1.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

All existing lighting shall be maintained in good working order and used where appropriate at all times the premises remain open to the public.

Maintain a zero tolerance policy with regard to illegal drugs to include staff training in detection and prevention, co-operate with West Yorks Police drug watch initiative or any similar scheme.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

All emergency lighting and fire exit signs shall be maintained in good working order and all staff including temporary staff adequately trained about the evacuation procedures for the premises.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

Ensure that the external areas of the premises are kept clean of litter and refuse.

Display notice in prominent positions near exits reminding customers to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

All doors and windows to be kept closed when entertainment is taking place. Ensure that staff monitor on a regular basis noise emanating from the premises from entertainment to ensure that neighbours are not disturbed. Clear outdoor drinking area of customers by 23.00 hours with signage displayed encouraging customers to comply with this requirement.

Do not empty bottle bins between 21.00 – 07.00 hours.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

The Licensee and staff must ensure that children under 18 years of age vacate the premises by 20.00 hours.

Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and shall not be allowed access to the cigarette machines or amusement with prizes.

Enforce an efficient proof of age policy at all times and ensure appropriate staff training in its operation.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

Ensure that adequate supervision of the premises is maintained at all times during the carrying out of licensable activities and that any staff are trained in ensuring compliance with the licensing objectives at all times.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Interested Parties

Local residents – Seven letters of representation have been received from local residents on the grounds of anticipated noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment in the outdoor areas and noise and anti social behaviour from patrons using the outdoor areas and leaving the premises late at night. The residents also state that the premises are in a residential area.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 3.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) Public safety
 - c) The prevention of public nuisance
 - d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant"

a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.

3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Embedded Conditions

- 3. None of the restrictions on permitted hours prohibit:
 - a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of the sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - c. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - d. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
 - f. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - g. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - h. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 14. The Licensee shall ensure that staff monitor, on a regular basis, noise emanating from the premises from regulated entertainment to ensure that neighbouring residents are not disturbed.
- 15. The outdoor drinking areas are to be cleared of customers no later than 23.00 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.
- 16. Removal of refuse and emptying of bottle bins within the curtilage of the licensed premises shall not take place between the hours of 21.00 and 07.00.

- 17. The Licensee and staff must ensure that children under 18 years of age vacate the premises by 20.00 hours.
- 18. Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and shall not be allowed access to the cigarette machines; or amusement with prizes machines.
- 19. The Licensee shall enforce an efficient recognised "proof of age policy" at all times and ensure appropriate staffing training in its operation.

I am writing with regards to the proposed "provision of Live Music (indoors & Outdoors) Monday – Sunday 11.00 – 23.30, Sunday 12.00 – 22.30. To include indoor sporting events to match above hours. To vary the current playing of recorded music to include the outdoor drinking area until 21.00)".

As a neighbour of this establishment, I have enjoyed a great relationship with the former landlord Dennis, who although strict was considerate that we lived in a residential area with neighbours surrounding the premises on all sides.

We have so far been subjected to Mr Holmes playing music so loud that I could not hear my own TV and the windows rattled in the lounge as his various bands, artistes etc subjected us to more and more loud and grotesque music with no license for entertainment within the pub. We have also had one Charity event outside which was so loud that you could hear the music from as far as Hill top farm and the Snooty Fox which is some distance away in which he drove myself and other neighbours out of their homes until after 9 O clock in the evening. This is just two incidents that I have mentioned. There have been countless fights outside the establishment and one incident where he evicted his revellers from the pub at 1 O clock in the morning after a funeral party where a mass fight started outside the pub as soon as the door slammed shut behind them and we were subjected to 3 Police Cars and an Ambulance turning up to try and mop up the carnage and stop the noise.

