1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence for the sale of alcohol and provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicants

Enterprise Inns Plc. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

2.2 The Premises

Fleece Inn, 452 Allerton Road, Allerton, Bradford.

The premise was previously licensed but the Premises Licence was cancelled when the company holding the licence went into liquidation.

The hours applied for in this application reflect the permitted hours under the previous licence.

2.4 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Sale of alcohol for consumption on or off the premises
- Provision of Regulated Entertainment
- Provision of Late Night Refreshment (from 23.00 hours)

Hours of licensable activities:

Monday to Sunday: 10.00 to 00.30

A further additional hour to those stated above every Christmas Eve, Christmas Day & Boxing Day.

A further additional hour to those stated above every Bank Holiday weekend including the Thursday before Easter Bank Holiday.

New Years Eve: 10.00 until the start of permitted hours the following day.

2.5 Relevant Representations Received

Responsible Authorities

Environmental Health - In order to address the Public Nuisance objective, the Environmental Health Officer has requested that the following conditions are placed on the Licence:

Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premise shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.

All external doors and windows to the licensed premises where regulated entertainment is being provided shall remain closed during the course of the entertainment other than for normal access and egress.

The applicant has agreed to the conditions being placed on the Licence.

However, further noise nuisance complaints have been received by Environmental Health, in respect of Temporary Event Notices submitted by the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor, Mr Alexander Canning, for 28 July 2011, 30 July 2011 and 31 July 2011. The Environmental Health Officer is concerned that the Department is still receiving complaints despite the above conditions being agreed and questions whether this is lip service to ensure the Licence is approved.

The representation is attached at Appendix 3.

Interested Parties

Local Residents – Two letters of representation have been received from local residents on the grounds of noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and from patrons using the outdoor area and leaving the premises late at night. Residents also have concerns regarding anti-social behaviour and empty cans,

bottles and other litter being discarded in the area.

4. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 4.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 4.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

- 4.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder), Part 6 (prevention of public nuisance) and Part 7 (protection of children from harm)

- (a) Grant a premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
- (b) Grant a premises licence subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
- (c) Refuse the application for a premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members

they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

P. Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives

Licensing objectives;-

- 1. Staff shall be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to the licensing objectives when they are recruited
- 2. The DPS shall at all times maintain a "zero tolerance" policy with regard to illegal drugs (including appropriate staff training in detection and prevent) and shall co-operate with the West Yorkshire Police's Drugs Watch initiative or any similar scheme
- 3. The existing cctv system installed at the premises shall be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any cctv footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and available to the Licensing Authority or responsible authority on request.
- 4. All staff shall be trained in appropriate circumstances ways to refuse custom eg to those appearing to be already drunk or underage.
- 5. The DPS shall take all steps within its control (including establishment of effective staff briefing and other procedures) to ensure that the capacity limit of 100 persons is not exceeded.
- 6. All emergency lighting; fire fighting equipment and first aid facilities shall be maintained in good working order and all staff (including temporary staff) adequately trained in their use and about the evacuation procedures for the premises.
- 7. Existing flooring shall be maintained and replaced where necessary in order to prevent any slipping or tripping hazards.
- 8. Access and egress doors into and out of the premises shall be kept clear and free from obstruction at all times.
- 9. The DP shall ensure that security and other external lighting used are maintained in such a position so as to avoid light pollution to nearby residents.
- 10. The DPS shall ensure that the external areas of the premises are kept clear of litter and refuse.
- 11. The DPS shall maintain working arrangements with local taxi/private hire operators and take reasonable steps to communicate this to patrons in order to ensure orderly booking, arrival and departure of customers in such vehicles
- 12. Staff shall be trained in efficient methods for ensuring customers leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion.

- 13. The DPS shall enforce a recognised and effective proof of age policy in the premises in order to ensure unaccompanied under aged children are not allowed access when alcohol sales are taking place in the premises.
- 14. No regulated entertainment of an adult or sexual nature shall be provided at any time in the licensed premises.
- 15. All gaming achiness must be positioned so that they are within sight of the bar servery.
- 16. The consumption of alcohol in the external areas of the licensed premises shall not be allowed after 23.30.
- 17. All outward opening doors and windows are to be kept closed after 22.00 when regulated entertainment is taking place
- 18. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in quiet and orderly manner
- 19. The DPS shall patrol the area outside the premises during the periods of entertainment to ensure that noise is not audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.

