Worked to tackle local traffic risk issues in the ward, securing a refuge on Beacon Road, further improvements to address pressures on parking include the soon to open Fair Road car park.

Regular Surgeries at Wibsey Library continue to be very busy.

Actively supported the work on the Environment Scrutiny Committee. Challenging Executive and other agencies regarding growing issues of poor air quality and its growing impact on the health of residents.

Met and supported the work of local Voluntary Organisations working in Wibsey such as AFTOC, Home Start, Sandale Trust and OnTrak.

Successful Bankfoot Gala was delivered and working with the Wibsey Events Group the Wibsey Xmas Tree was secured for a second year running.

Action has been taken to improve the environment and engage with the communities in Denside and Bankfoot.
