1. SUMMARY

The application is for the variation of a Premises Licence to extend permitted hours, allow recorded music outdoors, live music indoors and vary Condition 13 of the Operating Schedule.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicant

2.4 Current Licence

Christmas Eve: A further additional hour to those stated above.

Boxing Day: A further additional hour to those stated above.

New Years Eve: 10.00 hours until the start of permitted hours the following day.

Non Standard Timings: A further additional hour into the morning following on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of every statutory Bank Holiday weekend, including the Thursday prior to Easter Bank Holiday weekend.

2.7 Relevant Representations Received

Responsible Authorities

Environmental Health – The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance objective. The Environmental Health Officer has concerns regarding noise nuisance from outdoor regulated entertainment causing disturbance for local residents.

The representation is attached at Appendix 3.

Interested Parties

Local Residents and Business – A letter of representation from a local business and 13 individual letters and 24 pro-forma letters of representation from local residents have been received.

The business has concerns that noise nuisance from regulated entertainment, both indoor and outdoor and particularly from live bands, could affect the accuracy of hearing tests carried out at the business.

The residents have concerns regarding a possible increase in noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment held both inside and outside the premises and noise, disturbance and anti-social behaviour from patrons using the outdoor area and leaving the premises late at night. Concern is also raised about alleged litter problems such as bottles being thrown in gardens.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 4.

4. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 4.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 4.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder), Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance) and Part 7 (protection of children from harm).
- 4.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

5. OPTIONS

- 5.1 Members may:

- (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children–
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to–
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on–
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
7. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Embedded Conditions

8. None of the restrictions on permitted hours prohibit:
 - a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of the sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - c. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - d. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
 - f. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - g. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - h. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

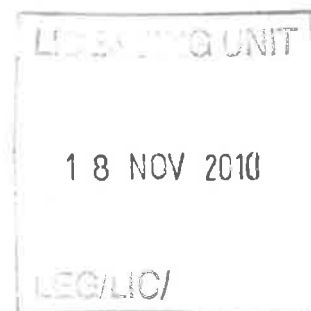

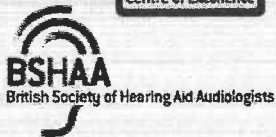

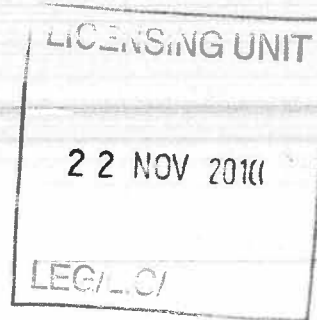

Objection to Punch Taverns PLC application for the Dog and Gun Public House, 1001 Harrogate Road, Apperley Bridge, Bradford BD10 0LT in respect to their application for Premises Licence variations.

From the posted note I see they want a 7 day, 2AM music licence. **We all object to this application on the following grounds.**

Since the introduction of the smoking ban, an outside area has been built to allow smokers outside the pub if they wish to partake. This in itself has increased the noise level from the pub dramatically. Especially on summer evenings, you can have gangs of people screaming and shouting in this area (also using obscene language and we have small children) until the early hours. Nothing is done to control this or quieten them down so I fear a music licence until 2AM will add to this disturbance greatly. It will impact a large number of local homes not just ours and is totally unnecessary and unacceptable.

The acoustics local also mean that on certain nights, although we are 100 yards away from the pub, we can sit in our own back garden and hear every word coming from the Pubs smoking area. It would be a total disaster if this were allowed to happen and we also had music blaring out until the early hours... then followed by the unruly departure of persons from the pub.

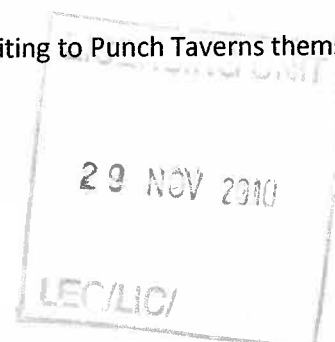
We fear the types and state of people attracted to the pub if this were allowed, and the increase in damage, nuisance and even litter as on occasion we find bottles from the pub thrown in our garden now.

The pub has limited parking but we also suffer from parking issues on Tentefields and on some nights, this can be very dangerous with both sides of the road fully taken up, leaving a single track down the middle. Unfortunately cars speed down here at ridiculous speeds and at some point I know there will be a serious accident. This can only add to this issue.

I've also complained several times about the huge spot light they have in their car park. 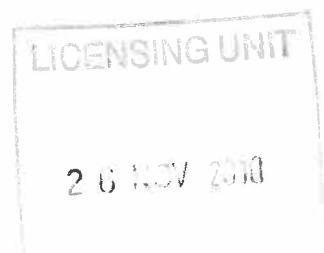

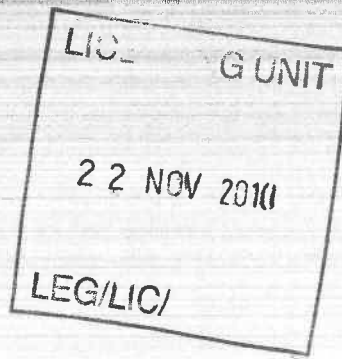

I notice that our local pub, The Dog and Gun, 1001 Harrogate Road, apperley Bridge, BD10 0LT, has applied for an amendment to their license, described as "regulated entertainment - Monday - Sunday 12.00 - 02.00". After making enquiries I am led to understand that this could include music both indoors and possibly outdoors (though probably not in the present weather).

They do have outdoor music in the summer on occasions and the sound does travel across the adjoining estate. As a one off ending between 10 and 11 it is not too intrusive. However were they to be able to play music until 2 am either inside or outside I do feel it would become unbearable for local residents.

The area is a residential area and the geography of the area, on the slope of a valley, means that any noise from the Dog and Gun does travel across the housing.

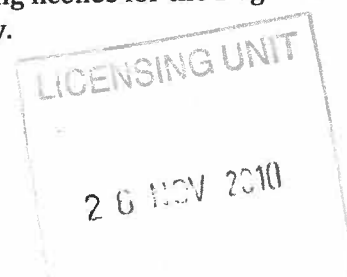

I am writing to strongly object to the proposed extension to the license of the Dog and Gun pub on Harrogate Road that will allow recorded music both outside and inside of the premises to be played until 2am. As I understand it, the application is to be made for this to happen for 7 days a week. Even if this was narrowed to weekends only, any change to the Dog and Gun's existing license would make our life intolerable, not to mention devaluing our property significantly in the future.

I live immediately across the road from the pub, and have recently been made father to a baby boy who is still less than a year old. The Dog and Gun has a seating area outside the main premises, and the noise created by both the music and increased number of people drinking into the early hours of the morning will cause a disturbance to the peace and be a general public nuisance. In addition, I dread to think of the risk such changes would make to the possibility for crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour in what is currently a safe environment in which to raise a family. Everyone living in the estate knows how much sound travels through the valley; even music from the Stansfield Arms can be heard at Christmas and this is from all the way across the river! The prospect of having a pub playing recorded music until 2am, together with customers moving to and from the premises at such a late hour directly across from our home is simply unthinkable.
