# 1. SUMMARY

This report considers the objections received to the recently advertised Traffic Regulation Order to introduce Disabled Persons Parking Places at :-

- i. Welham Walk, Bowling & Barkerend
- ii. Woodroyd Road, Little Horton

and seeks the decision of the Bradford East Area Committee regarding these objections.

# 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In 2005 the Bradford East Area Committee approved changes to the process of providing Disabled Persons' Parking places to give a more flexible service and reduce the time taken to provide a space. New Disabled Persons' Parking Places in residential areas are now normally installed as 'Advisory' and do not have the backing of the Council's Parking Services enforcement. However, in the situation where the Advisory marking is being ignored/abused by other drivers parking in the space, a Formal DPPP can be implemented. These require the backing of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to allow parking officer enforcement, and a 'Blue Badge Holders Only' plate to be installed adjacent to the bay.
- 2.2 We received a concern from a resident with an existing Informal DPPP at Welham Walk, who is having difficulties using the space due to visitors to the area parking within the bay. They have requested that a Formal DPPP be implemented. The location of the parking place is shown on drawing no. N/BE/102174/11B, attached as Appendix 1.
- 2.3 We have also received a request for a DPPP at Woodroyd Road. There is an existing 'Resident permit holders only' restriction in place outside this property. It is recommended that a Formal DPPP be installed due to the existing parking restrictions on the road. The new restriction will be 'Resident permit parking for disabled badge holders only' within the parking place. The location of the proposed parking place is shown on drawing no. N/BE/102174/13A attached as Appendix 2.
- 2.4 At its meeting on 17th January 2013 the Bradford East Area Committee approved the processing and advertisement of 5 new DPPPs and revocation of 10 existing DPPPs (Doc AJ). To minimise legal advertising costs, these requests for the provision/revocation of Formal DPPP's in the Bradford East area were processed at the same time. The consultation on these proposals and formal advertisement of the TRO has resulted in objections at the two locations reported here.
- 2.5 The points of objection and corresponding officer comments are detailed in Appendix 3.

# 3. OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION

This report has not been considered by the Overview and Scrutiny Committee.

# 4. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Ward Members have been consulted on the proposals. No adverse comments have been received.

## 5. OPTIONS

Members may propose to follow a different course of action to that proposed in the recommendations and, in that case, will receive the appropriate guidance from officers.

## 6. FINANCIAL & RESOURCE APPRAISAL

It was advised in the Area Committee Traffic Measures schemes – Funding Progress and Budgets report (Doc C June 2013), that on occasions when a Formal DPPP is necessary a scheme could be included in the list of requests for Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO's). Funding (£5k) has been allocated from the Bradford East Area Committee's Traffic Measures budget for advisory DPPP's. It is expected that there will be sufficient funds within the 2013/14 budget to implement all requests for advisory DPPP's within that financial year and this TRO for Formal DPPP's.

## 7. RISK MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE ISSUES

There are no significant risks implications.

## 8. LEGAL APPRAISAL

- 8.1 Formal DPPP's are supported by Traffic Regulation Orders, and gives the Council's Parking Services Officers the powers to enforce the parking space.
- 8.2 The course of action proposed is in general accordance with the Council's powers as Highway Authority and will be carried out in compliance with the Highways Act 1980 and with the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.

## 9. OTHER IMPLICATIONS

## 9.1 EQUALITY & DIVERSITY

Equality is an important consideration for schemes within the Local Integrated Transport programme. Application of the budgets at a local level within the diverse communities of

the Bradford East constituency will assist in the provision of inclusive environments catering for the needs of people with mobility impairments.

# 9.2 SUSTAINABILITY IMPLICATIONS

There are no significant sustainability implications.

# 9.3 GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS IMPACTS





# POINTS OF OBJECTION AND OFFICER COMMENTS

LOCATION		POINTS OF OBJECTION	OFFICER COMMENTS
(i)	Welham Walk, Bowling & Barkerend	The proposed parking place will encroach onto neighbouring property. Objector's Mother who lives at the neighbouring property is disabled and requires visitors including district nurse and Doctors to park as close to the property as possible.	The proposed formal Disabled Persons Parking Place outside no. 1 Welham Walk is larger than the existing advisory space; 6.6m compared with the normal 5.4m long advisory space. However, the parking space has been extended towards Otley Road only and will not encroach in front of the neighbouring property at no. 5, and will have a negligible effect on current on-street parking arrangements.
(ii)	Woodroyd Road, Little Horton	There are already 3 Disabled Persons Parking Places on this street. Visitors to this property will now park in front of my house. There will be 4 less parking spaces available on the street. Granting of this space will lead to further requests for DPPP's on the street.	It is the Council's policy to provide Disabled Persons Parking Places for applicants who meet the criteria, in residential areas, to reduce access problems currently being experienced by the applicants close to their home.
		There is a yard to the rear of the property where they could park their vehicle off-street.	One of the Council's criteria for the provision of a DPPP is that the applicant does not have accessible off-street parking. The applicant has stated that parking in the back garden is not suitable for their needs.
		The applicant does not drive but is the wife of the vehicle owner.	There are many situations where the Blue Badge holder's partner or another family member residing at that address is the registered vehicle owner.
