

1. Summary

1.1 The applicant

1.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

I will have an ID ruling for anyone that I believe is under the legal required limit. If needed we will have a search policy in place and will communicate with other

licensed premises. If needed we will place a certified person on the door on busy nights to ensure appropriate persons are permitted.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

We have installed emergency lighting in the premises with easy and accessible escape routes in the event of an emergency. There will be first aid provisions as well as an appointed first aider on the premises.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

The building has secondary glazing but will never be used for a form of regulated entertainment. Our music will never exceed the maximum level as it is only a CD player and not a music system in place. All our deliveries will take place at off peak hours as to be considerate to road users and pedestrians. We have a system in place that enables us to control odours from cooking so not to cause a nuisance to the public and unnecessary smells from cooking. We will put up notices that ask all patrons to leave the premises quietly when they leave.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

We will ask that all children are accompanied by adults at all times. Proof of age cards will be in place. Children over 16 will only be allowed an alcoholic drink when sitting and having a full meal with the parents consent.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

I will promote all 4 licensing objectives by ensuring that I always have a personal licence holder on the premises when the licence is in place and being used. I will train all members of staff on licensing objectives to help promote and ensure all licensable activities are carried out safely and accordingly. I will also have a suitable CCTV system of the shop in place.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Interested Parties

Six individual letters of representation and 2 pro-forma letters have been received from local residents, 1 letter from a local business and a letter of representation from the Ward Councillors. The letters raise concerns of noise and disturbance from customers drinking outside the premises and leaving the premise later and anti-social behaviour from patrons outside the premises.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 3.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) Public safety

- c) The prevention of public nuisance
- d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder, Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7. Other implications

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.2 Community safety implications

There are no apparent community safety implications.

7.3 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

98a, Main Street, Haworth, BD22 8DP.

In an already over noisy environment at the top of Haworth main street, this would add to the noise pollution we endure, which is an ever increasing problem. Where as this may or may not increase whilst under the ownership of Mr Gascoigne, if a change of management or ownership of the premise occurs & subsequent usage, we could be left with another Disco Karaoke Bar not a bistro bar, once this extension has been granted.

On the one occasion, to my knowledge, when a private function has being held at the said premises, there was a notable increase in noise, maybe due to the open door & overflow of people onto the main street.

As it stands, the front three rooms on our hotel are nearly now un-lettable, on occasions, without recourse from our guests the next morning. This continues to cost us dearly in offering compensation. I enclose a email from one of our most recent guest complaints who left a day early over the weekend. However could I please ask for the email not to be publicly displayed to save any further inconvenience or harm to an already poor experience of Haworth, a literary village steeped in Yorkshire tradition & hospitality.

Lastly, how many licences can Haworth main street sustain in an already difficult economical time? The extension of this outlet selling cheaper beer from their brewery could certainly attract more undesirable elements, increase noise to residents & businesses alike & eventually bring about the demise of some already existing trading outlets.

I thank you for your consideration in this matter & hope that common sense prevails.

We are writing to you to express our deep concerns over the proposed extended opening hours of and I took over we have worked extremely hard to keep out the binge drinking Gascoigne's. Since element of the village out of respect for our neighbours.

We think that any extension of the hours will encourage this anti social element already through the day people sit outside the premises drinking beer out of open vessels. we thought there was a rule for this on the public footpath although we may be wrong. the beer is being sold at around £2 per pint and bottles (pint size) at 1.06 if this is to continue into the evening this could attract unsavoury elements to the top of main street as is already the case at another premises.

The top of the street already houses three licensed premises we do not believe there is the need or even the customer base for a fourth we are not another set of whining landlords complaining about trade loss although our daytime trade is affected.

our concern is for our neighbours the noise levels will rise as their customers will be on the footpath outside dwellings smoking. the mess from cigarette ends will be all over the road all the other pubs may be forced into a price war to compete again increasing the potential for anti social behaviour. this we think is grossly unfair to the shop owners and residents in the immediate vicinity. from a personal point of view we have to deal with the noise of people falling out of another pub up the street at stupid o clock when we have closed as we don't do stop backs but we have been tagged because of their customers lingering around between the bull and tea rooms across the road. also they are not members of the pub watch so all the hard work we

do to keep troublemakers away could be undone. this could be made worse by the fact the proposed licensee is a young person of little experience of a "real pub" and the issues that selling cheap alcohol can cause, there is the potential hazard of a lot of people spilling out into the street from there and we hate to think what would happen if a car came up the bank from the fish shop way and didn't see someone must be a health and safety issue.

For the past eighteen months I have given my full support to Gascoignes, both as a daily customer and also as a friend and neighbour. It was with sadness and disappointment that I read their most recent planning application: i.e. to serve alcohol not only throughout the day, but to extend their opening hours to 23.00 hours Monday - Saturday, and to 22.00 hours Sunday for the sale by retail of alcohol.

I wish to object to the above application for the following reasons:

98a Main St, Haworth is part of a small terrace of four shops, each with living accommodation above the shop. Directly opposite are four more shops also with living accommodation above. It should be taken into consideration that the area is residential as well as retail, and it is unfair that residents lives could be further disrupted by yet more noise and alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour. We have 3 public houses all within 100 steps of Gascoignes shop door - all trying to make a living.

We already have to contend with the, often, unacceptable noise of traffic (taxis) and vandalism arising from the effects of too much alcohol. An increase in volume of any of these would cause yet more stress to the existing businesses and residents. I am also concerned, if this application is successful, that a change of proprietorship of the existing business at any time would then further facilitate easier change of use planning permission applied for at a later date.

Whatever the outcome of this application is, it will cause ill feeling and tension. We will lose the "feel good and working together" factor - something that is so very important in a small neighbourhood like ours, where people both work and live in close proximity.

