## 1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence for the provision of late night refreshment.

## 2. BACKGROUND

### 2.1 The applicant

Mr Wajid Ali. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

### 2.2 The Premises

Tong Fried Chicken, 2 Railway Street, Bierley, Bradford, BD4 6HS.

### 2.3 Designated Premises Supervisor

Not required.

### 2.4 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

- Provision of late night refreshment

Hours of licensable activities:

Monday to Sunday: 23.00 to 02.00

### 2.5 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

- a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

Prevention of crime and disorder adequately covered as there is sufficient lighting both internally and externally whilst the premises are opened for business.

- b) Public safety will be achieved by;

Public safety we have two escape routes already provided with signage and first aid kit displayed and maintained already. Seating arrangements is not required as it is only takeaway provision only.

- c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

We already have a policy to clean the exterior of the property every night before closing. Deliveries are not made as we pick up groceries and take with us at

10.00 am once a day only. A canopy inside the premises with extractor is already fitted and is maintained to the required standard. All other requirements are not applicable to our operation.

- d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

CCTV cameras will be fitted with a recording to standard required by the West Yorkshire.

- e) General – all four licensing objectives

Will be installing CCTV system in consultation with West Yorkshire Police.

## **2.6 Relevant Representations Received**

### **Individual, Body or Business**

A letter of representation has been received on behalf of a local business which raises concerns of anti-social behaviour if the premises closes late at night. A firearms offence has been committed in the area and there is a fear of reprisals being made. Concerns are also raised that a planning restriction would be compromised.

The representation is attached at Appendix 2.

## **3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

### **Legal Appraisal**

- 3.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) the prevention of public nuisance
  - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2** The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3** Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4** Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5** Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and

style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

The Police are treating this incident as a targeted attack (which means there could be serious reprisals until this accepted problem is resolved - A man has been arrested and charged with this shooting as a result.


Refreshment Licence we feel that a cautious approach should be made regarding this application due to the possibility of reprisals being made relative to this shooting which could exacerbate / fuel the ongoing unrest currently occurring on the Holme Wood estate.

We also believe to grant any licence to trade past midnight would severely compromise the decision of its current opening hours made in July 2011 - (via Application No 11/03054/FUL ) and as such should therefore be refused.
