A. PROCEDURAL ITEMS

1. DISCLOSURES OF INTEREST

(Members Code of Conduct – Part 4A of the Constitution)

3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.

3.4 Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it

must be discounted.

- 3.5** Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

AUTHORISATION OF PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

AGE VERIFICATION

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

DUTY & TAX

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:

(a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979,

(b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula 'P' equals 'D' plus ('D' times 'V'), where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,

(c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence,

(d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question, and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with Operating Schedule

All Four Licensing Objectives

1. Staff shall be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to the licensing objectives.

The Prevention Of Crime And Disorder

2. All external and internal security lighting shall be maintained in good working order and used, where appropriate, at all times the premises remain open to the public.

3. The Premises Licence Holder shall at all times maintain a "zero tolerance" policy with regard to illegal drugs, including appropriate staff training in detection and prevention.

Public Safety

4. A CCTV System shall be installed at the premises, be maintained in good working order and used at all times the premises remain open to the public for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be kept for at least 28 days and available to the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority on request.

The Prevention Of Public Nuisance

5. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the external areas around the perimeter of the premises are kept clear of litter and refuse.

6. A notice shall be displayed in a prominent position near all exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

The Protection Of Children From Harm

7. An appropriate proof of age policy, incorporating the principles of the "Challenge 21" Campaign be implemented; incorporating measures to ensure that any patron wishing to purchase alcohol who may reasonably appear to be under 21 years of age are asked to prove that they are at least 18 years old by displaying evidence of their identity and age in the form of a valid UK passport, new style driving licence displaying their photograph or PASS identification.

As a community of Little Horton Lane we feel we are being let down by The Bradford council licensing team as no consideration is being considered for the 'local community' in regards to businesses being opened 24 hours on this road.

Mr Tango Omar of Top Market Supermarket 534 -538 Little Horton Lane Bradford has put in an application for 24 hours opening 7 days a week for supply of alcohol by retail. We as a community and neighbourhood feel our voice is not being heard enough as we have had problems in the past highlighted to our local councillor Mr Taj Salam which feel like the council has totally disregarded Taj Salam and not looked into it throughly.

If you have a close look into this road you have granted 24 hour license just 200 yards away up the road (24 Hour Market), and now another location which was formerly Khawaja Poultry which is another 200 yards up the road is being seen to open a Euro Supermarket 24 hours. Within 1/5 a miles there will be 2 24 hour shops so is there need for a 3rd shop? i feel where is the rights for the individuals of the area.

Litter is a big problem on Little Horton Lane as a lot of the business are opening at sociable hours and customers are just eating, drinking and dumping which then is getting blown about all over the local area. Photographic evidence of this has been provided to the local councillor previously.

We have had customers from the shop urinating on the side of the shop whilst kids and families are going about on their daily routines, we have had unsoicable drinking outside the shop as well as littering occurring a lot more since the shop has opened.

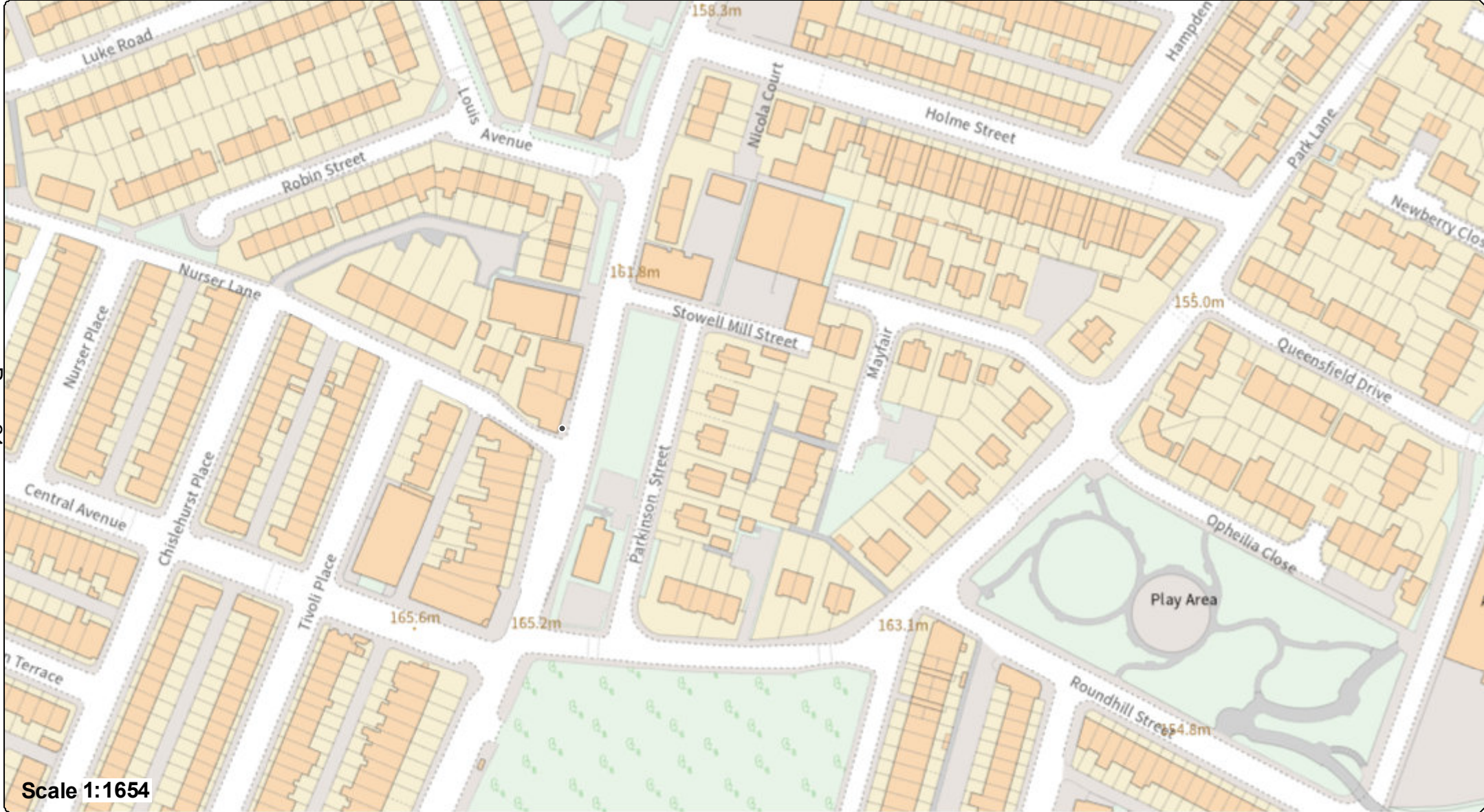
