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Subject:

A Ward Investment Traffic Regulation Order is being progressed for 8 sites in the Wyke Ward. At 2 of the sites the proposals include Resident Permit Parking Places which do not meet the current criteria.

Winterton Drive and the surrounding streets, Wyke. Glenroyd Avenue/McMillan Gardens and surrounding streets, Wyke.

1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report discusses the criteria applied to streets where Resident/Business Parking Places is not met because more than 50% of the properties have off-street parking and the need to consider an amendment so Traffic Measures can deal with the problems identified at these particular sites.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 This committee gave approval to the funding of £7,300 for the 8 recognised problem sites and Traffic Regulation Order at its meetings of the 26th July and 24th November 2012.
- 2.2 All sites are supported by the 3 Ward Councillors.
- 2.3 The criteria for Resident/Business Parking places, has not been met as more than 50% have off-street parking, at these 2 sites. Cllr Sarah Ferriby supports the proposal that the committee considers making an amendment as a special case to address the issues at these 2 sites.
