1. SUMMARY

The application is for the grant of a premises licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises and the provision of regulated entertainment indoors.

The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence. The operating schedule describes the following as the relevant licensable activities applied for:

- Sale of alcohol
- Provision of regulated entertainment

2.5 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

a) Prevention of crime and disorder will be achieved by:

The provision of adequate lighting – already met.

b) Public safety will be achieved by:

Emergency lighting – already met.
Escape route – already met.
First Aid provision – already met.
Seating/no. of attendants – already set up.

- c) Prevention of public nuisance will be achieved by;

Keeping music to a reasonable level.
Not using external areas after a certain time.
Notices asking patrons to leave quietly.

- d) Protection of children from harm will be achieved by;

Proof of age scheme – Challenge 21.

- e) General – all four licensing objectives

Having personal licence holder on premises at all times the premises is being used.
Staff training on licensing issues.
CCTV already installed.

2.6 Relevant Representations Received

Individual, Body or Business

A representation has been received from a local resident who raises concerns of noise, alcohol-fuelled disturbances and public nuisance if the premises are open until 23.00 hours in a residential area.

The representation is attached at Appendix 2.

The provisions in the Business and Planning Act 2020 temporarily modify the Licensing Act 2003 to provide an automatic extension to the terms of most premises licences which only permit the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises to allow the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises until 31 March 2025.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

- 3.1** The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm

- 3.2** The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

- 3.3** Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying

this must be given that can be sustained.

- 3.4 Only “relevant representations” can be taken into account. In order to be “relevant” a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.
- 3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

- 3.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of public nuisance).
- 3.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

