# 1.5 **Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives**

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

The Licensee shall at all times maintain a "zero tolerance" policy with regard to illegal drugs, including appropriate staff training in detection and prevention.

All existing external and internal security lighting shall be maintained in good working order and used, where appropriate, at all times the premises remain open to the public.

The Licensee will co-operate with any local "Pub Watch" schemes or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local Licensees.

New customers shall not be admitted to the premises after 23.00.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

The emergency lighting at the premises shall be maintained in good working order.

All first aid facilities, currently held at the premises, shall be maintained in good working order and all staff (including temporary staff) adequately trained in their use.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exists reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

All outward opening exit doors and all windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place.

The Licensee shall ensure that the external areas of the premises are kept clear of litter and refuse.

The Licensee shall ensure that security and other external lighting used are maintained in such a position so as to avoid light pollution to nearby residents.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

No regulated entertainment of an adult or sexual nature shall be provided at any time in the licensed premises.

All gaming machines shall be positioned so that they are within sight of the bar servery.

The Licensee shall enforce an effective recognised "proof of age policy" at all times and ensure appropriate staff training in its operation.

Children under 16 years old shall only be allowed access into the premises when accompanied by an adult.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

The Licensee shall ensure that adequate supervision of the premises is maintained at all times during the carrying out of licensable activities and that any staff are trained in ensuring compliance with the licensing objectives at all times.

A Personal Licence holder shall be present on the premises when licensable activities are taking place.

Any CCTV System installed at the premises shall be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and available to the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority on request.

# 2. Relevant Representations Received

# 2.1 **Responsible Authorities**

Environmental Health - In order to address the Public Nuisance objective, the Environmental Health Officer has requested that consideration is given to restricting the sale of alcohol until midnight on Monday to Saturday.

The representation is attached at Appendix 2.

# 2.2 Interested Parties

<u>Local Residents</u> – 18 letters of representation have been received on the grounds of anticipated noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment both indoor and outdoor, and noise, disturbance and anti-social behaviour from patrons leaving the premises late at night. Concern is also raised about pint glasses being left on resident's property.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 3.

# 3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) the prevention of public nuisance

- d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

# 4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following part of the Licensing Policy is of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime & Disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

# 5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
  - (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
  - (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
  - (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence. (this will effectively mean that the premises could not open unless by authority of a temporary event notice without breaching the licensing laws).
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



6. The licensee will co-operate with any local pub watch schemes or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local licensees.

7. New customers shall not be admitted to the premises after 23.00.

8. The emergency lighting at the premises shall be maintained in good working order.

9. All first aid facilities, currently held at the premises, shall be maintained in good working order and all staff (including temporary staff) adequately trained in their use.

10. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner

11. All outward opening exit doors and all windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place.

12. The licensee shall ensure that the external areas of the premises are kept clear of litter and refuse.

13. The licensee shall ensure that security and other external lighting used are maintained in such a position to as to avoid light pollution to nearby residents.

14. No regulated entertainment of an adult or sexual nature shall be provided at any time in the licensed premises.

15. All gaming machines shall be positioned so that they are within sight of the bar servery

16. The licensee shall enforce an effective recognised proof of age policy at all times and ensure appropriate staff training in its operation.

17. Children under 16 years of age shall only be allowed access into the premises when accompanied by an adult.

Having considered the above, it is noted that the application is made on identical operating hours and conditions as the previous licence (which lapsed due to bankruptcy). However, given that a new company has taken over ownership, I would like to make the following comments:

In respect of outdoor entertainment, I wrote to the Licensing Team in December 2007 expressing concerns about potential nuisance arising from such activities; this resulted in the restrictions which are currently in place. To the best of my knowledge and having scrutinised our records, there have not been any recent complaints about outdoor related events. I have no grounds at present to request that this be altered.

With regard to the proposed hours of opening for sale of alcohol (Monday – Saturday 10.00 to 02.00 hours) despite there being the same as before under the previous Licensee's regime, it has been noted that these were not previously utilised to their full potential. This being the case, I share the concerns of the immediate neighbours who have made representations about the potential for significant disturbance from patrons leaving the premises in the early hours of the morning were the pub to radically alter its way of operating.

I would request, therefore, that consideration be given to restricting the sale of alcohol to midnight, Monday to Saturday, to preserve the amenity of immediate neighbours.



We write to lodge an objection to the proposed opening hours and the proposed use of entertainment and recorded and live music at the above property on the grounds that these proposals would cause a public nuisance.

The Acorn has been a traditional public house with hours of licence to match. The proposal to extend the hours of operation if allowed would create additional disturbance to a number of nearby residential properties with the consequence of preventing normal sleep for adults and children.

Any hours of licence at the above property should reflect the amenity cost to neighbouring and nearby homes and not solely the economic argument to justify an enhanced rent for the benefit of the freeholder.

The proposal to seek an entertainment licence is inappropriate for a village location as this will impact on neighbouring and nearby properties. Those of us who live near the Acorn have first hand experience of entertainment events over the last few years and music noise cannot be contained within the property as doors and windows open. An entertainment propsal for regular daily, weekly or monthly events is inappropriate for a village property.

The Acorn has the potential to be a thriving village pub if its cost base is contained without the need to resort to hours and usage that are a detriment to the local population and thereby a public nuisance.
