Bradford Panel

1. **APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF A PREMISES** Idle & Thackley
LICENCE FOR CO-OP LATE SHOP, 53 BRADFORD ROAD,
THORPE GARTH, IDLE, BRADFORD

Resolved –

That, having considered all valid representations made by the parties to the hearing; valid written representations received during the statutory period, the published statement of licensing policy and relevant statutory guidance; the panel grants the application for variation subject to the following conditions:

- 1.1 That a CCTV system (with satisfactory internal and external coverage) be installed at the premises and be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and be available to the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority on request.
- 1.2 That an appropriate proof of age policy, incorporating the principles of the “Challenge 25” Campaign be implemented; incorporating measures to ensure that any patron wishing to purchase alcohol who may reasonably appear to be under 25 years of age are asked to prove that they are at least 18 years old by displaying evidence of their identity and age in the form of a valid UK passport, new style driving licence displaying their photograph or PASS identification.

Reason: It is considered that the above conditions are necessary to ensure the proper management and monitoring of the premises in order to ensure alcohol is not purchased or supplied to those underage – protection of children from harm and prevention of crime and disorder licensing objectives.

2. **APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE FOR,
SMALL WORLD, 20 RUSSELL STREET, KEIGHLEY**

Keighley Central

Resolved –

That, having considered all valid representations made by the parties to the hearing; valid written representations received during the statutory period, the published statement of licensing policy and relevant statutory guidance; the panel grants the application subject to the following conditions:

1.1 Hours of licensable activities:

Sale of alcohol

Friday	1900 to 0430
Saturday	1200 to 0430
Sunday	1200 to 2030

Provision of Plays

Sunday to Thursday	0830 to 2100
Friday & Saturday	0830 to 2400

Provision of films/provision of live music/provision of recorded music/performance of dance/anything similar/ provision of facilities for making music/ provision of facilities for dancing/ anything similar

Monday to Thursday	0830 to 2100
Friday	1030 to 0430
Saturday	1030 to 0430
Sunday	1030 to 2100

- 1.2 That noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.**
- 1.3 That all external doors and windows to the licensed premises, where regulated entertainment is being provided shall remain closed during the course of the entertainment, other than for normal access and egress.**
- 1.4 That prominent signs be displayed at all public exits to the premises requesting patrons to be quiet on leaving and entering.**
- 1.5 That a CCTV system (with satisfactory internal and external coverage) be installed at the premises and be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and be available to the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority on request**

- 1.6 That an appropriate proof of age policy, incorporating the principles of the “Challenge 25” Campaign be implemented; incorporating measures to ensure that any patron wishing to purchase alcohol who may reasonably appear to be under 25 years of age are asked to prove that they are at least 18 years old by displaying evidence of their identity and age in the form of a valid UK passport, new style driving licence displaying their photograph or PASS identification.
- 1.7 All bar staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level within one month of commencing employment at the premises. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the Police and authorised local authority Licensing Officers on demand.
- 1.8 An incident book shall be kept and maintained on the premises at all times. The book shall detail in brief incidents of injury/ejection/refusals/drug misuse/seizure/age challenge. Such matters shall be timed, dated and signed by the author and produced to the Police/Authorised Licensing Officers on demand.
- 1.9 The venue will be a member of the Keighley pub watch scheme. The DPS/Premises Licence Holder must attend at least 80% of pub watch meetings in a 12 month period.
- 1.10 The DPS will fully co-operate with any proactive Police operations such as drugs dog searches.
- 1.11 An accredited first aid training person **MUST** be on duty at all times when the premises operate for Licensable activities.
- 1.12 Complete first aid kits must be located in each of the bar areas and function room and be readily available to staff at all times. The kits will be inspected weekly and replenished daily. An endorsed log sheet will be contained in each kit.
- 1.13 No person under the age of 18 years shall be allowed on the premises after 2315hrs.

Reason: It is considered that the above conditions are necessary in order to ensure that the Licensee takes all steps in their control to limit noise and disturbance to local residents and to prevent the sale of age restricted products to underage customers; and to monitor compliance with the law – Prevention of Public Nuisance Objective; Protection of Children from Harm Objective and Prevention of Crime and Disorder Objective.
