## 2. Relevant Representations Received

## 2.1 **Responsible Authorities**

Environmental Health – A memo has been received from the Environmental Health Officer who has concerns regarding noise nuisance from regulated entertainment and noise generated by patrons smoking outside or leaving the premises late at night.

A copy of the memo is attached at Appendix 3.

## 2.2 Interested Parties

Local residents – A petition and four letters of representation have been received from local residents on the grounds of an anticipated increase in noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and noise and anti social behaviour from patrons leaving the premises late at night.

The petition and letters of representation are attached at Appendix 4.

Two letters in support of the application have also been received.

The letters are attached at Appendix 5.

### 3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) Public safety
  - c) The prevention of public nuisance
  - d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

## 4. **Statement of Policy Issues**

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (Prevention of Crime and Disorder) and Part 6 (Prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered. Those in Annex A and Annex C may have conditions that are of particular relevance.

## 5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
  - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
  - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
  - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

## 6. Financial and resource appraisal

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 4. All existing external security lighting shall be maintained in good working order and used where appropriate at all times the premises remain open to the public.
- 5. The Licensee will ensure close liaison with other local licensees in the area and will co-operate with any local "Pub Watch" schemes or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local Licensees.
- 6. All staff (including temporary staff) employed shall be adequately trained in good customer safety, customer care, compliance with the law and child protection issues.



I am writing to register my formal objection to proposals submitted by Punch Taverns PLC, advertised in the window of The Albion Pub on the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 2009.

This is specifically relating to detailed plans to extend the opening hours.

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## This is specifically relating to detailed plans to extend the opening hours.

My principal objection is based on a fear of an increase in alcohol-inspired violence and related anti social behaviour, which according to press reports, is shared by a significant number of police officers around the country.

In addition, the proximity of the Albion pub to local residents' properties is such that we regularly suffer from the disturbance and nuisance caused by drinkers and revellers leaving the premises late into the night or from extremely loud music blaring out into the streets. There must also be a risk of increased noise from taxis (papping horns, doors slamming etc) as local public transport ceases well before the intended closing times. Surely this is something that the local authority would also be concerned about.

If people want to drink during the hours proposed they clearly have other options: ranging from buying it in or visiting the multitude of pubs and bars in the Bradford city centre, which are generally much better equipped to cope with the demands of extended drinking hours; are purposely located away from main residential areas; and if an unfortunate incident should occur, are more accessible to the police.

We all have to work, many of us having to get up at 5 / 6 o'clock in the morning 7 days a week, so you can appreciate everybody living within close proximity would be affected.

I can assure you that many of the local residents I have spoken agree with the above.
