2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Responsible Authorities

Environmental Health – A representation has been received from the Environmental Health Officer who is investigating a noise nuisance complaint and is concerned that any increase in hours will worsen the issue.

The representation is attached at Appendix 3.

2.2 Interested Parties

Local Resident & Business – A letter of representation has been received from a local resident on the grounds of an anticipated increase in noise and disturbance. A letter of representation has also been received from a local business which manages residential apartments in the vicinity. The business has concerns regarding noise and disturbance, anti-social behaviour and underage drinking by patrons of the premises.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 4.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) Public safety
 - c) The prevention of public nuisance
 - d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder), Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance) and Part 7 (protection of Children from Harm).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. **Legal Options**

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

APPENDIX 2

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less:
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with Operating Schedule

6. The Licensee shall ensure that adequate supervision of the premises is maintained at all times during the carrying out of licensable activities and that any staff are trained in ensuring compliance with the licensing objectives at all times.

Spice entertainment, 55 Leeds Road.

I have some concerns relating to this application as the premises are the subject of an ongoing noise complaint.

I have one active complaint relating to the Spice Club from Aldersgate Ltd (the management company running Eastbrook Hall which has 72 residential apartments next door) although Mr Marsh of Aldersgate is insistent there are serious noise problems we have not been contacted directly by an tenant/occupier of Eastbrook Well.

Multiple extract fan outlets vent out from the basement club into the void between the two buildings. Eastbrook Hall has habitable room windows on this elevation. So far, I have been unable to ascertain the extent of the problem as when I asked for an update from Mr Marsh after my meeting with Mr R Parmar he advised that many of the tenants are foreign mature students who will not return to Eastbrook Well until September so we would not be in a position to assess the problem until then. However, I suspect there are likely to be justified complaints here and the current application to extend the club's hours of operation may only make matters worse.

I met the Mr Rajan Parmar in his new basement club on the 22nd June to discuss the complaint and give some general advice on noise levels. He acknowledged that live music takes place here as well as recorded music with a DJ. Although the basement has no windows (which is good from a noise insulation perspective) there are 4 or 5 large fan outlets at ceiling level which vent out into narrow "yard" between 55 and Eastbrook Hall. There is therefore a direct sound path from the club to residents homes.

We have ended up with a "night club" type operation licensed until the early hours next door to recently created residential apartments with no noise related conditions. I can see no easy solution to this issue as there is no practicable option not entailing massive costs to provide alternative ventilation (and I suspect my colleagues in planning would not be happy with large amounts of air con/extract equipment installed on the exterior). It is early days from an EP perspective but I suspect minimising any noise affecting residents of Eastbrook Well may be exceedingly difficult if not impossible and I am concerned that any increase in hours will worsen the issue.
