1. SUMMARY

The report informs Bradford South Area Committee on progress to develop the GreenMoor Big Local Programme.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Big Local is an exciting opportunity for residents in 150 areas, in three waves of which Scholemoor and Lidget Green are in the second, around England to use at least £1m over 10 years to make a massive and lasting positive difference to their communities. It works in Councils and other key stakeholders to develop a partnership approach to bring together all the local talent, ambitions, skills and energy from individuals, groups and organisations who want to make their area an even better place to live.
- 2.2 Reports have previously been presented to the Area Committee on 26 July 2012 which outlined the initial programme of information sessions with local people, the development of a brief for the "Getting Started Funding" and the authorisation of Bradford CVS, working with CNet to deliver the programme funded by the "Getting Started Funding". This was followed by a further report on 28 March 2013 which gave a summary of the delivery work carried out to date under the Getting Started programme.
- 2.3 A further report was presented to the Area Committee on 23 January 2014 which gave an update including the setting up of the Community Partnership Board and the Community Plan being agreed in principle by the Big Local National Team. In addition, the renaming of the project to GreenMoor Big Local (serving Scholemoor and Lidget Green) has been agreed.
- 2.4 Appendix 1 provides an update on the progress to develop the GreenMoor Big Local Programme.

Big Local Lottery Funding of £1,000,000.00 over 10 years has been allocated thorough the Local Trust to deliver an agreed Community Plan.

GREENMOOR BIG LOCAL

(Serving the Lidget Green and Scholemoor area of City of Bradford)

Bradford CNet have been working in partnership with Bradford CVS over the GreenMoor Big Local project (Serving Scholemoor and Lidget Green area of Bradford District) for over two years. This is a ten year initiative by the Big Local Trust on making the area a better place to live, as part of a pioneering Big Lottery Fund (BIG) Scheme, to put decision-making in the hands of local people. We have been working with the Council and other key stakeholders to develop a partnership approach to bring together all the local talent, ambitions, skills and energy from individuals, groups and organisations who want to make their area an even better place to live.

Regular reports have been presented to the GreenMoor Board and to the Bradford Council Area Committee. The last report informed Bradford South Area Committee on progress to develop the GreenMoor Big Local programme and was presented to the Bradford South Area Committee on 23rd January 2014.

The GreenMoor Community Plan and its Action Plans have now been completed and they have been endorsed by the Big Local Trust. They are available on website: www.Greenmoorbiglocal.org

The Partnership Board agreed to amend the Terms of Reference to accommodate voting rights of Bradford Council elected Councillors. The Board agreed to include three elected members representing the wards in the GreenMoor Big Local area to join the GreenMoor Community Partnership Board. These three councillors now have full voting rights on the board.

The Board reviewed the arrangement of support and help from the current Big Local representative Steve Skinner. They considered other potential candidates but decided to continue with Steve Skinner, as their Big Local representative.

Bradford CVS and Bradford CNet have completed their current contract under the Pathway Scheme of Big Local, to provide support to the Board. Under the next stages of the Big Local Programme, the Partnership Board considered an application by Bradford CNet to be the Lead Local Trusted Organisation (LTO). The role included acting as their banker, administer their small grants programme, provide complete administrative, secretarial and monitoring support, and provide support and coordination over the implementation of the Action Plans of the Community Plan.

The Board gave their approval for appointment of CNet as an LTO for the next two years to be reviewed after twelve months. The role and responsibilities of the Local Trusted Organisation have been accepted by the Big Local Trust in London and necessary terms and conditions have been agreed between the Local Trusted Organisation and the Big Local trust.





The Board has now set up six task groups to be led by a GreenMoor Community Partnership Board Member. The task groups would explore what is in the area, where the gaps are, work with other agencies and partners, and submit details of projects that they feel will improve the quality of life of the residents of the area, and recommend them for consideration by the GreenMoor Community Partnership Board.

The six task groups, their aims & team leaders are as follows;

- 1. Safer and Stronger task group Aim to reduce Crime and improve a sense of safety -- Team leader Abbas Najib.
- 2. Healthier Happier –Aim to work with current health care providers developing a partnership to identify major funding for the development of health & leisure facilities Team leader Shabir Elahi.
- 3. For Richer not poorer –Aim to take steps to reduce unemployment in particular youth unemployment by provision of training and job search activities Team Leader Tayyiba Jarral.
- 4. Cleaner Greener— Aim to continue to improve environment by building on and extending current clean ups / stay clean schemes Team leader Shieraz Bashir.
- 5. Eastern European Community engagement Aim Work with LACO & other organisations over Eastern European engagement Team Leader Paul Bilton.
- 6. Youth Forum set up Increased Engagement & provision for Young People Team leader Marbat Hussain.

Efforts are being made to recruit as many community members as possible who are willing to contribute to the work of the task teams. – Invitations have gone out to various agencies, businesses, leading workers, volunteers, and residents. A number of people who work in the area or have the knowledge about the area have responded.

The Board invited applications for GreenMoor Small Grants Programme Round One 2014 from local voluntary and community organisations, based in the Big Local area or on its boarders for projects that will contribute to improve the quality of life for local people. They were very well publicised and advertised. Invitation to participate on the assessment panel was extended to all Board Members. Two independent members, experts from the voluntary sector also participated. Six voluntary groups were given grants totalling £5000 to carry out community activities in the area.

A new part time community engagement officer has been employed by Bradford CNet to work in the Big Local area. She is expected to co-ordinate the work of the task groups and provide the administrative support they need, and the support that the Board will need. She will also assist in carrying out the first year's tasks as per the Year One and Year two Actions Plans of the Community Plan.

Many thanks to all who are assisting towards the success of this project including Bradford Council elected Members, Members of Parliament, Staff from Bradford South and West Neighbourhood Offices, and all persons who live or work in the area. Community Partnership Board meetings are open to everyone in the area, including residents, volunteers, schools, statutory and voluntary agencies working in the area.
