Legal Appraisal

- 4.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- 4.2** The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

- 4.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 4.4 Only “relevant representations” can be taken into account. In order to be “relevant” a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 4.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of Crime and Disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

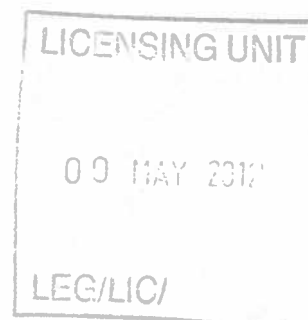
**LATE NIGHT OPENING HOURS LICENSING APPLICATION

I am writing to register my objection to the above application. My reasons for opposing this application are listed below.

1. On occasions there are incidents of late night noise outside Chutneez by persons who are clearly the worse for wear due to alcohol. They have obviously had too much to drink and are not concerned about disturbing local residents. This has occasionally happened as late as 1am.
