1.3 The Premises

George Hotel, 142 Leeds Road, Idle, Bradford

1.4 **The Current Licence**

The premises have a Premises Licence allowing the sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, the performance of live music and playing of recorded music.

1.5 Steps agreed in the Operating Schedule by the Licensee to address the **Licensing Objectives**

a) Prevention of crime and disorder

All existing external security lighting shall be maintained in good working order and used where appropriate at all times the premises remain open to the public.

The Licensee will ensure close liaison with other licensees in the area and will co-operate with any local "Pub Watch" schemes or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local Licensees.

b) Public Safety

All emergency lighting; illuminated fire exit signs; fire fighting equipment and the fire alarm system shall be maintained in good working order and all staff (including temporary staff) adequately trained in their use and about the evacuation procedures for the premises.

The Licensee shall provide a plan of the premises to the Licensing Authority and West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service, detailing the location and type of all fire safety and other safety equipment, including fire alarms, emergency lighting, fire extinguishers, fire doors and notices, to the satisfaction of West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service.

The Licensee shall maintain working arrangements with local taxi/private hire operators and take reasonable steps to communicate this to patrons in order to ensure orderly booking, arrival and departure of customers in such vehicles.

The Licensee shall ensure that the designated premises supervisor and all management and staff employed are properly trained in the stated health and safety policy of the Licensee.

c) Prevention of public nuisance

Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

No amplified sound, including music is to be played or projected outside the premises.

The outdoor drinking areas are to be cleared of customers no later than 23.20 hours with prominent appropriate signage displayed encouraging patrons to cooperate with this requirement.

All doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place.

d) Protection of children from harm

The Licensee and staff must ensure that children under 18 years of age vacate the premises by 19.30 hours.

Children accompanied by a parent or guardian shall only be allowed in designated areas within the premises and the designated area of the beer garden.

1.6 Conditions Attached after Hearing

2. Applications Received asking for a Review of the Licence

2.1 Interested Parties

Local residents have asked for a review of the licence on the grounds of noise and disturbance caused by patrons drinking & smoking outside the premises and leaving the premises late at night and noise nuisance from regulated entertainment when the doors/windows are left open. Concern is also raised regarding anti-social behaviour by patrons of the premises and litter problems, with bottles and glasses thrown on the road, pavements and grass verges and left overnight on the benches and outdoor areas of the premises. It is also alleged that conditions of the licence are being breached.

A copy of the application for review is attached at Appendix 2.

3. Representations

3.1 Responsible Authorities

1. Environmental Health – A representation has been received from the Environmental Health Department which received complaints of noise nuisance from regulated entertainment at the premises. Monitoring of the premises revealed a statutory noise nuisance and an Abatement Notice was served under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 on the Designated Premises Supervisor on the 1 September 2009. In order to address the prevention of public nuisance objective and avoid further complaints, the Officer has made various recommendations, which are outlined in the representation.

The representation from Environmental Health is attached at Appendix 3.

3.2 Interested Parties

10 Letters of representation in support of the review have been received. The representations refer to alleged noise nuisance from regulated entertainment, noise and disturbance by patrons using the outdoor drinking areas and leaving the premises late at night and anti-social behaviour by patrons. Concerns are also raised regarding broken and discarded glasses around the area and alleged breach of conditions of the Licence.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 4.

31 letters in support of the way the premises are run have been received. Members may wish to consider the issue of vicinity in respect of some of the addresses on the letters.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 5.

4. Legal Appraisal

4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm
- 4.2 The Council must also have regard to the Guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District. Paragraph 5.99 to 5.111 of the Guidance specifically details how applications for review of licences should be determined.

An extract of the Guidance is attached to this report at Appendix 6.

- 4.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

5. Statement of Policy Issues

- 5.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime & disorder), Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 5.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

6. **Legal Options**

- 6.1 Members may:
 - (a) Refuse the application for review of the licence; or
 - (b) Decide not to impose any further restrictions on the licence; or
 - (c) Decide to impose additional restrictions or remove any licensable activities on the licence, where necessary in order to address the licensing objectives; or
 - (d) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months; or
 - (e) Revoke the premises licence; or

- (f) Remove the named Designated Premises Supervisor from the Licence.
- 6.2 Should the licensee or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.

7. Financial and resource appraisal

7.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

8. Other implications

8.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

8.2 Community safety implications

There are no apparent community safety implications.

8.3 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest.

The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



We are seeking an alteration to the current opening and closing hours of this public house. We are looking to have this changed to:

opening 11am - last orders to be at 11.00pm on weekdays & Sundays & 11.30 pm Friday & Saturday

Normal family life has become a thing of the past for residents in this neighbourhood and we believe that the misuse of the current license is the paramount cause of the problems we are having to endure and is exacerbating the situation.

