1. Summary

1.1 The applicant

Enterprise Inns PLC. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

1.2 The Premises

Delius Lived Next Door, 8-10 Claremont, Bradford.

The premise has a licence in force, but as an additional area (first floor function room) is required to be licensed, a grant application has had to be submitted.

A copy of the existing Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 2.

1.4 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Sale/supply of alcohol
- Provision of regulated entertainment

Sale of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment & provision of late night refreshment (from 23.00)

Monday to Saturday: 10.00 to 02.00
Sunday: 12.00 to Midnight
Christmas Eve: A further additional hour
Boxing Day: A further additional hour
New Years Eve: 10.00 hours until the start of permitted hours the following day.
Non Standard Timings: A further additional hour into the morning following on Saturday of every statutory Bank Holiday weekend.

Hours the premises proposed to be open:

Monday to Saturday: 10.00 to 02.30
Sunday: 12.00 to 00.30
Christmas Eve: A further additional hour
Boxing Day: A further additional hour
New Years Eve: 10.00 hours until the start of permitted hours the following day.
Non Standard Timings: A further additional hour into the morning following on Saturday of every statutory Bank Holiday weekend

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Responsible Authorities

Environmental Health - In order to address the Public Nuisance objective, the Environmental Health Officer has requested that the following conditions are placed on the Licence;

1. All potential noise sources shall be assessed. Such assessments shall take account of amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech, plant and machinery, use of outdoor areas and car parks, delivery and collection vehicles and access to and from the premises.
2. Noise control measures and systems for monitoring and reviewing those controls shall be put into place. Such control measures and systems shall be reviewed periodically, (at least once per year) and whenever new noise sources and/or controls are introduced or following receipt of complaint or when monitoring procedures identify that controls are inadequate.
3. Control measures shall be designed to ensure that noise from any potential noise source is kept to a minimum or is eliminated.
4. The Licensee shall ensure that staff monitor, on a regular basis, noise emanating from the premises from regulated entertainment to ensure that neighbouring residents are not disturbed.

5. Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises shall not be at a level to cause disturbance at the nearest noise sensitive premises.

The applicant has agreed to the conditions being placed on the Licence.

2.2 Interested Parties

Ward Councillor – A letter of representation has been received from a Ward Councillor on behalf of residents, on the grounds of anticipated noise and disturbance by patrons using the rear outdoor area. Concern is also raised about alleged litter problems and glass bottles being left in the back street.

The letters are attached at Appendix 4.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following part of the Licensing Policy is of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. Legal Options

5.1 Members may:

- (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
- (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
- (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence. (this will effectively mean that the premises could not open unless by authority of a temporary event notice without breaching the licensing laws).

5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. Financial and resource appraisal

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7. Other implications

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.2 Community safety implications

There are no apparent community safety implications.

7.3 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

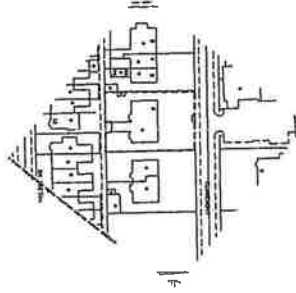

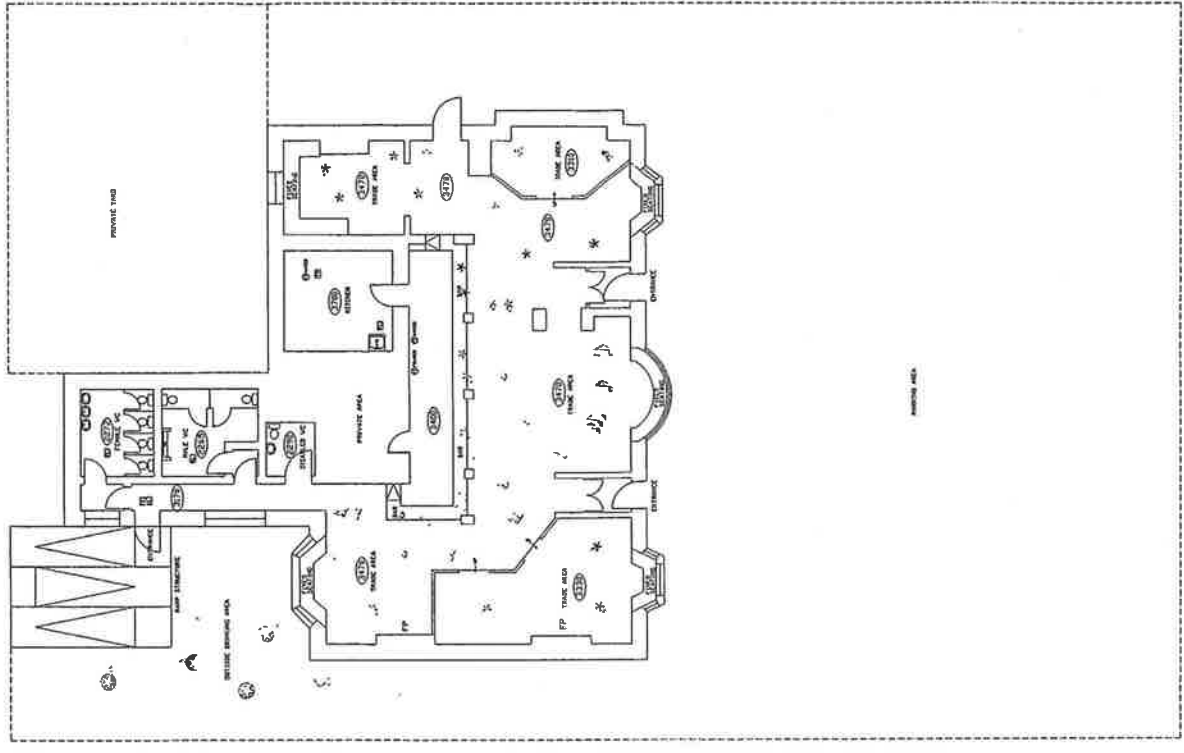

21. Removal of refuse and emptying of bottle bins within the curtilage of the licensed premises shall not take place between the hours of 21.00 and 07.00.

The Protection of Children from Harm:

22. The Licensee shall enforce a recognised and effective proof of age policy in order to ensure that underage children are not allowed to purchase alcohol.
23. Under 18 year olds are not permitted on the premises at any time.
