1. Summary

1.1 The applicant

Rafique Ali. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

1.2 **Application**

The application is for the grant of a Personal Licence. The applicant resides in the Bradford Metropolitan District.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 West Yorkshire Police

West Yorkshire Police made representations on the 11 August 2009 objecting to the grant of a Personal Licence to the applicant on the grounds of previous convictions, which they consider make the applicant unsuitable to receive a licence on crime prevention grounds. Also, the applicant did not disclose the convictions on the Disclosure Declaration form.

A copy of the letter of representation is attached at Appendix 2, and this contains details of these offences. In the interests of economy this document has been sent to Members of the Panel only.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District. The statutory guidance recommends at paragraph 4 that:-

"where the police have objected...refusal of the application should be the normal course unless there are, in the opinion of the licensing authority, exceptional and compelling circumstances...However, where an applicant is able to demonstrate that the offence...took place so long ago and that he or she no longer has a propensity to re-offend, a licensing authority may consider that the individual circumstances of the case are so exceptional and compelling and any risk so diminished that it is right to grant the application".

3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.

3.4 However, with regard to a valid application for a personal licence only the Police can object on the basis that a previous relevant conviction would compromise the crime prevention objective.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder).

5. **Legal Options**

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Grant a personal licence as applied for in the light of stated exceptional circumstances; or
 - (b) Refuse a personal licence on the grounds that to do so would compromise the prevention of crime objective.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or West Yorkshire Police feel aggrieved at the decision with regard to the licence they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7. Other implications

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.3 Community safety implications

Members may consider that there are issues relating to the responsibility of personal licensees with regard to dealings with the public.

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.
