### 1. SUMMARY

The application is for the variation of a premises licence to extend permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

The premises currently hold a Premises Licence with the following permitted hours;

### Sale of alcohol

Monday to Saturday: 08.00 to 23.00 Sunday: 10.00 to 22.30 Good Friday: 08.00 to 22.30

Christmas Day: 12.00 to 15.00 and 19.00 to 22.30

## 2.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

The premises shall maintain a CCTV system which gives coverage of all entry and exit points. The system shall continually record whilst the premises are open and conducting licensable activities. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 21 days. Recordings shall be made available upon the receipt of a request by an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.

There shall be 'CCTV in Operation' signs prominently displayed at the premises.

An incident log (whether kept in a written or electronic form) shall be retained at the premises and made available to an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.

The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme, such as a Challenge 25, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall be either a photographic driving licence, a valid passport or any other recognised form of photographic identification incorporating the PASS logo.

The premises will be fitted with a burglar alarm system.

The premises will be fitted with a panic button system for staff to utilise in the case of an emergency.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

The premises licence holder shall ensure that the appropriate fire safety, and health and safety regulations are applied at the premises.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

The premises licence holder will, upon request, provide the telephone number of their Customer Relations Contact Centre.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

All staff will receive comprehensive training in relation to age restricted products and in particular the sale of alcohol. No member of staff will be permitted to sell age restricted products until such time as they have successfully completed the aforementioned training.

An age till prompt system will be utilised at the premises in respect of age restricted products.

A refusals register (whether kept and written or electronic) will be maintained at the premises and will be made available for inspection upon request by an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

## 2.7 Relevant Representations Received

### **Responsible Authorities**

Environmental Health – The Environmental Health Department has received complaints regarding noise disturbance from early morning newspaper deliveries to

the premises and the Officer has concerns that an increase in hours of trading could exacerbate the situation causing further nuisance for residents.

The representation is attached at Appendix 4.

## Individual, Body or Business

Eight letters of representation have been received. The representations raise concerns of an increase of noise and disturbance from early morning deliveries and staff opening up and noise and disturbance from staff closing the premises late at night. Concerns have also been raised regarding a possible increase of anti-social behaviour and noise and disturbance from youths congregating in the area due to longer hours of trading.

# Legal Appraisal

- **4.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) Public safety
  - c) The prevention of public nuisance
  - d) The protection of children from harm
- 4.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- **4.3** Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

## **Statement of Policy Issues**

- **4.6** The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder and Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- **4.7** The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

  - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



I would like to object to the Co-op's application to extend its licensing hours. I understand that it is a blanket application for all of its shops. My objection concerns the Co-op in Burley-in-Wharfedale. Therefore, if the application is granted, can it please exclude the above shop.

I live directly above the shop and the increased disturbance from an extension of its operating hours would make my life unbearable. The shop currently opens from 5 am to 9 pm. In fact newspaper deliveries are made at 4.30 am and staff open up the shop at 4.45 am. For years I have been battling against the Co-op to reduce unnecessary and unacceptable noise disturbance from 5 am and earlier. In this I have had the assistance of Ian Farmer (environmental health officer). These issues are still not fully resolved.

If the Co-op is granted permission to sell alcohol until 11 pm and it chooses to open until that time I will have less than 6 hours peace overnight. Currently the shop closes at 9 pm. Staff then have things to do inside the shop before they leave. There's always a bit of banging about with security doors and what not and things don't go quiet until staff finally leave at about 9.20. Therefore, if the shop opens until 11 pm, I won't get any peace until about 11.20. That means considerably less than 6 hours peace overnight.

In reality if I got to sleep at 11.30 and was woken up by the newspaper deliveries at 4.30, that's only 5 hours of sleep.

I suffer from depression and the lack of sleep and stress that I've suffered for years is no doubt a contributing factor. If the shop remains open until 11 pm I will get even less peace and sleep. The needs of people in the village to buy alcohol after 9 pm are surely secondary to my right to live in my home and have a reasonable number of hours free from disturbance.

Almost every evening large numbers of young people congregate outside the premises behaving in a bullish manner which can be quite intimidating when visiting the Co-op after dark. Extending the hours means this will only carry on for longer. As we have back-lane access to our property we are also left with empty vodka bottles at the rear on a regular basis.

Whilst the above may not contribute to anti social behavior worthy of calling the police, it is nevertheless, uncomfortable for us as we live in close proximity.

Friday and Saturday evenings are by far the worst as the noise of drunken, shrieking youths often carries on until the hours of the morning, creating a disturbance that is impossible to sleep through.
