1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicant

WM Morrison Supermarkets PLC. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

2.2 The Premises

Morrisons, Bolton Bridge, Ilkley.

2.3 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

Sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises

Hours of licensable activities:

Monday to Sunday: 06.00 to 24.00

2.4 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

All staff will receive suitable training (including refresher training) in relation to the proof of age 'Task 25' scheme to be applied on the premises. The following forms of identification are acceptable; photo driving licence, passport, proof of age standards scheme (PASS) card and any other locally or nationally approved form of identification.

CCTV shall be provided on the premises and shall be kept in good working order.

All checkout operators will operate a refusal log.

b) Public safety will be achieved by;

WM Morrison supermarkets PLC undertakes ongoing risk assessments in order to comply with health & safety legislation.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

The premises are responsibly managed and supervised. No additional measures are believed necessary.

Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

All staff will receive suitable training (including refresher training) in relation to the proof of age 'Task 25' scheme to be applied on the premises. The following forms of identification are acceptable; photo driving licence, passport, proof of age standards scheme (PASS) card and any other locally or nationally approved form of identification.

Till prompts are in use at the store.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

The premises will be constructed in accordance with drawing no. ILK/A/2/BWSL/001 as served with the application or in the case of alteration to those plans any further plans served on the responsible authorities and licensing authority prior to completion of the premises.

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol will be trained in accordance with established WM Morrison Supermarkets PLC training procedures.

2.6 Relevant Representations Received

Interested Parties

Local Residents & Ward Councillor – 9 letters of representation have been received. The representations raise concerns of sales of alcohol to underage children and anti-social behaviour and noise nuisance from youths congregating outside the premises. Concerns are also raised about possible litter problems.

The representations are attached at Appendix 2.

4. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm

- 4.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 4.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder), Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance) and Part 7 (protection of Children from Harm).
- 4.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. OPTIONS

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

We wish to object to the granting of the above licence for the hours applied for (from 6 am to midnight, 7 days a week). We are concerned about noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour that may arise from this.

Our reasons for objecting are as follows:-

Prevention of crime and disorder

Those under the age of 18 may purchase or seek to purchase alcohol;

Groups of youths may gather outside the store and engage in antisocial behaviour;

Those who purchase alcohol may engage in antisocial behaviour in the Riverside Gardens or on their way to the Gardens from the store.

The prevention of public nuisance

Groups of customers may gather outside the store and in the adjacent public areas, during the day and late at night, causing a nuisance;

Noise from customers' vehicles is likely to cause nuisance (particularly early in the morning and late at night).

The Protection of children from harm

Those under the age of 18 may purchase or seek to purchase alcohol;

The store is within 300metres of All Saints School and may impact on pupils.

Public Safety

The lack of adequate dedicated parking will cause customers to park vehicles in a manner likely to cause a danger to public safety (the store is adjacent to the busy junction of Skipton Road and Bolton Bridge road).

I would point out that Morrisons have a poor record for selling alcohol to under 18 year olds. In September 2009 the Morrisons Hilltop store in Knottingley was fined for selling drink to a 15-year-old girl.

With regard to Morrisons' application to sell alcohol from 0600-2400hrs 7 days of the week in a predominantly residential area, I have the following objections:

1) Residential Location

This is a predominantly residential area.

2) Anti Social Behaviour

Ilkley's existing convenience store, the Co-Op, is located on Brook Street & large numbers of youths are usually to be found loitering outside with apparently nothing better to do with their time. This is tolerable, as that shop is located in the retail centre of Ilkley & there are no residents in the immediate environment to have their lives blighted by the associated anti social behaviour. Given that Morrisons have applied for a licence to sell alcohol until midnight 7 days a week, it is safe to assume that this new store will prove equally, if not more, attractive as a social gathering point for youths with nothing better to do. The big difference with the proposed Morrisons store however is that it will be located in a predominantly residential area, rather than in the retail centre of town.

3) Litter

The footpath that runs to the rear of my home, parallel to Regent Road, already generates significant litter, which is blown into my back garden. This mini market will inevitably generate huge additional quantities of crisp packets, sandwich packaging, sweet wrappers & beer cans.

