1. SUMMARY

The application is for the variation of a premises licence to include the external areas for the sale of alcohol from the hours of 11.00 to 23.00 for the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of the 'Chapel Fest' event, include the external areas for regulated entertainment from the hours of 11.00 to 20.00 for the Saturday and Sunday of the 'Chapel Fest' event and amend the following condition from;

No amplified sound, including music to be played or projected outside the premises to

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The applicant

Greene King Brewing & Retailing Limited. A copy of the application is included at Appendix 1.

2.2 The Premises

Chapel House, Park House Road, Bradford, BD12 0HP.

2.3 Designated Premises Supervisor

Ms Amy Walsh.

2.4 Current Licence

The premises currently hold a Premises Licence with the following permitted hours;

Sale/Supply of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday: 11.00 to 23.00

Friday & Saturday: 11.00 to 00.00

Christmas Eve/Christmas Day/Boxing Day/New Years Day/St George's Day/St Patrick's Day – A further additional hours to those stated above.

New Years Eve: 10.00 until the start of permitted hours the following day.

A further additional hour into the morning following on the Monday of every statutory Easter, Spring & August Bank Holiday weekends, Good Friday, the Saturday prior

to Easter Bank Holiday weekend and Easter Sunday.

An Exhibition of a Film (indoors)

Monday to Sunday: 08.00 to 23.00

A Performance of Live Music (indoors) & Any Playing of Recorded Music (indoors)

Monday to Sunday: 18.00 to 23.00

Christmas Eve/Christmas Day/Boxing Day/New Years Day/St George's Day/St Patrick's Day – A further additional hours to those stated above.

A further additional hour into the morning following on the Monday of every statutory Easter, Spring & August Bank Holiday weekends, Good Friday, the Saturday prior to Easter Bank Holiday weekend and Easter Sunday.

A copy of the premises licence is included at Appendix 2.

2.5 Application

The application is for the variation of a premises licence to include the external areas for the sale of alcohol from the hours of 11.00 to 23.00 for the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of the 'Chapel Fest' event, include the external areas for regulated entertainment from the hours of 11.00 to 20.00 for the Saturday and Sunday of the 'Chapel Fest' event and amend the following condition from;

No amplified sound, including music to be played or projected outside the premises
to

No amplified sound, including music is to be played or projected outside the premises with the exception of the Saturday and Sunday of the 'Chapel Fest' event.

2.6 Steps proposed by the applicant to address the Licensing Objectives

No additional steps to the current licence conditions specified.

2.7 Relevant Representations Received

Individual, Body or Business

Three representations have been received from Ward Councillors which raise concerns of noise and disturbance from regulated entertainment and patrons at the premises, with crowds of people blocking the road and inconsiderate parking. Concerns are also raised regarding anti-social behaviour taking place in the nearby Church grounds.

The representations are attached at Appendix 3.

3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Legal Appraisal

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four licensing objectives:

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder
- b) public safety
- c) the prevention of public nuisance
- d) the protection of children from harm

3.2 The Council must also have regard to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regard must also be taken of the Council's statement of Licensing Policy for the District.

3.3 Where it is decided it is necessary to depart from the statutory guidance or the Licensing Policy on the merits of a particular case; then special reasons justifying this must be given that can be sustained.

3.4 Only "relevant representations" can be taken into account. In order to be "relevant" a representation must fairly relate to achieving a licensing objective. If it does not, it must be discounted.

3.5 Any licensing conditions that Members may propose attaching must also relate to achieving one of the licensing objectives; be tailored to the actual premises and style of licensable activity; must be reasonably achievable by the applicant and in his/her control.

Statement of Policy Issues

3.6 The following parts of the Licensing Policy are of particular importance; Part 4 (prevention of crime and disorder) and Part 6 (prevention of public nuisance).

3.7 The Annexes to the Policy sets out various types of model condition that could be considered.

The Council's powers set out in the recommendations fall within the states right. A fair balance must be struck between public safety and the applicant's rights.

Article 6 – A procedural right to a fair hearing. As refusal of the application is an option, adherence to the Panels' usual procedure of affording a hearing to the applicant is very important. The applicant should also be able to examine the requirements of the fire authority. If the decision is to refuse then reasons should be given.
