1. Summary

1.1 **The applicant**

Mr Ghulam Rubani, Mr Mohammed Shabir and Mr Asghar Ali. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

1.2 **The Premises**

Shama Bingley, Clarke House, Keighley Road, Bingley.

1.3 **Application**

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Provision of late night refreshment.
- Provision of regulated entertainment

Hours of licensable activities (late night refreshment from 23.00):

Monday to Sunday: 17.00 to 23.30

Other times premises proposed to be open:

Monday to Sunday: 17.00 to 23.30

1.4 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder

Building will have new lighting, also security system will be installed around the building. Burglar alarm to be installed as well.

b) Public Safety

Disabled facilities are available – first aid will be on the premises. Lighting which will not be a nuisance to neighbours will be installed.

c) Prevention of public nuisance

The building will have double glazed shop front to keep any noise (if ever) in. The music will only be background recorded music. Will keep litter clear from around our building. Unloading will be from designated spot only – signs to respect privacy of neighbours. Low noise extractor.

d) Protection of children from harm

We will make a policy of not serving underage children on our establishment.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

Our aim is to work with our neighbours and listen to them regarding their concerns if ever they have any. We will endeavour to make sure that our business does not have any adverse effect on their lives. We will consult and work together. We will do our best to promote harmony and co-existence in this area.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Interested Parties

Local Residents – 13 letters of representation have been received from local residents who have concerns about excessive noise and disturbance and state that the premises are in a residential area. Concern is also raised about alleged litter problems.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 2.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. **Statement of Policy Issues**

4.1 The following part of the Licensing Policy is of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).

4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence (this will effectively mean that the premises could not open between 23.00 and 05.00 unless by authority of a temporary event notice without breaching the licensing laws).
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. **Financial and resource appraisal**

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7. Other implications

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.3 **Community safety implications**

There are no apparent community safety implications.

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 - A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



Prevention of Crime and Disorder - the restaurant will attract back its clientele from the town centre who eat curry after a night drinking. This is out of town in a residential and conservation area, it will not be policed as the town centre is and there is no CCTV. This will attract minor acts of vandalism, drunkenness, littering and other acts of anti-social behaviour. The beautiful church yard will soon become awash with litter, half-eaten curries, vomit and urine if town centre drunks are attracted down here for a curry after hours.

Public Safety – the premises, close to a garage and petrol station has already been the source of one fire. Smokers will be outside the premises until 11.30 causing potential fire risk and noise nuisance. There is little room for parking and the main road will be used, drunken pedestrians and cars exiting and entering the parking area without good sight lines is a threat to public safety both for pedestrians and car drivers.

Prevention of Nuisance -- This application has people leaving the premises after midnight with associated noise, cars, taxis, litter, food waste, use of mobile phones and general roudiness. On Saturday nights this will mean that most residents of this area will have less than 5 hours between car noise from the restaurant and car noise from the arrival of car booters, which the council fails to control for a range of loop hole reasons but who are a constant nuisance from 5.30 am on Sunday mornings.

In short this restaurant is wrongly placed and should not be in a residential area, out of the town centre and close to a conservation area, planners were mistaken to agree it and the licensing team should not make the same mistake.

I formally object to the Grant of Premises Licence.

Reasons: Public Safety and Prevention of Nuisance Objectives

The extended closing time of 12.30 a.m. is excessive for a residential area and will cause noise, disturbance and nuisance into the early hours, 7 days a week.


Shama's position out of the town centre will draw customers from the town and surrounding areas into the residential Conservation Area of Old Main Street, Bailey Hills Road. Customers will inevitably create noise and disturbance due to the extra traffic and pedestrian activity generated.

The business should provide some off-street parking for its customers - the maximum being 44 spaces, the minimum 22 – based on the type of business and its floor area. Only 6 spaces, which include 2 for people with disabilities, are to be provided. Customers with vehicles will have no option but to park on Keighley Road, Old Main Street and Bailey Hills Road. Resident Parking on Old Main Street ceases at 6.00 p.m. meaning customers and residents will be competing for spaces and will be displaced to the Bailey Hills area. This traffic, along with more pedestrians coming and going from 5.00 p.m. to 12.30 a.m. is bound to create noise and nuisance and could jeopardise road safety due to pedestrian / vehicular conflict.