If Morrisons do ultimately get the go ahead to proceed selling alcohol from 0600-2400hrs, 7 days of the week in a predominantly residential area. Labsolutely insist that the following stipulations are included as conditions of their license in order to ameliorate Morrisons' cynical exploitation of us local residents:

- 1) Provision of security guards during all hours of opening to discourage youths from loitering & causing trouble in the vicinity.
- 2) Police patrols, at Morrisons' expense, along the footpath to the rear of Regent Road to curb the anti social behaviour & the low level vandalism that we residents will be subjected to as a by-product of this store selling alcohol until midnight in the heart of a residential area.
- 3) Regular street cleaning on the footpath that runs along the back of Regent Road & on Regent Road itself, at Morrisons' expense. Morrisons are no doubt relying on externalising the true costs of running their business by expecting the Council, or local residents, to collect the litter that their business generates.

It is absolutely imperative that Morrisons are required to foot the bill for all of these measures in an attempt to ensure that their business carries the real costs of their operations, rather than simply leaving nearby residents to bear these costs in the form of litter strewn streets & anti social behaviour.

As the chairman of the Board of Directors of "The Lawns" Management Company, I write, on behalf of the Directors, and the other residents, to express our concerns with the proposed Licensing Hours at the convenience retail store development in the old Bradford College building on Bolton Bridge Road, Ilkley.

I must point out that The Lawns is a development of retirement apartments and none of the residents here is under the age of fifty five; indeed most are well beyond that age. Thirteen of the apartments face towards the proposed development and all have bedrooms which would most certainly be affected by noise from the store. This could be particularly serious if alcohol is involved, even if the sales are for consumption away from the premises.

In our view to allow alcohol to be sold from 6 a. m. to midnight on seven days in the week is excessive. We feel most strongly that some limitation of these hours is called for. Our neighbours at the Ilkley Bowling Club are licensed to sell alcohol for consumption on the Club's premises from 9.00 a. m. to 11.00 p. m. from Monday to Thursday and on Sunday. This is extended to midnight on Friday and Saturday. The only other alcohol outlets in this area are the Ilkley Vaults at Stockeld Road, the Martinez wine bar at the end of The Grove and the Cooperative Store on Brook Street. None of these is near to "The Lawns", but we do retain unhappy memories of late night disturbances along the Skipton Road, during the period of an earlier ownership of the Ilkley Vaults.

So far as retail sales of groceries, including vegetables and fruit, are concerned we consider the Morrison's scheme a most interesting development, but we feel very strongly that the hours of sale for alcohol should be limited to the period from 9.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m. from Monday to Saturday and from 10.00 a. m. to 4.00 p.m. on Sunday. We would be much obliged if your Licensing Team could take our views into consideration when making their decision, and could inform us of their decision and the grounds on which it has been made, in due course.

We are writing with regard to the proposed alcohol licence for the new Morrisons convenience store at Bridge House, Bridge Lane, Ilkley.

While we would be happy for Morrisons to have a small store there, we feel that the granting of such a licence for alcohol sales from 6am till midnight is not at all appropriate for a residential, family orientated neighbourhood such as ours. Our objection is based on the following reasons:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- Under 18s may try to buy alcohol there.
- The premises are within 300m of All Saints' School
- Alcohol being sold after 8pm can encourage groups of people to hang around the shop drinking and behaving anti-socially. This can disturb the neighbours, many of whom have young children, and can also be intimidating to local residents. Of particular concern are the elderly residents of Regent Court flats who have no fencing to keep people out.
- Alcohol being sold late may also encourage drinkers to behave antisocially in the Riverside Gardens and on the residential streets around the area.
- Late night drinkers as above can cause property damage: in the past we and our neighbours have had drunks damaging and defacing our cars and property as they passed by on the way from the pub to the nightclub.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

• Groups of young people drinking alcohol may congregate in the park, passing more family houses and causing a nuisance as they do so.

Public Safety

• The site is very close to the junction with the A65 and has no parking facilities and little on-street parking nearby, which could lead to customers leaving their vehicles in unsafe locations.

Bolton Bridge Road Ilkley Morrisons Application (sale of alcohol)

We wish to lodge an objection to the above application on the grounds of <u>public nuisance</u>, <u>public safety</u> and the <u>protection of children</u>.

The site is adjacent to Lister Court (flats for the elderly) as well as a very busy road junction. An increased throughput of people and cars which would arise would inevitably have a detrimental effect on public safety, not only on the roads but also in the area generally.

Of particular concern is the risk to children. The path behind Ilkley Bowls Club is immediately next to the site, a path which is heavily used by children on their way to and from All Saint School. The risk of harm from traffic at the Bolton Bridge Road end of the path would be increased especially across the car parking area.

The Hilltop store in Knottingley was among five large and small shops in Knottingley and Pontefract targeted by police acting on tip offs."

I have a young teenage family, we live in a lovely quite street and I do not want our lives and area disrupted by this development.