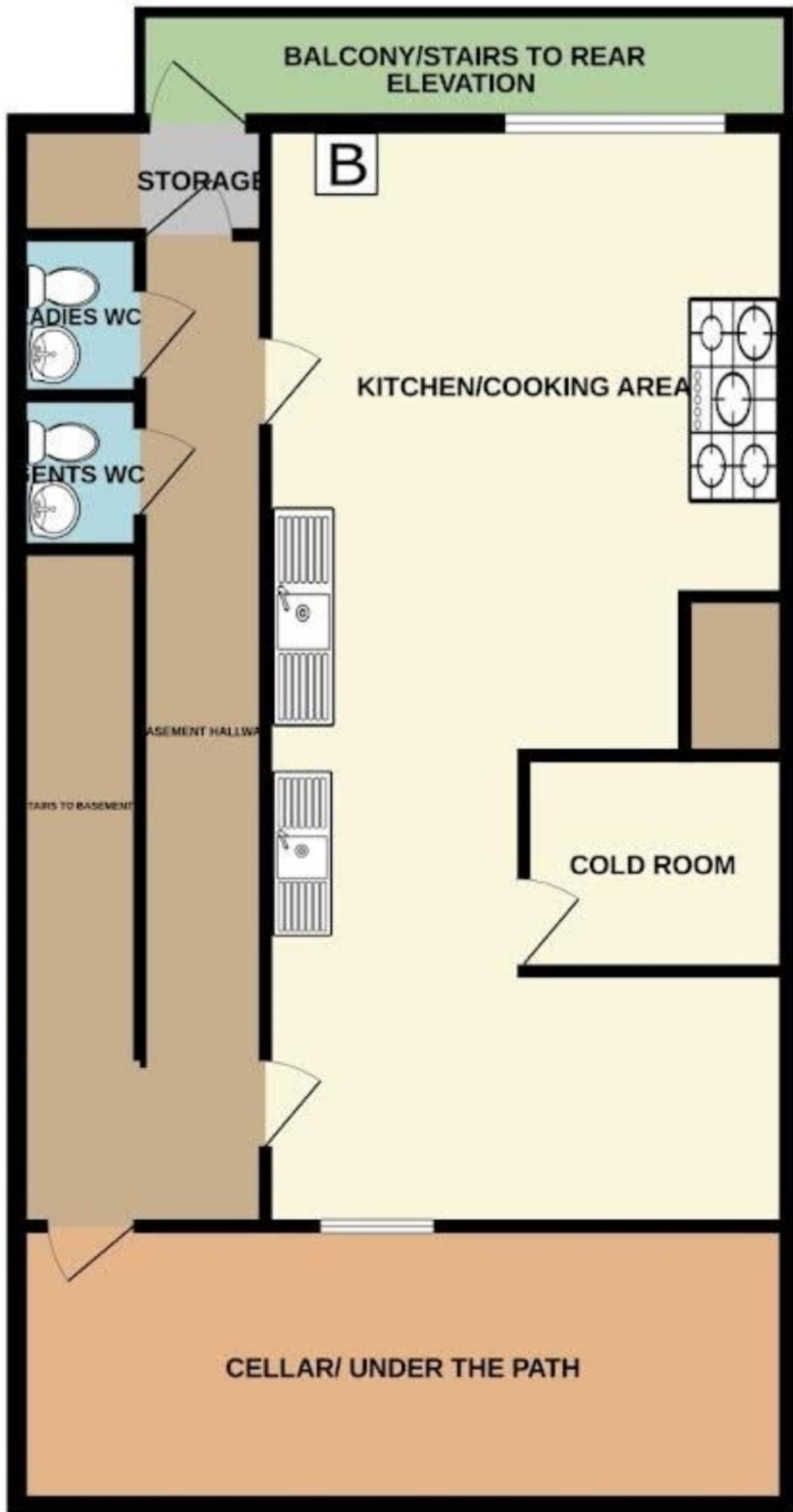

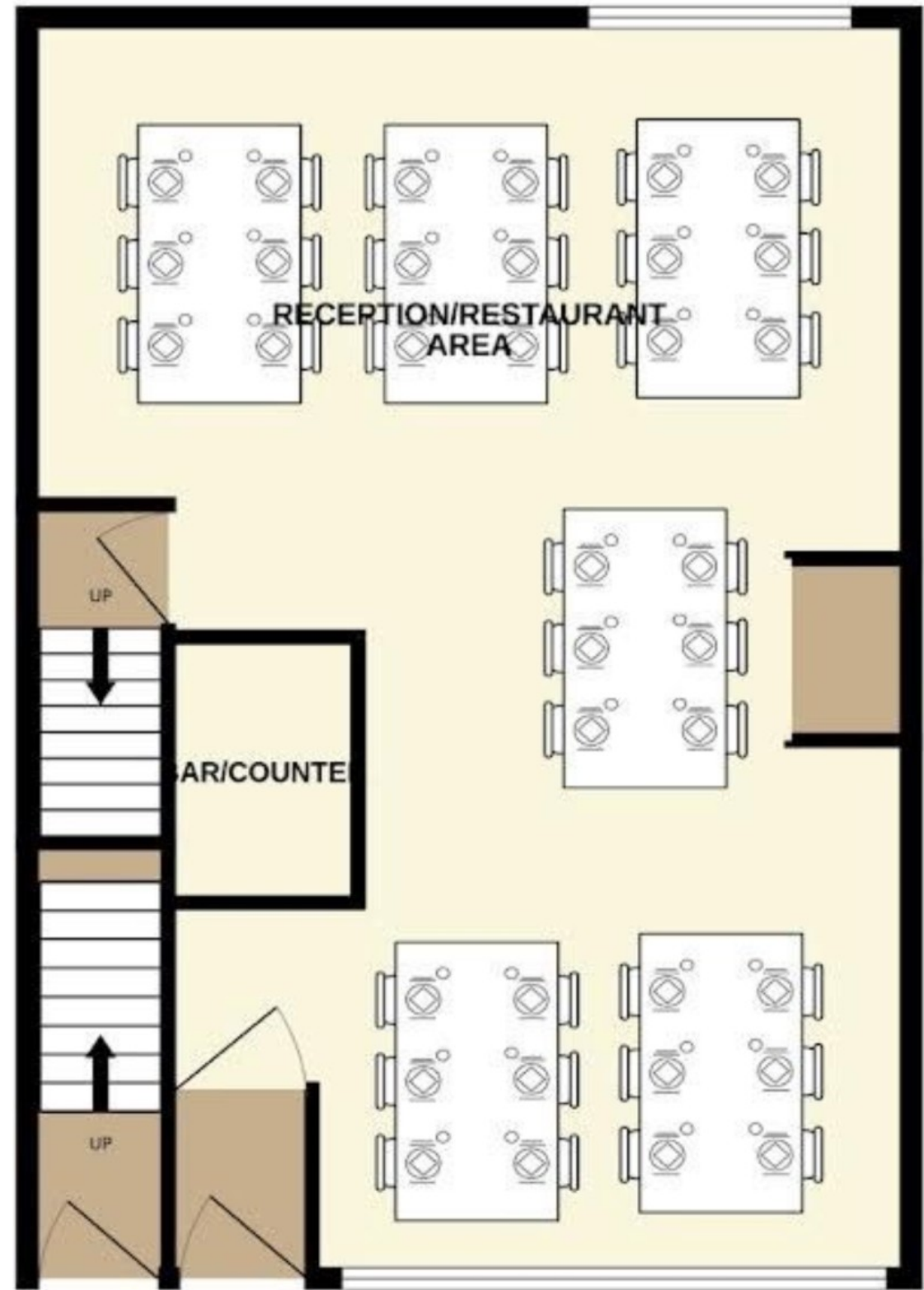

I would like to express my concerns with regards to the Application for Grant as a Premises Licence to sell on and off licence alcohol made by Kashmiri aroma Haworth Ltd. 51 Mill Hey Haworth BD22 8NA.

The restaurant is asking for a on and off licence and, as the establishment is a restaurant, I wonder why they are wanting to sell off licence alcohol.

The hours of being able to serve alcohol are proposed as Mon to Sat 17:00 - 23:00 and Sunday 12:00 to 23:00. 23:00 is too late for residential housing and people living adjacent to and in very close proximity to the restaurant who have to be up for work very early the next day and be possibly kept awake by alcohol-fuelled disturbances and behaviour creating a public nuisance to the area.

The restaurant is situated in a quiet residential area of Mill Hey and River Street. The kitchen and dining areas back onto and are adjacent to residential properties on River Street.

Further down Mill Hey, in the opposite direction to the Kashmiri Aroma, there are already four extremely busy drinking places; Mill Hey Brewery, Barista, The Conservative Club and The Treehouse. Kashmiri Aroma selling alcohol could possibly bring people to this area of Mill Hey to get more alcohol that would not necessarily have come into the area.

I would be extremely grateful if you could take my concerns into consideration when making your decision on the Premises Licence application.