Clarke House is adjacent to several businesses involved with the motor trade, including a Petrol Station and M. O. T. garage. The building has already suffered 2 fires, which were attended by the Fire Service. One involved a car, which burned out next to the gas inlet and the other a wheeled bin that was pushed to the front of the building and ignited. Serious consideration regarding the safety of customers, residents and workers of local businesses should be given due to the volatile nature of substances used in the surrounding buildings combined with customers from Shama smoking outside Clarke House.

The neighbourhood is not immune to parking and noise problems, particularly on Sundays, but things usually quieten down by early evening. Allowing Shama to operate to 12.30 a.m. is unacceptable, bound to cause nuisance and could have fire and road safety implications. For these reasons and to accord with Public Safety and Prevention of Nuisance Objectives, the Application for Grant of Premises Licence should be rejected.



Good morning.

I write with reference to an application by Mr Rubani of the Sharma Restaurant to request an extension of opening times from 11.30pm to 12.30 to allow 'clearing of the building'.

The original application to the planning office was for 11.30pm (done and dusted) and this is what has been agreed so 1 cannot now understand why he is requesting an extension.

The majority of the planning objections to this restaurant were based on the noise and traffic nuisance this would cause. This conservation area of Bingley is predominantly residential with several small businesses that close well before 6.00pm, with the exception of the 24 hr filling station which is sporadically busy up until about 9.30pm. My nephew does the night shift and is often 'falling asleep' with boredom from 10.00pm onwards.

It staggers me that they have allowed a restaurant here in the first place, but at least there was 'some small degree' of compassion for the residents and their right to a peaceful existence, when a closing time was set of 11.30pm – however, it appears that this is again, in jeopardy.

I have spoken to Mr Rubani, who states that whilst he is prepared to 'shut the door at 11.30pm he will continue to serve any 'waiting diners' – well, I'm sorry but how is 'waiting diners' measured? Incidentally, he has had a recent application for a 'waiting area' upstairs, turned down – however he is submitting a third application to relocate some of the downstairs utilities upstairs, therefore creating more space for diners downstairs or even possibly another waiting area (??)– which isn't a problem – provided they have gone by 11.30pm!

He furthermore told me, that unlike the Sharma of old, he was wanting to create a high class, quality restaurant - all other 'proper restaurants' in Bingley stop serving at 10.00pm so why does he feel the need to continue after (perhaps, he's hoping to get the late night drinkers wanting a curry on their way home ...who knows). I work long hours and have two young children, and the last thing I want 7 days a week is a restaurant operational well into the early hours (clearing up or otherwise) and feel that this will be detrimental to our enjoyment of peace.

Mr Rubani is intending to 'pack' as many people into his restaurant as he possibly can (by his own admission, he requires at a MINIMUM 70 covers on two major sittings every day to recuperate his refurbishment costs. Perhaps he should have considered his costs prior to commencing un-authorised works and furthermore he should have considered the implications when he decided to move his restaurant from the town centre to a residential periphery.

I would also like to draw your attention to the planning office refusal comments which bear reference to these issues:

2. the proposal would likely lead to unacceptable noise and disturbance to residents in nearby streets due to patrons parking outside their dwellings, particularly in the late evening and at night. As such the proposal would be contrary to policy UR3 of the Replacement Bradford Unitary Development Plan (2005)

Please give serious consideration to the above.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

We are writing to object to the Shama's application re the above. We note they state the doors of the premises will be locked at 11.30pm but are now asking for 1 hour extension to elear the premises. As residents on Old Main Street, whose property faces *directly* opposite Clarke House (34 yards exactly) we are firmly in opposition to the extended hour.

Firstly, we must stress that we have been objecting to the opening of The Shama for 8 months now and it really is time for closure. You will be aware that their 1st application was granted, with conditions. In the "Grant of Planning Permission" dated 9 December 2008, point 3 refers to, "the restaurant use hereby permitted shall only apply to the ground floor of Clarke House and shall not apply to any part of the first floor..... that the scale and impact of the proposed use can be properly controlled". We therefore accepted this as we felt the Planning Department had taken into account the feelings and concerns of nearby residents.

