directly as ward councillors. We cannot always do everything people want but we do our best to satisfy.