I have worked in a recording studio in the past and as such we were heavily regulated on the amount of noise that we could produce and had to ensure that our neighbours were not disturbed by the volume of any bands that played within the walls of the building. (Sound Proofing was a necessity). We have one adjoining wall to the pub and this kind of consideration has not been thought of when playing entertainment in the Golden Fleece to the point were I have had to call the environmental health and the council to complain. We have been advised to take recordings and notes of the

noise and have recordings of noise from the lounge of our home which we have had to endure. I work every day and usually retire to bed at approx 10pm but the disturbances suffered by ourselves from the Golden Fleece have been unbearable. We have 18" thick walls in our 300 year old cottage and this is a residential area in a quiet village which should not have to be subjected to this kind of disturbance.

I am writing this letter to heavily object to the provision of Live Music (Indoors & Outdoors Monday – Sunday on the above hours as this would give the Golden Fleece carte blanche to disrupt, disturb, aggravate and alienate his neighbours even more than he has done already. I have lived in this area for 4 years where for 2 years I had a very good relationship with the previous landlord who had consideration for his neighbours and the fact that this is a residential area. It is sad to see that the Golden Fleece current Landlord does not seem to have that same consideration or thought. This is a local pub for local people and not a nightclub or wine bar for the centre of town. So I heavily object to this license.

I am writing to place on record my objection to a licensing application as requested by the Golden Fleece Public House, Lane Ends, Oakworth, BD22 7PR.

The landlord has requested the following variation to his licence:

For provision of Live music (indoors & outdoors) Monday - Sunday 11.00 - 23.30, Sunday 12.00 - 22.30. To include indoor sporting events to match above hours. To vary the current playing of recorded music to include the outdoor drinking area until 21.00 hrs.

I am objecting to this request on the grounds of "the prevention of public nuisance" as detailed on your website.

This public house is located in a residential area of Oakworth village and in particular my house is within 50 yards of a newly created beer garden (added in summer 2008) to the rear of the premises.

This beer garden is also adjacent to a number of houses both to the side, front and back - and in some cases extremely close to houses where both elderly residents and residents who have young children reside.

White I have no objection to any licensing variation involving music - either record or otherwise - played inside the building, I am extremely unhappy about the prospect of music being played on the outside beer garden adjacent to my property.

On several occasions last summer music was played outside on a permanent speaker system (presumably without the required license which is being applied for now?) until late into the night.

This was clearly a public nuisance as windows needed to be closed to prevent the music being heard inside local residents' houses.

On a personal level, even when my windows were closed it was still possible to hear the music until the pub closed after 11pm.

Needless to say, this is extremely irritating when the weather is warm and there is a need for windows to be open.

After two such occasions last year I called the Licensing Department and enquired as to what license the public house had at that point for playing music.

I was informed that they had a licence for playing music inside the premises but that the landlord was obligated to take all reasonable steps to ensure windows and doors were kept closed to prevent noise nuisance to local residents.

If this was the case then (and was flouted!) I am firstly amazed that the landlord is requesting permission to play outside music and secondly would be surprised if this request were granted in a residential area.

If it has been requested that he keeps doors and windows closed in the past, how can he make a request to play music directly outdoors until late into the evening?

Looking to the future, I fear that if the public house is given permission to (again) play this music outside it will again cause an unacceptable disturbance to local residents and have a detrimental effect on quality of life and also resale potential of properties.

To compound the matter, the landlord of the public house removed several trees from a patch of land in front of my house in June 2008 without the required permission.

This is an ongoing planning case with your colleagues at Bradford Council (08/02439/CPN, concerning Eric Waterworth in the Planning Department).

Had the trees been left in place then any music played on the outside area may well have been shielded somewhat from residents' houses on Hillside Avenue and Lane Ends.

However, without the protection of the trees, the beer garden and any additional music noise is quite literally now right on the doorstep of already unhappy residents.

I have already personally witnessed examples of anti-social behaviour - such as customers urinating in the car park rather than using the indoor public house toilet facilities - and I am deeply concerned that the addition of outside music will only seek to exacerbate this problem.