Our daily lives and sleeping patterns are being dictated to by a group of inexperienced bar workers who are allowing customers to call the shots. The DPS, Paul Griffin, is only in attendance during day light hours, he does not live on the premises and claims to be unaware of what is happening in HIS premises.

The licensing hours currently in place are regularly being flouted and this action has attracted an unsavoury element to the premises in order to take advantage of the 'anything goes' policy in place. A police officer attending a call out about fighting in the pub sustained injuries himself. The alterations to the licensing hours of the public houses in Idle Village has just moved the problems they encountered to here.

We are having to endure a succession of taxis bringing late night drinkers to the premises along with the procedure in reverse when drinkers leave. Taxis are blaring horns, people are standing out on the street shouting, swearing, screaming and in some instances fighting. These nuisances are every weekend and continue until 3.30 am and beyond.

Beer bottles are thrown onto the road, pavements and grass verges. Bottles and glasses are left outside overnight on the benches on the main roadside of the premises.

All government agencies have been involved to attempt to curtail these disturbances, but due to the Premises Manager lack of co-operation, their efforts have been in vain. There is a Breach of License re: music being played until the early hours of the morning with doors and windows being left open despite the issuing of the noise abatement notice. The music license is only until 01.00 at the latest but it goes on until 0300 at least.

This is a residential area and this is impacting greatly on the lives of numerous residents / neighbours. How can this level of intrusion be acceptable for people who work.

In respect of the review application for the above premises, I have the following submission in regard of the issue of noise.

History

This Department has received a number of complaints from local residents regarding noise nuisance from The George Hotel. The complainants primarily concern is the issue of noise break-out from the building during the provision of regulated entertainment. There are also concerns about noise from people drinking and smoking outside on the decking area at the rear of the property.

Monitoring of the premises led to the establishment of a Statutory Nuisance from noise from music and an Abatement Notice was served under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 on Mr Paul Griffin on the 1st September 2009.

Recommendations

Noise from inside the George

In order to protect the amenity of the immediate residents I would request that the time limit for regulated entertainment be midnight throughout the week. I would also recommend that noise limiters be fitted on all amplifying equipment and set at levels agreed with the Environmental Protection Department.

To prevent noise break-out all doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place, except for access and egress. No amplified music to be heard outside of the premises.

Noise outside the George.

No licensing activities should take place outside after 22:30 hours. The outdoor drinking areas should be cleared of customers no later than 22:30 hours.

This correspondence is in support of the request for an application to review the premises licence or club certificate issued under the Licensing Act 2003, in regard to The George Public House, Leeds Road, Idle, Bradford.

For over the past twelve months the premises have played music until the early hours of the morning from Thursdays to Sundays to the detriment of ourselves and our neighbours. Not only is music played but there is raucous noise that accompanies this, normally consisting of shouting and swearing and occasionally loud singing. We have been in contact with both the West Yorkshire Police and Bradford Council Environmental Team on several occasions regarding the premises, we have had several meetings with representatives of both to try and resolve the matter without resorting to such an application as this. However, despite our best attempts this has been unsuccessful and we have no option except to ask that the licensable hours be amended to fit in with a public house in a quiet residential area and not one that reflects the night time economy of a busy city centre.

In October 2009 alone the following has occurred:-

Monday 12 October - music and shouting coming from the public house until 23.50. Friday 16 October - music, shouting and swearing until 02.30. Friday 23 October - music, shouting, laughing until 01.30. Saturday 31 October - music, shouting and swearing until 00.50.

The above are just a few examples that we have documented, almost every night, music blasts out until around 11.30 no matter what, my understanding was that the landlord of the premises is responsible to ensure that issues like this do not occur but they seem to ignore this.

The impact this is having on our lives is that every night we have no option except to stay up until at least midnight which is causing us anxiety and distress. This then impacts on our daily lives.

We are aware that our neighbours have requested the review of the premises license and we are in full support of them, the premises are clearly causing a public nuisance to the local residents who live closest to the establishment.

We would be willing to attend any formal hearings regarding this matter and would appreciate an acknowledgement of this letter and to be kept updated as to how this progresses.


I live across the road from The George, in a ground floor flat, with my bedroom looking out onto Leeds Road and my life has been disrupted by these premises for the last 10 months.

This is a letter supporting the recent Licence Review application to revoke the late licence for The George Public House, 142 Leeds Road, Idle, Bradford.