I wish to object to the application to use the premises at 98a Main Street, Haworth, Keighley, BD22 8DP for the sale by retail of alcohol between the hours of 10.00 - 23.00 Monday – Saturday and 11.00 - 22.00 on Sunday.

Living and having a shop at the top of Haworth Main Street, I think that this will be an unbearable nuisance to me and an invasion of my right to live peacefully. I believe passionately that to extend their current licence will be a detriment to the village for the following reasons:-

- 1, Gascoigne's have recently started brewing their own beer and have been able to offer it at much cheaper prices. By undercutting the pubs, I have noticed regulars choosing to drink at Gascoignes (usually outside) instead of within local Public Houses. The drinks are not purchased alongside food which is what we were assured by them when they first got a licence. I've seen these people sit outside Gascoigne's from 10am drinking during the week. My customers and I find this not only off putting but gives a negative impression on the village for visitors. This is already a problem due to the clampers and you the council are continually reassuring us that you are concerned about protecting the village tourism.
- 2, Over the past couple of years the offensive behaviour from drinkers has increased tremendously on Main Street resulting in many shops having to install CCTV outside. Many mornings we as shopkeepers find broken glass and debris outside our shops, this is not only disheartening but time consuming for us to clean up. I think this behaviour results from having too many public houses and licensed premises already in existence in such a small space with fewer and fewer customers, it is after all a recession. Existing pubs to survive are now in competition to offer loud music and cheaper drinks to entice customers. I truly believe that yet another licensed premise will only result in increased drunken behaviour and worsen the binge drinking culture which we seem to have within this village. The Old Sun Hotel recently had its opening hours reduced due to the anti social behaviour and impact on village life. Sprey his incomplete litture we should be encouraging for our 'jewel in the crown' as stated by the Yorkshire tourism board!

I wish to express my objection to this application which is an extension of the hours of the existing licence to sell alcohol.

My objection is simple, but nonetheless profoundly firm.

There are already three established premises within a mere 50 meters of this establishment providing alcoholic beverages in the evening hours. To have yet another would just be insanely overkill. ENOUGH IS ENOUGH! We have enough anti-social drinking and noise in the area without one more to add to the mix. Haworth is a very small village, and most importantly the top of Main Street is extremely confined. There is absolutely no room, need nor desire for another business to supply an evening hangout for alcoholic consumption.

I could go on about the economic impact on the surrounding

small businesses, however, I am hoping they have already responded. Gascoignes is a fine CAFE, and is well received as such. To allow it to serve alcohol as an evening business would thereby turn it into functioning as a mini-pub: which we certainly do not need nor want here!

Likewise, I imagine the residents above and around the business have legitimate issues with the servicing of alcohol at this location.

In the time this business <u>has</u> operated in the evenings during this application period, it has been shown that it is like RUNNING A GAUNTLET to get past the site when people are drinking outside. The shop is TOO SMALL to accommodate even a handful of patrons, without over-spilling into the street. The patrons block/obstruct the very small footpath in front of the business, and make it a nightmare to merely walk past. There is a *microscopic* physical area in front of the shop, hence patrons will not only be blocking the public footpath, but be drinking <u>IN</u> THE ROADWAY. (*Is that not a VIOLATION OF PUBLIC ORDER*?) I believe granting this request is therefore in-and-of-itself a VIOLATION of <u>established law!</u>

Granting of this request would also open you -the Council- to deal with a *mindfield* of legal challenges associated with these very obvious legal issues. I do not believe this is wise nor prudent to allow this permit to be granted.

I therefore <u>FIRMLY</u> request this application be denied.

I wish to express my objection to this application which is an extension of the hours of the existing licence to sell alcohol.

My primary concern is as a neighbour living directly next door, with school age children. Already my children are affected by noise levels from adjacent public houses, which at times prevents them from sleeping. This property is closer still and the impact will likely be much worse. I am especially concerned about the additional noise that will be created by customers accessing the property between these hours and particularly by those who will undoubtedly drink outside in order to smoke. Imbibed with alcohol, it is to be expected that the behaviour of customers will be disinhibited and disruptive.

The Gascoigne's have converted garages to the rear into a micro-brewery. I would be concerned that an extension of the current hours would increase alcohol sales and as a result necessitate an increase in the production from their brewery. The noise and smell already has an impact upon us and this application is likely to increase that. There is also a question of safety regarding the production of alcohol within a residential area, so far as I am aware no planning application for change of use has been made or granted.

I am also concerned that an additional establishment selling alcohol in such close vicinity, i.e. less than 50 yards, from two public houses and a hotel will increase the already escalating anti-social behaviour from evening drinkers and put at increased risk the safety of my family and fellow residents.

As a member of the local community, I would also ask that you consider the potential negative social impact of this application. At a time when public houses are struggling to remain open, this application will no doubt further jeopardise the continued existence of those nearby. For centuries these businesses have been an integral part of community life and their individual histories a prominent part of the overall village history, which as you will know is key to the villages continued prosperity. With their own brewery, the Gascoignes have been able to significantly under-cut the prices of beer locally. I believe that this has helped to fuel a price and entertainment war between nearby pub's, a factor which I also believe has played a significant part in increased anti-social behaviour.

Already the majority of alcohol sold at the address above does not appear to be consumed with meals, but due to the reduced prices is attracting groups of drinkers who would otherwise use the public houses. The limited seating means that they are often stood outside and we have already received complaints from customers of our adjacent clothes retail business regarding their use of offensive language and the smell of smoke.

Because of these same concerns, which are already impacting upon my quality of life and that of my family, I would also request that you review the existing licence to sell alcohol. Please advise me if you require me to make this request separately.