Good Afternoon Melanie/Tracy/Scott,

I am emailing you in connection with the above premises and the application for a Premises Licence. I sent a Memo to you on 18th July 2011 with recommendations for Conditions relating to noise & the Prevention of Public Nuisance and these were agreed/accepted by the applicant. As you are aware, TENs for the Premises have been submitted to the Council over the past few weekends and since my previous Memo was sent to you. I made reference to a complaint I had received in my Memo and I had also written to Mr Alexander Canning on 12th July 2011 to make him aware of the allegations

Unfortunately, the recent 'TENs' have resulted in a further 2 complaints (3 in total) to this Department about noise, shouting and swearing by patrons stood outside the premises, fighting and loud music. One of the complainants wrote to us today however, she expressed her concerns about coming forward with her full name, address and telephone number as she feels intimidated as she says she is an elderly local resident. She requested that we do something about it as it's ridiculous that they are playing amplified music til after 12:30am and causing a disturbance to local residents.

It was also alleged by one of my complainants that Thursday 28th July 2011 was bad with general comings and goings from the pub and that they had a quiz night and the voice was being amplified and clearly audible in the home of the client. The Friday night wasn't too bad, but Saturday 30th July 2011 was problematic with the music commencing at around 5pm and it continued until 01:15 hours the following morning. Sunday 31st the music was on and clearly audible in their home from 18:30 - 21:30 hours.

I am concerned that we are still receiving complaints from local residents despite an agreement by the applicant to my conditions relating to noise and I question whether this is lip service to ensure the Licence is approved.

It would appear there is some history of complaints about loud music from the premises and I wrote to the current DPS Mr Alexander Canning on 1st June 2010 following a previous complaint. He was then served with an Abatement Notice under Section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 by my colleague Aliah Syed on 6th August 2010. The Notice related to a statutory nuisance arising from amplified music and entertainment at the Fleece and was witnessed by a Council Officer.

It would appear that the notice resulted in a reduction in the noise however, it appears to have increased once again. I would question whether Mr Canning is an approriate/responsible person to have as a Designated Premises Supervisor under the circumstances. I would ask that the application for the Premises Licence is put before a Licensing Panel and they can then make a decision on whether more robust conditions are required or whether a reduction in the hours of operation is necessary to ensure that local residents are not being disturbed as a result of noise and anti-social behaviour associated with the pub.

I am more than happy to attend a licensing hearing to make my concerns known to the Panel of Councillors.

I understand that Enterprise Inns Plc. have applied for a Premises Licence between the hours of 10.00 to 00.30hrs Monday to Sunday with music, dancing and late night refreshments between 23.00 and 00.30 for the Fleece Inn, 452 Allerton Road BD15 7DY.

I have lived in the locality for over forty years and it is only in the past few years that problems with noise nuisance and other problems have occurred and increased.

At times we have had

1.People urinating against walls and fences,

2. Vomiting and spitting on pavements.

3. Cans bottles and empty glasses (mostly broken) cigarette packets/ cigarette stubs discarded on footpaths grass verges and in gardens.

4. Cars parked on footpaths, across access gates, drives and on grass verges,

5.Car doors being slammed at all times of the day and night.

6.People shouting to each other, arguing, fighting and using foul and indecent language.

This happens mainly at weekends 11.00pm to midnight which is unacceptable at the moment, but if the licence was granted until 00.30 Monday to Sunday this would move this anti-social behaviour to nearer 01.00/01.30am and could occur every night.

On numerous occasions over the last few years loud amplified music including Karaoke has been played until the early hours of the morning from both The Fleece Inn and The Prince of Wales Public House which are almost opposite each other, this has been regularly reported to the Licensing Department of Bradford Metropolitan District Council and on occasions to the Police, some action has been taken by them.

It must be pointed out that this is a residential area and not a town centre/city or country location where late night drinking would be more acceptable. Many of the customers of both public houses are there to enjoy a quiet drink and not to cause problems but it must also be noted that The Fleece has at times attracted a certain element who behave in anti-social ways. To allow this licence would encourage more anti-social customers to frequent these premises therefore increasing the problem.

Refusing the late licence would not change the problems we are facing at this moment but would help us to get a reasonable nights sleep.
