The premises currently hold a Premises Licence with the following permitted hours;

Sunday to Wednesday: 10.00 to midnight Thursday to Saturday: 10.00 to 01.00 Christmas Eve: 10.00 to 02.30 New Years Eve: 10.00 to 02.30

Provision of regulated entertainment (Exhibition of films/Performance of live music/Playing of recorded music/Provision of facilities for making music/Provision of facilities for dancing) and Provision of late night refreshment (from 23.00)

Sunday to Wednesday: 10.00 to 12.30 Thursday to Saturday: 10.00 to 01.30 Christmas Eve: 10.00 to 02.30 New Years Eve: 10.00 to 02.30

#### 1.5 **Variation Application**

The variation application has been submitted to extend permitted hours for the provision of regulated entertainment (Exhibition of films/Playing of recorded music/Provision of facilities for making music) and include the Performance of dance (from 10.00)/Anything of a similar description to that falling within (e), (f) or (g) and Provision of facilities for entertainment of a similar description to that falling within (i) or (j).

Sunday to Wednesday: 09.00 to 12.30 Thursday to Saturday: 09.00 to 01.30 Christmas Eve: 09.00 to 02.30 New Years Eve: 09.00 to 02.30

Also to vary Condition15, to allow children under the age of 18 to remain on the premises after 21.00 hours in the restaurant area of the premises only whilst taking a table meal.

#### 1.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

None are required, the current conditions are sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

None are required, the current conditions are sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

None are required, the current conditions are sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

None are required, the current conditions are sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

None are required, the current conditions are sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

### 2. Relevant Representations Received

#### 2.1 Interested Parties

Local residents – A petition and 4 letters of representation have been received from local residents on the grounds of an anticipated increase in noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and noise and anti social behaviour from patrons leaving the premises late at night. Residents also have concerns regarding litter problems and children allowed on licensed premises after 21.00 hours.

The petition and letters of representation are attached at Appendix 2.

#### 3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) Public safety
  - c) The prevention of public nuisance
  - d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

### 4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered. Those in Annex A; Annex B; Annex D and Annex E may have conditions that are of particular relevance.

#### 5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
  - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
  - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
  - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

#### 6. Financial and resource appraisal

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

#### Re Application for Licences for HIDE Bar & Grill, corner of South Hawksworth Street and Cunliffe Road, Ilkley

On behalf of myself, my wife and many of the residents of Listers Court, I wish to register our opposition to the granting, in full, licences as detailed in the  $24^{th}$  July issue of the *Ilkley Gazette*. This application has been made by the owners of the *Hide* and grill without any thought for the wellbeing of residents of *Listers Court*. By asking for permission to open for up to 17 ... Jurs a day is ridiculous. Have the owners any evidence that there is a demand in Ilkley for people to eat, drink, dance and sing after midnight?

The application ignores the concerns of the Government has on young people drinking and the anti-social activities which arise from it. This application will encourage under age drinking.

We are also concerned about the application to allow all types of musical performances from 10am to 1am. What noise constraints will be imposed? Will continuous measurement devices be installed? I suggest, if music licences are granted, a maximum noise level is stipulated and when noise limits are exceeded the licensee should be fined. The amounts paid should escalate. Continued flouting of the conditions should result the licence being withdrawn until renewed by the City Council

What conditions will be imposed to reduce the slamming of car doors at night? May I suggest that waiting and parking of vehicles is prohibited on Hawksworth Street, South Hawksworth Street and Cunliffe Road between 8pm and one hour after the closing time of the bar and grill. At night there is usually plenty of room on the main car park.

I, therefore propose that the granting of a licence to HIDE Bar and Grill should contain the constraints:-

- Only children under the age of 16 will be allowed in the establishment from 9pm up to 10-30pm provided that they are members of a private party in a separate area which commenced before 9pm.
- Proof of age should be demanded by the licensee,
- The drinks and music licences should be granted between 11-30am and midnight (2am for New Year's Eve)
- Noise measurements should be continuous and continued violations result in the immediate closure
  of the establishment by a Policeman of Inspector or higher rank.

- Any security staff employed by the Hide to be police vetted, with costs to be paid by the licensee
- Patrons of the *Hide* to be reminded of the evening parking restrictions

My wife and I are not killjoys but already in town centre likely we see many examples of unsocial behaviour: take-away packaging thrown anywhere but the litter bin, vomit from the night before, urinating behind bushes, need I go on?

I trust therefore when you put your recommendations to your committee you will take into account my suggestions and that the committee remember they are elected.
