Overview & Scrutiny Area: Corporate

1. SUMMARY

The application is for variation to extend permitted hours for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicant

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2.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

- a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

There will be adequate lighting inside and outside the premises. New lighting is also being fitted inside. We have strict No Drugs and drinking in the premises. Anyone seen with drugs will be reported to police.

- b) Public safety will be achieved by;

We have a fire/emergency exit at back of the shop. It is a big front entrance with easy exit in an emergency situation. We check daily for any hazards inside & outside the premises.

- c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

Premises are always kept clean outside. We always have and will continue to make sure there is no excess noise from customers. It is our priority to make sure any noise is kept to a minimum, also restricting music.

- d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

We have a strict age challenge policy to ensure that children can't buy alcohol. We also ensure children don't use adults to buy alcohol.

- e) General – all four licensing objectives

We have installed a brand new 16 channel camera system with a 4TB hard drive to have the ability to record for over a month. Cameras are fitted inside and outside. All staff will be fully trained to detect under age customers and customers over the limit.

2.7 Relevant Representations Received

Responsible Authorities

A representation has been received from Environmental Health which raises concerns of noise from customers loitering, loud speech and people playing loud music in their cars.

The representation is attached at Appendix 3.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm

3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.

3.4 Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.

3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

3.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

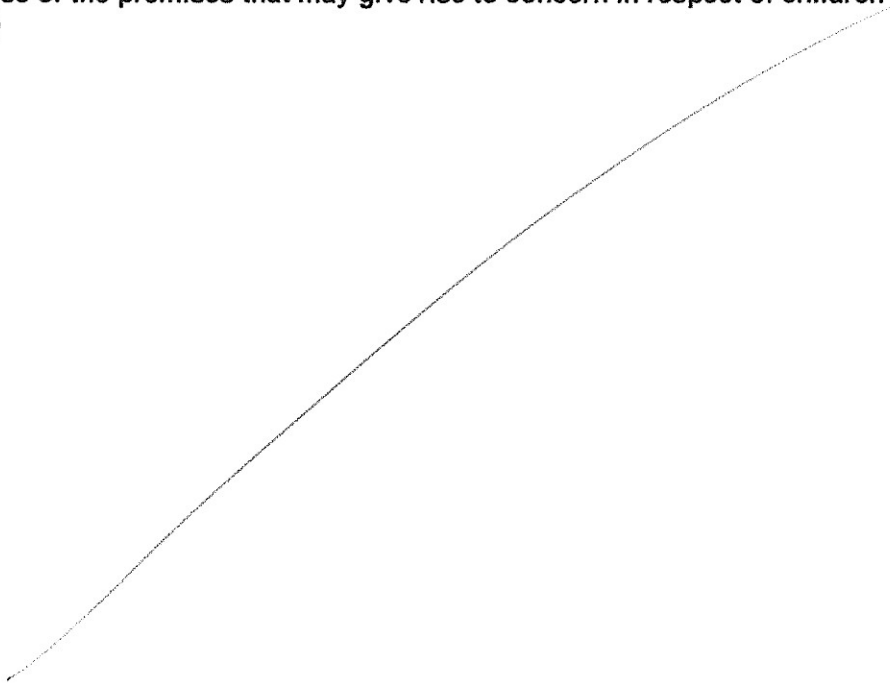

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

AUTHORISATION OF PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

AGE VERIFICATION

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served

alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

DUTY & TAX

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:

(a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979,

(b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula 'P' equals 'D' plus ('D' times 'V'), where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,

(c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence,

(d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question, and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Embedded Conditions

The restrictions on permitted hours do not prohibit:

(a) During the first twenty minutes after permitted hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,

(b) The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or the

despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered,

(c) The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club,

(d) The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the supply or sale of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

