1.6 **Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives**

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

When the late licence is used we will employ licensed badged doormen. We will stagger last orders between both bars. CCTV already in operation.

b) Public Safety will be achieved by;

By staggering last orders you don't get everybody leaving the club at once. No big groups of people hanging around.

c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

We will contact the local taxi rank which is next door, to ensure they have taxis available to get people home.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

Children have to leave the main bar by 7pm and 12 midnight in the function room, under 18 have to be supervised by an adult at all times.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

All staff have been trained in the licensing laws. All staff ID people they think are under 21. Usage of plastic bottles when available from supplier. Licensed doormen.

A copy of the Operating Schedule is attached at Appendix 2.

2. Relevant Representations Received

2.1 Interested Parties

Local residents – 2 letters of representation have been received from local residents on the grounds of an anticipated increase in noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and noise and anti social behaviour from patrons using the external areas and leaving the premises late at night. Residents also have concerns regarding litter and glasses left outside the premises.

The letters of representation are attached at Appendix 3.

3. Legal Appraisal

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder

- b) Public safety
- c) The prevention of public nuisance
- d) The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Department of Culture Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" by or expressly on behalf of a defined "interested party" or "responsible authority" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

4. Statement of Policy Issues

- 4.1 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 6 (prevention of Public Nuisance).
- 4.2 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered. Those in Annex A; Annex B; Annex D and Annex E may have conditions that are of particular relevance.

5. Legal Options

- 5.1 Members may:
 - (a) Vary the premises licence as applied for subject to any mandatory conditions and the precautions specified in the operating schedule submitted.
 - (b) Vary the premises licence in whole or in part subject to such additional conditions relating to achievement of the licensing objectives as members think fit; or
 - (c) Refuse to vary the premises licence.
- 5.2 Should the applicant or any other party to the hearing feel aggrieved at any decision with regard to the licence or to any conditions or restrictions attached by Members they may appeal to the Magistrates Court.

6. **Financial and resource appraisal**

6.1 There are no apparent finance or resource implications.

7.1 Equal Rights

There are no apparent equal rights implications.

7.3 **Community safety implications**

There are no apparent community safety implications.

7.4 Human Rights Act

The following rights are applicable:

Article 1 First Protocol to the Convention – Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions subject to the state's right to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest. The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.



APPENDIX 2

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Embedded Conditions

- 3. None of the restrictions on permitted hours prohibit:
 - a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of the sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - c. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - d. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
 - f. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - g. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - h. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with Operating Schedule

All four Licensing Objectives:

4. Staff shall be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to the licensing objectives when they are recruited.

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder:

5. The Licensee will ensure close liaison with other licensees in the area and will cooperate with any local "Pub Watch" schemes or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local Licensees.

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Public Safety:

6. All fire fighting equipment shall be maintained in good working order and all staff (including temporary staff) adequately trained in its use and about the evacuation procedures for the premises.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

- 7. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions near exists reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 8. All outward opening doors and windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place.
- 9. Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.

The Protection of Children from Harm:

- 10. Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult and must vacate the premises by 19.00 hours unless they are attending a private function in the function room.
- 11. No regulated entertainment of an adult or sexual nature shall be provided at any time in the licensed premises.
- 12. All gaming machines must be positioned so that they are within sight of the bar servery.
