### 1. Summary

## 1.1 Background

The premise was previously licensed for the provision of late night refreshment with the following hours;

Sunday to Thursday:	23.00 to 00.00
Friday & Saturday:	23.00 to 01.00

Subsequent licensees did not apply to transfer the Licence and it was eventually surrendered on 24 September 2008.

## 2. Relevant Representations Received

## 2.1 Interested Parties

Ward Councillor – A letter of representation has been received from a Ward Councillor. The representation raises concerns about excessive noise and disturbance due to increased hours and customers congregating outside the premises. Concern is also raised about anticipated litter problems.

The representation is attached at Appendix 2.

## 3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) the prevention of public nuisance
  - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

## 4. **Statement of Policy Issues**

4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).

4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

## 5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
  - (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
  - (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
  - (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence (this will effectively mean that the premises could not open between 23.00 and 05.00 unless by authority of a temporary event notice without breaching the licensing laws).
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

Article 6 - A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I would like to object to the extension of the opening hours to Midnight mon- friday and 1.30 on Saturday and Sunday.

This is a built up area with houses all around and residents a lot who are elderly do not want to be disturbed in the evening with customers hanging around the shop consuming their purchases and creating a lot of noise thereby disturbing the residents.

There is no car park by the premises so customers would park down the side streets banging doors and having noisy stereos coming out of the cars in the early hours of the morning.

We have had problems with youths on the opposite side of the road at Tommys supermarket and now that problem has been resolved we dont want another place to cause trouble again.

In summary to save residents having their sleep disturbed in a very built up area and the rubbish that would be left to clear in the morning I urge you to reject

this application for extended hours.
