1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report seeks to update members on Traffic Regulation Orders associated with planning approvals in Bradford South.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Planning permissions often include conditions or legal agreements that require the developer to fund the promotion and implementation of a Traffic Regulation Order.
- 2.2 This report details the following sites in the Bradford South constituency where there is an obligation for the developer to fund a Traffic Regulation Order: -
 - (i) New Works Road/Cleckheaton Road Low Moor Station (Appendix 1)
 - (ii) A644 Brighouse Road, Queensbury (Appendix 2)
 - (iii) Griffe Road/Rushdene Court, Wyke (Appendix 3)
 - (iv) Deanstones Lane/West End, Queensbury (Appendix 4)
- 2.3 Individual scheme details are provided in the Appendices as indicated in paragraph 2.2.
- 2.4 Delegated powers approval to prepare and advertise the proposals has already been obtained. However if there are any valid objections arising from the formal advertisement of a scheme, these will be reported to this Area Committee for consideration.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

PROGRAMME: Developer funded - Section 278 Agreement

PROGRAMME YEAR: 2014/15-2015-16

LOCATION: New Works Road, Low Moor, Bradford PROJECT NO: 100593

ISSUE:

Planning permission has been granted to construct a new railway station on land adjacent to New Works Road and Cleakheaton Road at Low Moor. The proposed car park access is on New Works Road. In order to prevent congestion, facilitate safe access and prevent conflict with local residential parking it is proposed to introduce waiting restrictions and permit parking on parts of New Works Road. Within the permit parking areas, an allowance of one hour parking for non-permit holders is proposed to maintain some short stay parking for residents' visitors and local businesses. As part of the planning permission, it is also proposed to construct a perpendicular parking area on New Works Road; it is proposed that bays within this area will be for permit holders only.

In order to rationalise the movement of large vehicles at the New Works Road/ Cleckheaton Road junction it is proposed to prohibit HGVs from entering New Works Road at this point. An alternative route via Brighouse Road will be signposted.

PROPOSAL: To promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce waiting restrictions and permit parking on parts of New Works Road and prohibit HGV's from entering New Works Road from Cleckheaton Road.



LOCATION: Brighouse Road, Queensbury, Bradford PROJECT NO: 102611

ISSUE:

Planning permission has been granted for a housing development on the Black Dyke Mills site off of Brighouse Road, Queensbury. The development is to include a new entrance off Brighouse Road opposite an existing supermarket access. The newly formed crossroads is to be signaised. In order to prevent congestion and facilitate safe vehicular and pedestrian movements, parking restrictions on Brighouse Road are required.

PROPOSAL: To promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce no waiting at any restrictions on Brighouse Road, Queensbury.



ISSUE:

Planning permission has been granted for a housing development on land adjacent to Griffe Road and Rushdene Court at Wyke. In order to prevent access difficulties on Rushdene Court and maintain clear visibility on Griffe Road, waiting restrictions are required.

PROPOSAL: To promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce no waiting at any restrictions on Griffe Road and Rushdene Court.



ISSUE:

Planning permission has been granted for a housing development (Hazelhurst Quarry) to be constructed in Queensbury. This development will potentially impact on a number of junctions and traffic management measures will need to be implemented in the interests of road safety.

PROPOSAL: To promote two Traffic Regulation Orders for waiting restrictions on Deanstones Lane, Long Lane and West End and proposed banned left and right turns and proposed one way street on an unnamed Street off Ford Hill.
