The application is for a variation to licence the external drinking area until 22.00 hours and extend permitted hours for the sale of alcohol on a Friday & Saturday until 01.00 hours.

2.5 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

All staff are trained to inform a supervisor or manager of anything suspicious identified. Drug awareness training has been undertaken by the lessee.

- c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

External areas will only be in use until 10pm at night. All windows remain closed after 22.00 hours. A notice is displayed requesting all patrons leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

- d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

Photographic id/proof of age is required by any patron that looks under the age of 21 before they are able to purchase alcohol.

- e) General – all four licensing objectives

2.6 Relevant Representations Received

Individual, Body or Business

A representation has been received from a local resident which raises concerns of increased noise and disturbance from patrons, if alcohol is to be sold in the external area.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- 3.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm

- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

AUTHORISATION OF PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

IRRESPONSIBLE PROMOTIONS

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to,
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective,
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol

over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective,

d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner,

e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

DRINKING WATER

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

AGE VERIFICATION

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

DRINKS MEASURES

The responsible person must ensure that:

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: half pint
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises, and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

DUTY & TAX

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:

(a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979,

(b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula 'P' equals 'D' plus ('D' times 'V'), where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,

(c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence,

(d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question, and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

FILMS

The Licensee must ensure that any film which has received a Classification Certificate from the British Board of Film Classification is viewed only by persons as specified in the suitability category of this Certificate.

Films which have not received a Classification Certificate from the British Board of Film Classification must not be exhibited (subject to the proviso in Condition 5 below) unless, if taken as a whole, they are exempted works within Section 2 of the Video Recordings Act, 1984 or are:

(a) an event of local interest, or

(b) a programme lawfully recorded for public viewing from a television broadcast exhibited by the television broadcasting authorities,

(c) have been specifically approved by the Licensing Authority in writing.

Notwithstanding the conditions above, a film may be exhibited, or person, or any class of persons, may be admitted thereto if the permission in writing of the Licensing Authority is first obtained and

any conditions of any such permission are complied with.

No advertisement displayed at the premises of a film to be exhibited at the premises shall depict as a scene or incident in the film any scene or incident which is not included in the film as certified by the British Board of Film Classification or approved for exhibition by the Licensing Authority, as the case may be.

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with Operating Schedule

1. Staff shall be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to the licensing objectives when they are recruited.

2. The Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure close liaison with other licensees in the area and will co-operate with any local "Pub Watch" scheme or similar schemes being promoted by West Yorkshire Police or other local Licensees

3. A Notice shall be displayed in a prominent position near the exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

4. All windows are to be kept closed after 22.00 hours.

5. Photographic proof of age will be required to be shown by any customers seeking to purchase alcohol who appear to be under 20 years of age.
