DRINKING IN PUBLIC PLACES DESIGNATION ORDER NO 1
EXTENSION OF AREAS WITHIN BRADFORD CITY CENTRE

The City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council made the Drinking in Designated Public Places Order No 1 Extension of Areas Within Bradford City Centre on 10th September 2003.

The Council designated an area of land in Bradford City Centre bounded by (and including):

An area of land bounded by (and including): Manor Row (from Rawson Square), Cheapside (until Kirkgate), Kirkgate, Westgate (until John Street), John Street, and Rawson Square, and which also includes Duke Street, Dale Street, Commerce Street, Piccadilly, Darley Street, Godwin Street (from Westgate to Duke Street), James Gate, James Street, Rawson Place, James Street Market, Kirkgate Centre and Kirkgate Market. A second area of land bounded by (and including): Broadway (from Sunbridge Street North), Cheapside (between Broadway and Forster Square), Forster Square, Church Bank, Vicar Lane, Leeds Road (between Vicar Lane and Hall Ings), Hall Ings (until Bridge Street), and Bridge Street (between Hall Ings and Broadway), and which also includes Bank Street (between Broadway and Hall Ings), Charles Street (between Broadway and Hall Ings), Currer Street, Field Street, Well Street, Petergate, and Eastbrook Well, and another area of land bounded by (and including): Channing Way, Market Street, Godwin Street (from Market Street), Morley Street (until Edmund Street), Edmund Street, Senior Way, Manchester Road (from Junction Senior Way/Croft Street), and Hall Ings (until Channing Way), and which also includes Princes Way, Little Horton Lane, Pictureville, Glydegate, Chester Street, Wilton Street, William Street, Burrow Street, Sharpe Street, and the Tyrls and Courts and the forecourt areas. The Designation Order does not include licensed premises situated in the area described and shown on the plan which are either licensed at the date this Order takes effect or are licensed after that date.

Copies of the plan, which indicates the area affected by the Designation Order may be inspected, free of charge, at City Hall, Bradford, BD1 1HY, between the hours of 8.15 am and 5.15 pm, Monday to Thursday, and 8.15 am and 4.45 pm on Friday.

The effect of this Order is to make it an offence if any person fails, without reasonable excuse, to comply with a constable's requirements:-

- (a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, alcohol;
- (b) to surrender anything in the possession of that person which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, alcohol or a container for alcohol.

A constable who imposes a requirement on a person shall inform the person concerned that failing without reasonable excuse to comply with the requirement is an offence.

The maximum penalty upon conviction for any offence is £500.00 (level 2 on the standard scale).

The City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council Drinking in Designated Public Places Order Number 1 Extension of Areas Within Bradford Town Centre came into effect on 12th September 2003.

**DRINKING IN PUBLIC PLACES DESIGNATION ORDER N01 EXTENSION
OF AREAS WITHIN BRADFORD CITY CENTRE**

The City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council (in this Order called "the Council") makes the following Order:-

1. The land described in the Schedule below and shown outlined in blue on the plan attached to this Order, being a public place in the area of the Council to which the provisions of Sections 12 to 16 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 apply, is hereby designated for the purposes of that Act.
2. The effect of this Order is to make it an offence if any person fails, without reasonable excuse, to comply with a constable's requirements:-
 - (a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, alcohol;
 - (b) to surrender anything in the possession of that person which is or which the constable reasonably believes to be, alcohol or a container for alcohol.

A constable who imposes a requirement on a person shall inform the person concerned that failing without reasonable excuse to comply with the requirement is an offence.

The maximum penalty upon conviction for any offence is £500.00 (level 2 on the standard scale).

3. This order may be cited as the City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council Drinking in Designated Public Places Order No. 1 Extension of Areas within Bradford City Centre and came into effect on 12th September 2003.
