1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicants

The Quarry House (Haworth) Limited. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.

2.2 The Premises

Field adjacent to 3 Acres, Bingley Road, Keighley, BD21 5QE.

2.3 Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor

Mark Richard Hudson.

2.4 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Sale of alcohol for consumption on & off the premises
- Provision of regulated entertainment
- Provision of late night refreshment

Hours of licensable activities:

Sale of alcohol, provision of late night refreshment (from 23.00) & Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment

Friday & Saturday:	12.00 to 00.30

2.5 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

We intend to utilise the security company to keep and eye open for drugs, notices will be displayed all around the site, we intend to join pubwatch if required but we are in a very rural location, outside lighting is adequate but temporary lighting is proposed for the event, we have telephone numbers for local licensed premises should we need to contact them and the security company have a search policy.

b) Public safety will be achieved by;

We do not intend to provide emergency lighting in the field and the event is planned for summer, escape routes will be provided with the use of barriers, we are also going to keep attendance numbers to a sensible level, we are currently negotiating with St Johns Ambulance to provide first aid for our proposed event and will be booking them, seating is to be provided near all food and drink outlets and SNA security are providing attendants.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

We are situated in a rural area so public nuisance should be kept to a minimum. We are holding the event in a field so sound proofing is not possible unfortunately. However we would keep the music to a reasonable level. Litter patrols and bins are to be deployed. Loading arrangements are in place, cooking smells will be kept to a minimum in the open air (no noxious smells) last bands are due to finish at 22.15 on Saturday and 22.00 on Sunday. Windows and doors are not applicable, lighting is already in place and takes into account light pollution, signs asking patrons to leave quietly will be visible.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

To protect all children attending we will not be having adult entertainment whatsoever, we are providing a children's area where CRB checked staff will be present, we already operate a challenge 25 system and there will be no gaming machines on site, the last band is due to finish on Saturday at 22.15 and Sunday at 22.00 so therefore would expect parents to be responsible for the time their children would be here, all children must be accompanied by an adult and attendants will be present during all children's activities.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

We have already spoken to and pencilled in SNA security for the proposed event, I as personal licence holder intend to be at the event from start to finish on both days, all bar staff are trained on licensing issues and we already have a full CCTV system in place which we are proposing to extend to cover the field.





2.6 Relevant Representations Received

Individual, Body or Business

A representation has been submitted by a local resident. The representation raises concerns of anticipated noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and patrons accessing and leaving the site until late at night. Concerns are also raised regarding vandalism, trespass, litter and damage to property.

The letter of representation is attached at Appendix 2.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- **3.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- **3.2** The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- **3.3** Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- **3.4** Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- **3.5** Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

- **3.6** The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of public nuisance).
- **3.7** The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should





We write with regard to the above. Firstly, after reviewing the on-line application and the blue public notice we would like to point our some discrepancies in the application:

- 1. The blue public notice refers to the address being The 3 Acres, Bingley Road. The details of your website however, refer to "field" adjacent to the 3 Acres.
- 2. The timings on the blue notice are different from those on-line.

Secondly, we are very disappointed that Mr Hudson has not approached us about his application, as he will be fully aware of its impact on us and as his closest neighbours, it would seem to be the appropriate and decent action to take.

We have several concerns about this application as follows:

- The field is very close to our home, separated only by a dirt track, with a drystone wall around its perimeter and a low fence on our property so any entertainment held on the field will be highly visible to us and vis a versa, be very intrusive and have a negative impact on our daily lives.
- The extended trading hours are also unacceptable, as we will have to endure noise disturbance every evening till very late, resulting in disturbed and loss of sleep.
- We have concerns around lighting, this is a very dark location, there is no street lighting or private lighting and any additional lights at any events on the field again will be a

nuisance to us.

- We have very real concerns around vandalism, trespass, litter and damage to our property.
- A major concern is aound loss of privacy as our house directly faces the field and is approximately 1.5 metres from our boundary. It will be like living in a gold fish bowl.
- We won't be able to use our garden as any event will be very intrusive and ruin our privacy.
- Any events will cause distrubance to our dogs and will result in them barking and being unsettled with the constant comings and goings from noon till after midnight.
- Bingley Road is a country lane and is not suitable for such events and the resulting extra traffic; there are no road markings, pavements or road lighting.
- Previous events, such as the bonfire in November have caused traffic problems, and our driveway was blocked by parked cars. Part of the pub car park was used for catering and spectators not parking.
- The pub has parking but we feel this would be inadequate for a large event, causing vehicles to park on the road as mention above.
- The two previous bonfires held at the pub, have been an issue which we discussed with Mr Hudson. He was not particualy receptive to our concerns regarding the location of the bonfire and the positioning of the fireworks which mostly fell onto our property, resulting in the windows being covered in ash, firework reminants including pellets and plastic casing and 4ft stakes littering our house, garden and field. Footage is available if you wish to view it. Luckily there wasn't any serious damage but that was pure luck and due to the change in wind direction. Mr Hudson came to look at the aftermath, and was surprised by the amount of debris which had scattered on and around our property. We were going to raise our concerns again in adavance of this years Bonfire with Mr Hudson, and if we were not satisfied that he was taking our concerns seriously we would have no option but to contact the relevant authorities to take matters further.
- Highcliffe Farm has held the summer "Woodfest" in aid of Manorlands for several years, however due to problems with youths drinking (even though alchol was band), damage and theft they decided not to continue holding this event. We know that Mr Hudson is picking up the mantle on this and an article to this effect was published in the Keighley News earlier this year advertising it (see attached). We contacted Bradford Council regarding this to express our concerns as he already had bands lined up, was selling tickets for the event and hoping for 1000 plus people attending, when he has not got permission to hold it. He seems to be under the impression it is a for gone conclusion and has not consulted us in any way. Mr Hudson did mention it to us very briefly last November, saying he would talk to us about arrangements and suggested he would pay for us to go away for the weekend of the event. We declined, if the event did go ahead we would prefer to be home to keep an eye on things. Obviously, by making this offer, Mr Hudson is fully aware that the event will have an intrusive and detrimenal effect on us. He is classing it as a "family fun" event but he will be selling alchol and bearing in mind the problems the previous organisers had, we have grave concerns about its impact.
- If the application is approved, who do we hold liable for any damages we may suffer as a result; Mr Hudson or the Council for granting this licence.

