1.0 SUMMARY

1.1 This report provides an update and outlines funding required to organise and deliver a large scale community cycling event in Peel Park on Sunday 22nd June 2014. The event has been called "Peel's on Wheels". It also highlights a greater commitment to using a variety of local voluntary cycling groups in order to deliver the event and to encourage more volunteering.

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 On Tuesday 23rd July 2013 the Bradford East Area Committee decided that the Bradford East Area Coordinator should bring together officers from Parks, Road Safety and Youth Service to consider ideas such as helping young people and others to become more bike-aware and encourage safe use of parks and roads, assisting cyclists to become more experienced road users.

3.0 MAIN REPORT CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 At a meeting on Wednesday 21st August 2013 it was agreed that officers would work together and organise a large scale cycling event in Peel Park. The event would be themed around two objectives:-
 - a) To make better use of public open space and provide young people with a safe environment to develop their cycling skills in preparation for road cycling.
 - b) To celebrate the arrival of the Tour de France Grand Depart in to the district on 5th & 6th July 2014.
- 3.2 Since the meeting referred to above officers have actively engaged with a number of voluntary organisations with a keen interest in cycling to help organise the event. Representatives from BMX Bandits, Bradford East Cycling Club, British Cycling and council officers have met on a number of occasions to think about what cycling activities and resources are needed for the event. The steering group propose to include various cycling activities.
- 3.3 Appendix A lists all the activities that will be on offer at the event. Appendix B shows additional activities that could be offered if funding is available.

4.0 OPTIONS

- 4.1 The Area Committee can decide to approve the recommendations within a limited budget as detailed in Appendix A.
- 4.2 Alternatively, community groups have applied for internal and external funding to complement the activities already detailed in Appendix A. Should the groups be successful in their bids then a larger scale event will be possible as outlined in Appendix B.
- 4.3 However, essential resources necessary for either option to go ahead are funding

for St Johns Ambulance and finance for publicity materials. Total costs for both items are expected to be approximately £1000.

5.0 RISK MANAGEMENT

- 5.1 An event notification form has been submitted to the Public Safety Liaison Group. Public liability insurance and community group risk assessments are being evaluated by the Area Coordinator's Office.
- 5.2 In addition, four St Johns Ambulance First Aid Members and two Cycle Response Units will be in attendance at the event to ensure event medical cover is provided.