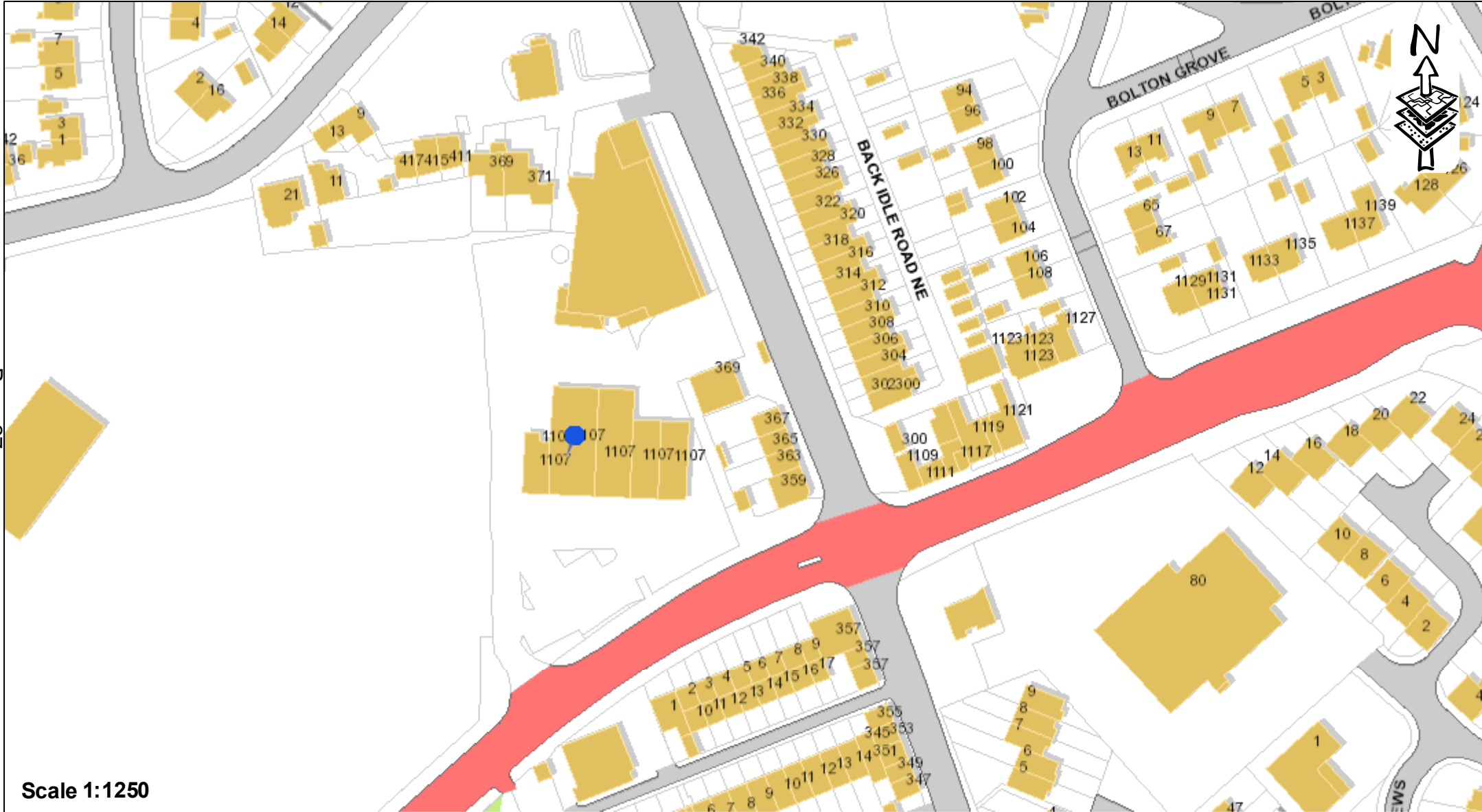
Recently, this Department is in receipt of complaints from around the district where variations / extended operating hours which have been granted are now having an impact on the local residents who reside within close proximity of the premises.