We are in no way "party poopers" but this is a rural location and we do not feel that the extended trading hours or possible events on the field next to our house are appropriate for

such a location. We purchased this house due to its rural, quiet and private location; we were obviously aware of the pub next door, but it was a "rural" quiet pub with limited trading hours and we were comfortable with that. To date we have had no issues with the pub when events have been held inside, the only problem has been the bonfire which was held in the field.

Our main concern is that Mr Hudson is not interested in our reservations or fears and his opinion is "we are not his pub customers and we moved next to a pub so what do we expect". We expect to have our privacy and quality of life protected but If this application is approved we will have no say in anything that happens at the pub, and the results will have a very negative and detrimental effect on us. Our lives should not be made a misery just because the pub wants to increase its profits.

We are more than happy to discuss our concerns with yourselves and Mr Hudson in more detail if necessary.

Keighley's Woodfest event under threat after drunken violence

The hugely-popular Woodfest open air rock festival could be scrapped due to drunken violence at this year's event.

Crisis talks will be held by organisers of the Manorlands hospice fundraiser to decide whether to go ahead next year.

Volunteers at the event on a Cross Roads farm were left devastated by the behaviour of a small number of festival-goers at the weekend.

Youths, who had taken in their own alcohol, ran riot in the camping area, starting fires, stealing property and encouraging fights.

"We've never come across idiots like these," said Manorlands regional fundraiser, Andrew Wood. "They were just animals. "It was a small element of undesirables we've never had before. We meant Woodfest to be family-friendly, but in some parts it wasn't.

"There were serious issues in the camping section. A lot of the idiots never even went in the

performance area." About 20 of the troublemakers were ejected on Saturday evening by volunteer marshals, and two were later arrested by police.

But some of the youths remained, and trouble continued into the night.

Woodfest is named after Andrew Wood's cousin Richard, who with wife, Yvonne, hosts the festival at Highcliffe Farm on Lees Moor.

This year's event attracted about 1,000 people, doubling last year's proceeds to about £16,000 to support the Oxenhope Sue Ryder centre.

Andrew Wood said the majority of festival-goers had a great time listening to the music.

He added: "Ninety per cent of people there didn't know there were the problems going on. "It was just these few who spoiled it. They were legally old enough to drink so they brought their own beer in."

He added: "If we do decide to go ahead, we'll sort out these issues. And if Woodfest doesn't go ahead, it will be a shame because of the amount of money it makes and the good feeling it generates."

A Neighbourhood Policing Team spokesman confirmed a man and a woman had been given fixed penalties for being drunk and disorderly at the event.

A POPULAR annual music festival which raised thousands of pounds for a hospice has been axed due to drunken yobs.

Organisers of Woodfest say the event, which has coined-in £34,000 for Manorlands since it started seven years ago, is no longer viable.

Volunteers were forced to hire security staff and install fencing last year to prevent a recurrence of 2013 when booze-fuelled rowdies ran not, starting fires and stealing property.

"Attendances were down last year and we feel this is because some people were deterred from going because of what had happened," said Andrew Wood, a senior fundraiser at the Oxenhope Sue Ryder hospice.

"Unfortunately a minority of troublemakers spoiled the event for our long-term supporters and caused security costs to rise dramatically.

"The security team did a fantastic job but people rightfully wanted their entry fees to provide care for our patients, not be spent on hiring SIA staff and fences.

"Therefore it is with regret that the Woodfest committee has decided not to continue with

the event.

"I'd like to thank the committee for its support and the £34,000 raised towards our vital care in the past seven years."

At its peak, the festival – held at Cross Roads near Keighley – attracted 2,000 visitors and was a popular venue for bands.

Despite the axing of the event, landowner Richard Wood, on whose farm the festival took place, has vowed to continue supporting Manorlands.

He has taken part in the hospice's Starlight Hike and Mascot Gold Cup, raising nearly £600 in sponsorship from the two activities.

And he and many other Woodfest committee members have pledged to back new musical ventures planned in aid of the hospice.


One such event is Moorfest, being held at the Three Acres restaurant, Lees Moor, on July 11 and 12.

Andrew said: "We are delighted to have been chosen as a beneficiary of the event.

"We will be promoting that to our supporters in addition to other well-established musical fundraising events such as Proms on the Farm at Silsden and Groovy Happenings in Haworth."

Hospice fundraisers are also teaming-up with a newly-formed Music Helps Manorlands group to stage an event at the Octagon, Sandbeds, on July 3, and a new venture at Bolton Abbey in September.

Last month it was revealed that Manorlands will this year have to find an extra £200,000 to meet its running costs.



Main Event Areas




This image highlights the main event areas used during the event.


