1. SUMMARY

The applications are for the transfer and variation of a premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor.

25. Relevant Representation Received

West Yorkshire Police

On 12 February 2021, the Licensing Authority received a notice under Section 42 (6) and Section 37 (5) of the Licensing Act 2003 from West Yorkshire Police in objection to these applications, including a detailed account of their reasons. These reasons are considered by the Licensing Authority to constitute a valid objection under the Act.

The notice is attached at Appendix 3.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:





- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.
- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 An application for the transfer of an existing premises licence under Section 42 of the Act and an application to vary a premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor under Section 37 of the Act, is normally a straightforward licensing procedure and is dealt with as an administrative matter. As part of the application process, the applicant is required to give notice of the application to the police.
- 3.5 Where a chief officer of police is satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the application would undermine the crime prevention objective, he must serve notice to the Licensing Authority within fourteen days of receiving the application.
- 3.6 When a valid objection is received from the police and the objection has not been withdrawn, the matter must be referred to the Licensing Panel for a hearing to determine the application.
- 3.7 Where an application includes a request that the application shall have immediate effect, the premises licence has effect during the application period as if the licence has been transferred or varied in the manner as set out in the application. The application period begins when the application is received by the Licensing Authority and ends when the application is granted or rejected.
- 3.8 The applicant or the police have a right to appeal to the Magistrates Court if they are aggrieved with the decision of the Licensing Authority. Any such appeal must be lodged within 21 days of the date when the Licensing Authority first made notification of the decision and the application period will continue until determination by that Court.

Statement of Policy Issues

The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder).





4. FINANCIAL & RESOURCE APPRAISAL

A decision made by the Licensing Panel is subject to appeal at the Magistrates Court and/or by way of judicial review. Should the applicant or the police wish to appeal against the decision of the council, the council would incur costs although the court may decide to award costs if the council's decision is upheld.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

AUTHORISATION OF PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

AGE VERIFICATION

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either —

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

DUTY & TAX

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:

- (a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979.
- (b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula 'P' equals 'D' plus ('D' times 'V'), where-
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,
- (c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence.
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence,
- (d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question, and
- (e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Embedded Conditions

The restrictions on permitted hours do not prohibit:

- (a) During the first twenty minutes after permitted hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (b) The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (c) The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club:
- (d) The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under

the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.



I refer to the above applications made by Mr Morad OMER aka Mr Kirmanj SALEH, in respect of the above premises, dated 4TH February 2021 and received by the police on the following date.

Notice is hereby given on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police for Bradford District that the exceptional circumstances of this case are such that they consider that the granting of these applications would undermine the Crime Prevention Licensing Objective.

The basis of this objection is:

On 2nd February 2021, Mr OMER aka SALEH, appeared at Bradford Magistrates Court after 13 summonses were laid against him following a Trading Standards and Police investigation. Seven offences were for trademark offences, four relating to non-compliant packaging of tobacco, one for missing shop signage and lastly one offence for fraudulent trading. The approximate value of the fraud in terms of non-payment of duty was £30,000.

Mr OMER aka SALEH pleaded guilty to all offences and will appear back at Court on 1st April 2021 for sentencing.

The offences laid were as follows:

Arrested on 18/11/19 for the following offences committed on bail:

1. Offer or expose for sale goods bearing false trademarks on 16/10/19 contrary to the Trademarks Act 1994 S.92 (1) (b) + s.92(6)

- 2. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 17/10/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1) © +s.92 (6)
- 3. Produce/supply a tobacco product with unit pack/container not carrying Reg 7 health warnings on 17/10/19 contrary to tobacco and related products regulations 2016 reg.7(1) +reg.48(a) (i) +reg.51
- 4. Possess or supply tobacco product in breach of packaging regulations on 17/10/19 contrary to standardised packaging of tobacco regulations 2015 reg.15
- 5. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 18/11/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1)(c) +s.92 (6)
- 6. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 18/11/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1) (c) +s.92 (6)
- 7. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 18/11/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1) (c) +s.92 (6)
- 8. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 18/11/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1) (c) +s.92 (6)
- 9. Possess goods with false trademark for sale or hire on 18/11/19, contrary to Trademarks Act 1994 s.92(1) (c) +s.92 (6)
- 10. Produce/supply a tobacco product with unit pack/container not carrying Reg 7 health warnings on 18/11/19 contrary to tobacco and related products regulations 2016 reg.7(1) +reg.48(a) (i) +reg.51
- 11. Possess or supply tobacco product in breach of packaging regulations on 16/10/19 contrary to standardised packaging of tobacco regulations 2015 reg.15.
- 12. Fail to display warning statement on 18/11/19 contrary to children and young persons (protection from tobacco) act 1991 s.4
- 13. Participate in fraudulent business carried on by sole trader on 20/08/19 contrary to the Fraud Act 2006 s.9.

Further seizures of illicit tobacco have taken place at the end of January 2021 when Mr OMER aka SALEH has been present, and these have been passed to Trading Standards for further investigation. One of these seizures took place at 97 Great Horton Road on 27th January 2021.

Section 11.27 of the S182 Guidance for the Licensing Act clearly states that "There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:

For the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol

The sale of illicit tobacco may seem a victimless crime, but the impact of tobacco smuggling costs the country over £2 billion in lost revenue each year. It undermines legitimate business and is dominated by internationally organised criminal groups often involved in other crimes such as drug smuggling and people trafficking. The Government continues to take action to reduce smoking and the harm it causes, but illicit tobacco is sold at 'pocket money prices', which encourages children to start smoking and does nothing to dissuade current smokers to quit.


Therefore, Bradford District Police feel that due to the circumstances of the investigation by Trading Standards and the subsequent guilty pleas by Mr OMER aka SALEH, it would be suffice to request that the Licensing Committee refuse all three of these applications under the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.
