2. **Relevant Representations Received**

2.1 **Responsible Authorities**

Environmental Health

The Environmental Health Officer has requested that the following conditions are placed on the Licence;

1. Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premise shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises between 22.00 hours and 10.00 hours.
2. All outward opening external doors and windows to the licensed premises where regulated entertainment is being provided shall remain closed during the course of the entertainment other than for normal access and egress.
3. No amplified sound, including music is to be played or projected outside the premises.
4. The rear outdoor drinking area at the right hand side of the building is to be cleared of customers no later than 22.00 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.
5. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.
6. No licensable activities or alcohol shall be allowed or customers be permitted to take out or consume alcohol in the front outdoor drinking area at the left hand side of the building after 23.00.

The representation is attached at Appendix 3.

2.2 **Interested Parties**

Local Residents – A petition has been received from local residents, on the grounds of anticipated noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and patrons smoking outside the premises and leaving the premises late at night. Concerns are also raised regarding anticipated anti-social behaviour by patrons of the premises and litter problems including glasses and bottles being left outside the premises. The residents also state that the premises are in a residential area.

The petition is attached at Appendix 4.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
- a) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) Public safety
 - c) The prevention of public nuisance
 - d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (Prevention of Crime and Disorder) and Part 6 (Prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered. Those in Annex A & D may have conditions that are of particular relevance.

5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
- (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state’s right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council’s powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant’s rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels’ usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Embedded Conditions

4. None of the restrictions on permitted hours prohibit:
 - a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of the sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - c. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - d. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
 - f. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - g. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - h. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

1. Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premise shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises between 22.00 hours and 10.00 hours.

2. All outward opening external doors and windows to the licensed premises where regulated entertainment is being provided shall remain closed during the course of the entertainment other than for normal access and egress.
3. No amplified sound, including music is to be played or projected outside the premises.
4. The rear outdoor drinking area at the right hand side of the building is to be cleared of customers no later than 22.00 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.
5. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.
6. No licensable activities or alcohol shall be allowed or customers be permitted to take out or consume alcohol in the front outdoor drinking area at the left hand side of the building after 23.00.

Please inform me if you would agree to the above being placed on the licence as Conditions or wish to amend the application.

If I do not hear from you, within the next 7 days, I will assume that you do not wish to have these conditions attached to the Premises Licence and the matter will be referred to Members of the Licensing Panel for their consideration. I am currently investigating an alleged noise complaint from this property. The complaint is in relation to the volume of music that can be heard coming from the property and noise from people leaving.

I would suggest that the following conditions are put onto the licence to limit these problems.

Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises between 22:00 hours and 10:00 hours

The Licensee will instruct all staff (including temporary staff) to conduct regular internal and external patrols of the premises in order to monitor and eliminate any noise nuisance during regulated entertainment.

All doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place, except for access and egress.

No amplified sound, including music is to be played or projected outside the premises.

The outdoor drinking areas are to be cleared of customers no later than 22.00 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to co-operate with this requirement.

Dear sirs,

We, the residents of Mortimer Row, Bradford wish to explain our reasons in objecting to the above said license application.

To begin with it must be pointed out that there have already been several complaints about excessive noise and disruption to the local residents against the above mentioned premises. Several of us have suffered damage to property and cars which has been reported to the police. We often have to clear up glasses and bottles which are left on doorsteps and window sills. We have to have our wheelie bins chained to the wall as they are always being stolen or thrown into the street. The area does not need this type of venue as we already have enough trouble and drug abuse. With no police presence there is no deterrent for anti social behaviour. As the street is generally quiet and dark with our front doors straight on the pavement we are always disturbed by people using it as a short cut to get to the 147 Snooker Bar at all hours of the day and night. It was bad enough in the past when the building was a night club and it seems that this is what is intended this time as well. About four years ago an application for late music and drinking was refused because of the impact it would have on local residents. This particular one differs greatly because it will be seven days a week and will amongst other things effect house prices.

We therefore object for the following reasons,

1. This is predominantly a residential area and late drinkers will seriously affect people who have to get up for work.
2. The area is not policed. When the said premises was known as "The Broadway Bar" there was always a significant police presence and Mortimer Row in particular was policed top and bottom to try and prevent vandalism. This sort of venue should be left to the town centre where the police are more visible and able to cope.
3. There is a large outside smoking area which potentially will cause excessive noise in the early hours.
4. There will be taxis blowing their horns and slamming doors outside which again will contribute to excessive noise.
5. An extended license will contribute to the already out of control problem of binge drinking and anti social behaviour.

We trust you will look favourably on the points we have made. Enclosed is a list of signatures from the residents of Mortimer Row who agree with this objection.