The late licence has made life, at times, intolerable for local residents. The major problems are at the weekend although the noise can be bad at anytime e.g. Thursday 17/09/2009 excessive noise and Tuesday 22/09/2209 once again excessive noise very early – on this occasion we did contact the police – as well as excessive noise 13/09/2009. The BBQ (6pm-8pm – with music outside)/Karaoke/Disco (9pm – 1am) every Friday and a live band every Saturday/ Sunday night (9pm – whenever) has meant that noise penetrates the house. At such times we are unable to sleep in the front bedroom or use other rooms at the front of the house. Also in the summer we cannot use our garden without noise intrusion. At the weekend all windows need to be kept shut, whatever the weather, in order to try and minimise any noise. The noise even permeates triple glazing that we had installed in the main front bedroom in order to alleviate noise.

The illegal and extensive elevated decking has greatly exacerbated the problem – we are aware that that is a planning issue – but it has meant far greater noise for longer. Groups congregate on the decking. Doors and windows are automatically left open which means that the noise travels further. The licence conditions are not being adhered to – that doors and windows are closed and decking cleared by 11.15pm. Also the landlord does not appear to live on the premises and therefore does not know/care about the disturbance caused to local residents. In our minds he is not being a "good neighbour".

We strongly feel that revoking the late licence at The George Pub will go some way to making the lives of local residents bearable once again. At present the landlord fails to adhere to some existing restrictions e.g. keeping doors and windows shut, clearing the decking at the correct time and monitoring the behaviour of his customers and local residents feel that he has no concern whatsoever for their thoughts and feelings. Would a noise abatement order also be applicable?

Finally we have been appalled that as soon as the licence review notice was placed on the lamppost outside the pub it was removed. Once it is replaced it happens again e.g. it was gone by pm. Friday 30th October. We emailed the council to let them know but of course it was too late for them to do anything about that before the weekend.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter and we look forward to being advised of the date of the meeting when this will be discussed.

A Section

11. Reviews

THE REVIEW PROCESS

- 11.1 The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for reviewing premises licences represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives are occurring after the grant or variation of a premises licence.
- 11.2 At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, or an interested party, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- 11.3 In addition, a review of the licence will normally follow any action by the police to close down the premises for up to 24 hours on grounds of disorder or noise nuisance as a result of a notice of magistrates' court's determination sent to the licensing authority.
- 11.4 Licensing authorities may not initiate their own reviews of premises licences. Officers of the local authority who are specified as responsible authorities under the 2003 Act, such as environmental health officers, may however request reviews on any matter which relates to the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 11.5 Representations made by a department of the local authority which is a responsible authority should be treated by the licensing authority in precisely the same way that they would treat representations made by any other body or individual.
- 11.6 In every case, the representation must relate to particular premises for which a premises licence is in existence and must be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives. After a licence or certificate has been granted or varied, a complaint relating to a general (crime

- and disorder) situation in a town centre should generally not be regarded as a relevant representation unless it can be positively tied or linked by a causal connection to particular premises, which would allow for a proper review of the licence or certificate. For instance, a geographic cluster of complaints, including along transport routes related to an individual public house and its closing time could give grounds for a review of an existing licence as well as direct incidents of crime and disorder around a particular public house.
- 11.7 Representations must be in writing and may be amplified at the subsequent hearing or may stand in their own right. Additional representations which do not amount to an amplification of the original representation may not be made at the hearing.
- 11.8 It is important to recognise that the promotion of the licensing objectives relies heavily on a partnership between licence holders, authorised persons, interested parties and responsible authorities in pursuit of common aims. It is therefore equally important that reviews are not used to drive a wedge between these groups in a way that would undermine the benefits of co-operation. It is good practice for authorised persons and responsible authorities to give licence holders early warning of their concerns about problems identified at the premises concerned and of the need for improvement. A failure to respond to such warnings is expected to lead to a decision to request a review.
- 11.9 Where the request originates with an interested party e.g. a local resident, residents' association, local business or trade association the licensing authority must first consider whether the complaint made is relevant, vexatious, frivolous or repetitious.

11.10 Further information for interested parties about the review process is available in "Guidance for interested parties: applying for a review" which can be found on the DCMS website.

REPETITIOUS REPRESENTATIONS

- 11.11 Relevance, vexation and frivolousness were dealt with in paragraphs 9.8 9.13 above. A repetitious representation is one that is identical or substantially similar to:
 - a ground for review specified in an earlier application for review made in relation to the same premises licence which has already been determined; or
 - representations considered by the licensing authority when the premises licence was first granted; or
 - representations which would have been made when the application for the premises licence was first made and which were excluded then by reason of the prior issue of a provisional statement;
 - and, in addition to the above grounds, a reasonable interval has not elapsed since that earlier review or the grant of the licence.
- of the need to prevent attempts to review licences merely as a second bite of the cherry following the failure of representations to persuade the licensing authority on earlier occasions. It is for licensing authorities themselves to judge what should be regarded as a reasonable interval in these circumstances. However, the Secretary of State recommends that more than one review originating from an interested party should not be permitted within a period of twelve months on similar grounds save in compelling circumstances or where it arises following a closure order.

