1. Summary

1.1 The applicant

Spirit Group Ltd. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

1.2 The Premises

Hare & Hounds, 47 Bradford Road, Menston, Ilkley.

1.3 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence and the operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Provision of late night refreshment (from 23.00 hours).
- Sale/supply of alcohol.
- Provision of regulated entertainment.

Hours of licensable activities:

Sale/supply of alcohol & provision of regulated entertainment (live music, recorded music, anything of a similar description, provision of facilities for dancing, entertainment of a similar description)

Sunday to Thursday: 10.00 to 23.00 Friday & Saturday: 10.00 to midnight

From the start of permitted hours New Years Eve until the end of permitted hours New Years Day (alcohol only)

Provision of late night refreshment:

Friday & Saturday: 23.00 to midnight

Proposed opening times for the premises:

Sunday to Thursday: 10.00 to midnight Friday & Saturday: 10.00 to 01.00

From the start of permitted hours New Years Eve until the end of permitted hours New Years Day

1.4 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder

The Licensee shall establish the use of approved door supervisors in the premises in accordance with any central government approved implementation plan.

The Licensee shall at all times maintain a "zero tolerance" policy with regard to illegal drugs (including appropriate staff training in detection and prevention);

and shall co-operate with the West Yorkshire Police's "Drugs Watch" initiative or any similar scheme.

The Licensee shall ensure that disc jockeys or other similar announcers employed at the premises shall at appropriate intervals request customers when leaving the premises to do so in a quiet and orderly manner.

The Licensee shall ensure that all instances of crime and disorder are recorded in an incident log book that is made available to West Yorkshire Police on request. West Yorkshire Police shall also receive regular reports of such incidents from the Licensee.

Any CCTV System installed at the premises shall be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and available to the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority on request.

b) Public Safety

The Licensee shall ensure that the designated premises supervisor and all management and staff employed are properly trained in the stated health and safety policy of the Licensee.

Free drinking water will be available at all times on request from patrons.

c) Prevention of public nuisance

The outdoor drinking areas are to be cleared of customers no later than 23.20 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to cooperate with this requirement.

All outward opening doors and windows are to be kept closed after 22.00 hours when regulated entertainment is taking place.

Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

The Licensee shall patrol the area outside the premises during periods of entertainment to ensure that noise is not audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises. The Licensee shall ensure that disc jockeys or other similar announcers employed at the premises shall at appropriate intervals request customers when leaving the premises to do so in a quiet and orderly manner.

d) Protection of children from harm

The Licensee shall enforce a recognised and effective proof of age policy in the premises in order to ensure unaccompanied under aged children are not allowed access when alcohol sales are taking place in the premises.

No regulated entertainment of an adult or sexual nature shall be provided at any time in the licensed premises.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

Locations of fire safety and other safety equipment subject to change in accordance with the requirements of the responsible authorities or following a risk assessment.

Any detail shown on the plan that is not required by the licensing plan regulations is indicative only and subject to change at any time.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Interested Parties

Local Residents – 2 letters of representation have been received, on the grounds of a possible increase in noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment held at the premises and also an increase in noise and disturbance from patrons using the beer garden. The representations also state that the premises are in a residential area.

A copy of the letter is attached at Appendix 2.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. Legal Options

5.1 Members may:

- (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
- (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
- (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence. (this will effectively mean that the premises could not open unless by authority of a temporary event notice without breaching the licensing laws).
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7. Other implications

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.3 Community safety implications

There are no apparent community safety implications.

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the

applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

- 11. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.



I am aware that a repeat application for extension of licencing hours has been made for the Hare and Hounds in Menston. I wish to put forward the same objections as I raised last time.

I object to the extension of licencing and opening hours for the Hare and Hounds Pub on Bradford Rd Menston. As a local resident I am concerned that this will have a negative impact in an almost wholly residential area. There will be increased noise and traffic after the acceptable hour of 11.00pm particularly from a Thursday to Saturday.

I have concerns as well about the environmental impact of this. At the moment there is excessive lighting at this pub after the hours of darkness and with the extension of opening hours there will be an increase in this light pollution. As many of the customers will not be immediately local there will be an increase in traffic noise and pollution after 11.00pm.

We write regarding the application for license renewal by the Hare and Hounds at Menston.

We have lived in a property that borders the beer garden for the last 22 years. Noise nuisance has gradually increased, noise from the beer garden and "Wacky Warehouse" travels significantly in this residential area.

Whilst we appreciate that the Hare and Hounds is a long established business and as such we have no wish to hinder its success we feel that having consideration and sensitivity for the surrounding houses in this residential area is a must.

As noise already travels from inside the pub (the "Wacky Warehouse") and beer garden, it is reasonable to assume that any increase due to live music, karaoke, dancing and extended hours could only result in an unfair and unacceptable noise increase for the neighboring houses, in addition longer opening hours would mean the noise nuisance going on for even longer and I could foresee an increase in both noise and rowdy behavior from the beer garden.

Any increase in noise has a direct and adverse effect on ourselves as does rowdy beer garden behavior.

Previously a provision was put in place to monitor beer garden noise after 10.pm but in practice this provision has had no effect with rowdy behavior in the garden often occurring, this can only get worse! (Copy of 2005 letter enclosed for information)

For these reasons we respectfully request that the license committee considers our concerns and takes account of them prior to granting of the license extensions requested.

Please could you advise me of the outcome of the decision.

We write regarding the applied for entertainment/extended opening licence at The Hare and Hounds Menston.

Our house borders onto the beer garden and we have lived here for twenty years, as such we have first hand experience of the pub.

Recently noise levels have increased considerably with music being played in the beer garden beyond 9pm and an increase in rowdy beer garden behaviour.

Music from the pub has been herd loudly playing in our house with the doors and windows shut leading to us having to phone up to complain about noise.

For the most part we have tolerated the noise levels, however about ten years ago a period of music being played, again after 9pm, loudly, and rowdy beer garden behaviour resulted in totally unacceptable noise levels and behaviour, at that time I recall a petition and environmental health became involved, leading to ceasing of the problem.

This is a built up residential neighbourhood.

Noise travels significantly to houses on Bingley road and Leathley Crescent from the pub, (you are welcome to call in and check this at our house when the pub is open).

Please don't turn our noisy neighbour in to a "neighbour from Hell" by allowing this licence to be granted along with the noise and rowdy behaviour increase that would most certainly follow.
