#### 1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

#### 2.1 The applicant

#### 2.4 Application

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:-

Sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

Monday to Sunday: 00.00 to 23.59

#### 2.5 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by;

The premises shall install and maintain a digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the premises including all entry and exit points. The CCTV camera shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available for minimum 28 days. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present at all times. An incident log shall be kept at the premises for at least six months.

b) Public safety will be achieved by;

We will conduct a suitable Fire Risk Assessment at the premises and implement necessary control measures.

Exit doors are regularly checked to ensure they function satisfactorily.





c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

Notices will be displayed to ask customers to respect the neighbours and leave quietly.

Internal notices will be displayed not to gather outside the premises after 10.00 pm in the night.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that external areas kept clear of litter and refuse.

The external lighting will be placed on system that allows the brightness to be adjusted downwards after 23.00.

d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

Legal notices will be displayed to warn minors ID checks are always used when the age of the customer is in doubt. All staff will be trained in Challenge 25 procedures. Proof of training will be kept on the premises and updated every 6 months. A record of any incidents will be kept on site for inspection.

e) General – all four licensing objectives

The Challenge 25 will be in force.

#### 2.6 Relevant Representations Received

#### Individual, Body or Business

A representation has been received from individuals, who raise concerns of antisocial behaviour, criminal activity, noise and disturbance and the potential negative impact on the quality of life in the area, creating an unsafe environment for the public and neighbourhood.

#### Legal Appraisal

- The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) the prevention of public nuisance
  - d) the protection of children from harm
- 3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.





- 3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.
- 3.4 Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.



To whom it may concern,

This is to register our objection to the application for a premises license at 224 Toller Lane (BD9 5BU). The applicant's name is Akbar Zare.

This opposition is based on the idea that granting a licence for this premises won't promote licensing objectives, especially crime and antisocial behaviour prevention. This is because the premises are located in an area with a high concentration of residential buildings. Granting a licence could disrupt and nuisance the neighbourhood. Furthermore, the premises have been associated with criminal activity.

The high population density and past criminal activity make it likely that approval of the licence would lead to increased noise and other disturbances. This would negatively affect the quality of life in the area. Additionally, granting the licence could potentially facilitate more criminal activity, creating an unsafe environment for the public and neighbourhoods.

Applicant opposes alcohol sales from 00:00 am until 11:59 pm seven days a week. Granting a license would provide an additional source of alcohol in an area already populated with several shops that sell alcohol. This is starting from Haworth Road to Duckworth Lane. There is even a petrol station that sells alcohol.

The drug dealing and antisocial behaviour in my neighbourhood have made me contact the police several times, so having a license to sell alcohol in such an area will not make things any easier. Allowing alcohol sales in this area will only increase crime and violence. It will also encourage people to drink more, which could lead to an increase in drink driving and other forms of alcohol-related harm.

My husband works nights, so I live alone with my children at night, so having alcohol sold literally next door will not make things easier for me as a mother of two under ten. I worry that alcohol availability will increase crime risk in the area, especially if people are under the influence. I also worry about the effect it may have on my children if they are exposed to alcohol at such a young age.

I am concerned that the presence of an alcohol store will create an environment that could be dangerous for my children, and it could also influence them to have a more lax attitude towards drinking. Additionally, the presence of alcohol near my home could attract people who are looking to party or get drunk, potentially leading to increased noise, vandalism, and other crimes.

In view of the above,i would urge the licensing Authority to refuse the application.
