- 1. A CCTV system will be in operation at the premises and recorded images shall be retained for a period of 31 days. CCTV images will be provided to the police and other responsible authorities as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours of a request for such images, subject of the provisions of the DPA.
- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. The premises licence holder will ensure close liaison with other premises licence holders in the area and will cooperate with the local Pubwatch scheme.
- 3. All staff making sales of alcohol at the premises will be trained in their responsibilities when making sales of alcohol. The training will include how to deal with people who may be drunk and how to handle conflict situations.
- 4. The premises licence holder will operate a Zero Tolerance drugs policy.
- 5. A minimum of 2 SIA register doorstaff will be employed at the premises for the first 100 persons and an additional 1 doorstaff for every 50 people thereafter.
- 6. Doorstaff will wear bodycams when employed when employed to supervise licensable activities at the premises.
- c) Public safety
- 7. An incident register will be maintained at the premises and made available to the authorities on request.
- 8. Notices will be on displayed in a prominent positions near exits reminding patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 9. A first aider and the appropriate number of fist aid kits will be on the premises at all times while licensable activities take place at the premises.
- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 10. The premises licence holder will ensure the external areas of the premises are kept clear of litter and refuse.
- e) The protection of children from harm
- 11. The premises will adopt a 'Challenge 25' policy. This means that if a customer purchasing alcohol appears to be under the age of 25 they will be asked for proof of their age, to prove that they are 18 years or older.
- 12. The only forms of identification that will be accepted at the premises are a passport, UK photo-card driving licences, & cards bearing the 'PASS' hologram.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
 licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.