1

- 11.13 The exclusion of a complaint on the grounds that it is repetitious does not apply to responsible authorities which may make more than one request for a review of a premises within a 12 month period.
- 11.14 When a licensing authority receives a request for a review from a responsible authority or an interested party or in accordance with the closure procedures described in Part 8 of the 2003 Act, it must arrange a hearing. The arrangements for the hearing must follow the provisions set out by the Secretary of State in regulations. The details may be viewed on the DCMS website. The Secretary of State considers it particularly important that the premises licence holder is fully aware of the representations made in respect of the premises, any evidence supporting the representations and that they or their legal representatives have therefore been able to prepare a response.

POWERS OF A LICENSING AUTHORITY ON THE DETERMINATION OF A REVIEW

- 11.15 The 2003 Act provides a range of powers for the licensing authority on determining a review that it may exercise where it considers them necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 11.16 The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing

- 11.17 Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers are necessary, it may take any of the following steps:
 - to modify the conditions of the premises licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
 - to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);
 - to remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
 - to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - · to revoke the licence.
- 11.18 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than a necessary and proportionate response.

- 11.19 For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated premises supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual.
- 11.20 Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems which impact upon the licensing objectives.
- 11.21 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

REVIEWS ARISING IN CONNECTION WITH CRIME

- 11.22 A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with licensable activities. For example, reviews may arise because of drugs problems at the premises or money laundering by criminal gangs or the sale of contraband or stolen goods there or the sale of firearms. Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. This is a matter for the courts of law. The role of the licensing authority when determining such a review is not therefore to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual but to ensure that the crime prevention objective is promoted. Reviews are part of the regulatory process introduced by the 2003 Act and they are not part of criminal law and procedure. Some reviews will arise after the conviction in the criminal courts of certain individuals but not all. In any case, it is for the licensing authority to determine whether the problems associated with the alleged crimes are taking place on the premises and affecting the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where a review follows a conviction, it would also not be for the licensing authority to attempt to go behind any finding of the courts, which should be treated as a matter of undisputed evidence before them.
- 11.23 Where the licensing authority is conducting a review on the ground that the premises have been used for criminal purposes, its role is solely to determine what steps should be taken in connection with the premises licence, for the promotion of the crime prevention objective. It is important to recognise that certain criminal activity or associated problems may be taking place or have taken

- place despite the best efforts of the licensee and the staff working at the premises and despite full compliance with the conditions attached to the licence. In such circumstances, the licensing authority is still empowered to take any necessary steps to remedy the problems. The licensing authority's duty is to take steps with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives in the interests of the wider community and not those of the individual holder of the premises licence.
- 11.24 As explained above, it is not the role of a licensing authority to determine the guilt or innocence of individuals charged with licensing or other offences committed on licensed premises. There is therefore no reason why representations giving rise to a review of a premises licence need be delayed pending the outcome of any criminal proceedings. As stated above, at the conclusion of a review, it will be for the licensing authority to determine on the basis of the application for the review and any relevant representations made, what action needs to be taken for the promotion of the licensing objectives in respect of the licence in question, regardless of any subsequent judgment in the courts about the behaviour of individuals.
- 11.25 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
 - for the sale and distribution of Class A drugs and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crime;
 - for the sale and distribution of illegal firearms;
 - for the evasion of copyright in respect of pirated or unlicensed films and music, which does considerable damage to the industries affected;

- for the purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
- for prostitution or the sale of unlawful pornography;
- by organised groups of paedophiles to groom children;
- as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs;
- for the organisation of racist activity or the promotion of racist attacks;
- · for unlawful gaming and gambling; and
- · for the sale of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.
- 11.26 It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence even in the first instance should be seriously considered. We would also encourage liaison with the local Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership.
- 11.27 It should be noted that it is unlawful to discriminate or to refuse service on grounds of race or by displaying racially discriminatory signs on the premises. Representations made about such activity from responsible authorities or interested parties would be relevant to the promotion of the crime prevention objective and justifiably give rise to a review.

REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE FOLLOWING CLOSURE ORDER

- 11.28 Licensing authorities are subject to certain timescales, set out in the legislation, for the review of a premises licence following a closure order. The relevant time periods run concurrently and are as follows:
 - when the licensing authority receives notice that a magistrates' court has made a closure order it has 28 days to determine the licence review: The determination must be made before the expiry of the 28th day after the day on which the notice is received;
 - the hearing must be held within 10 working days, the first of which is the day after the day the notice from the magistrates' court is received;
 - notice of the hearing must be given no later than 5 working days before the first hearing day. There must be five clear working days between the giving of the notice and the start of the hearing.
