(Members Code of Conduct - Part 4A of the Constitution)

Notes:

A personal interest is prejudicial if a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts would reasonably regard it as so significant that it is likely to prejudice the Member's judgement of the public interest. The Member must withdraw from the meeting if the interest is prejudicial unless a dispensation has been obtained from the Standards Committee.
- (2) Members in arrears of Council Tax by more than two months must not vote in decisions on, or which might affect, budget calculations, and must disclose at the meeting that this restriction applies to them. A failure to comply with these requirements is a criminal offence under section 106 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992.
- (3) Officers must disclose interests in accordance with Council Standing Order 44.