In the same document, point 2 refers to, "the restaurant use hereby approved shall only operate between the hours of 5pm to 11.30pm, seven days per week". The reason: In the interests of preserving the residential and general amenity of the surrounding area and to accord with policy UR3 and UDP3 of the Replacement Bradford Unitary Development Plan (2005). We accepted the closing time of 11.30pm provided it meant just that and the premises were vacated at that time. However, if it is the case that people are to be allowed to finish their meal before the premises are closed, then we would ask that the serving of food finishes at 11pm to allow the premises to be vacated at 11.30pm.

You will also be aware their 2nd application has been refused. One of the reasons: The proposal would likely lead to unacceptable noise and disturbance to residents in nearby streets due to patrons parking outside their dwellings, particularly in the late evening and at night. As such, the proposal would be contrary to policy UR3 of the Replacement Bradford Unitary Development Plan (2005).

Continuation

We have personally had a meeting with Mr Rubani and he made it very clear, that due to the huge amount of building works involved with Clarke House, his wish is to fill the place with customers to recoup the monies. He was adamant the doors would be locked at 11.30pm, but when pushed regarding the people *already inside* the restaurant at that time, he would not be drawn, stating he had a business to run. We informed him we could not accept the noise which would occur with customers leaving after 11.30pm as most of us have retired to bed at that time.

His previously sited business was known to accept late night custom and although Mr Rubani states this will not be the case at Clarke House, unfortunately such is the reputation of the Shama that people will want to eat late, if allowed to do so.

We are aware The Shama feel that as we already have a filling station nearby, we are used to some nuisance factor. However, we don't experience any noise from the station. It is generally quiet in this area late evening. Therefore, no comparison can be made between the two businesses.

We do ask you to refuse their application, bearing in mind the concerns of the nearby residents, many of whom are quite elderly and are surely entitled to some peace at night. We should not have to put up with any loud noise generated from a) people leaving a restaurant late at night and b) car doors banging, taxi horns beeping etc. The customers cannot be expected to keep the noise down as they will not be aware people are asleep nearby and this must be borne in mind with the closing time of the restaurant.

As it is the Shama's choice to open a restaurant facing a residential area, they must realise certain conditions will be involved which should be adhered to which would not be the case if they had opened a restaurant in the town centre.

Thank-you for your letter of 25 March.

I'm sorry that not all our letter of 19 March was relevant to licensing concerns - it is difficult sometimes to disentangle planning and licensing matters. I hope that the following will be considered an appropriate representation.

1. We feel very strongly that the proposed opening hours of the Shama Restaurant will very significantly result in public nuisance and disorder in this residential area. Public safety is a further concern. To open seven days a week - every single night - with door closure at 11:30 is unreasonable, particularly given the location of the proposed restaurant.

2. Other restaurants (for example the Aagraah - close to the Sharma's Shipley restaurant, the Aakash, Kipling's - to name a few) close at 11:00 on Sundays.

3. Parking on the proposed Sharma restaurant site being insufficient even for staff cars, the area within walking distance of the restaurant can expect antisocial parking, other antisocial behaviour including noise nuisance from restaurant clients, loud car radios, banging car doors, littering. If the doors are to close at 11:30, the nuisance can be expected until midnight SEVEN NIGHTS A WEEK.

4. On the occasions when there is the occasional function in Bingley, we have experience of just these very considerable nuisances. There is noise, widespread abuse of resident permit passes, cars are parked hazardously on double lines. The main road is a busy bus route with limited parking where additional parking constitutes public safety hazards. However, these nuisances and hazards do not occur nightly.

May we ask that, if the Sharma restaurant is to open on this site:

* Sunday closing (final closing of doors) is 11:00 pm

* The premises licence extends to the ground floor only

* No takeaway business is permitted. This would serve only to worsen the problems of public nuisance, disorder, unsafe and nuisance parking.
