

# Proposals for Increasing Specialist Provision for Children and Young People with Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

Proposed Redistribution and development of Early Years Enhanced Specialist Provision (EYESP) places at Abbey Green and Midland Road Nursery Schools

# **Pre-Consultation**

## **Background information**

The Bradford District has experienced a significant increase in demand for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) provision in the last 10 years. It is projected that the demand for SEND provision will continue to grow across all sectors in the Bradford District.

Bradford has experienced a year on year increase of children and young people requiring an Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP). Currently the Local Authority is maintaining 3860 Educational Health and Care Plans. There are also14, 570 (13.8%) children and young people who receive SEN Support, compared to the national average of 11.8%.

Evidence shows there continues to be an increased demand for specialist places across all sectors.

In order to meet the growing demand for places we analyse the data by primary need. The order below represents the largest number of pupils with a current EHCP by primary need:

- 1. Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- 2. Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs (SEMH)
- 3. Severe Learning Difficulty (SLD)
- 4. Speech Language and Communication Needs (SLCN)
- 5. Physical Difficulties (PD)

Bradford offers a range of educational provision to meet the needs of Children and Young People with Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND). This includes provision in both Local Authority Maintained Schools and Academy schools including:

- Mainstream Schools
- Special Schools
- Resourced Provision led by the school (SRP) (Formerly known as Designated Specialist Provision – DSP)
- Resourced Provision led by the Local Authority (LARP)
- Additionally Resourced Centres led by the Local Authority (ARC)
- Early Years Enhanced Specialist provision (EYESP) led by Nursery Schools
- Pupil Referral Units (PRUs)

#### Early Years Enhanced Specialist Provision (EYESP)

Currently the Local Authority maintains four Nursery Schools across the District which deliver integrated early years enhanced specialist provision for Children aged 2 - 5 years alongside mainstream Nursery Schools places.

The children that access these provisions have an Education Health and Care Plan or are undergoing assessment for an Education Health and Care Plan.

The current maintained Nursery Schools with Early Years Enhanced Specialist Provision are:

- Abbey Green Nursery School (BD8)
- Strong Close Nursery School (BD21)
- St. Edmunds Nursery School (BD8)
- Canterbury Nursery School (BD5)

## What are we proposing and where?

The Local Authority is proposing to redistribute Early Years Enhanced Specialist Provision (EYESP) places with effect from February 2020 by:

- Reducing the current number of EYESP places at Abbey Green Nursery School from 20\* to 10 places
- Developing 10 new EYESP places at Midland Road Nursery School.

#### \* Part time places.

Since the opening of the 20\* place Early Years Enhanced Specialist Provision (EYESP) for children aged 2 – 5 years with a range of special educational needs and disabilities at Abbey Green Nursery School, the setting has run with an under occupancy.

Abbey Green Nursery School is part of a federation with Midland Road Nursery School and has an Executive Head who overseas both provisions. It has been identified that it would be beneficial to the children and parents in the area, if both Nursery Schools delivered EYESP places.

# Why are we undertaking a Pre- consultation?

Before the Local Authority can increase or make changes to provision in maintained schools, there is a statutory process that we must follow. Whenever the Local Authority proposes to increase places or make changes to specialist provision, all interested parties who are likely to be affected by the Councils proposals must be consulted in the development of the proposals. Good practice also allows time for a pre-consultation to take place.

The pre-consultation phase is so we can ascertain interested parties views on the proposals and use the feedback to shape the proposals going forward for Statutory consultation. This process will be carried out from  $5^{\text{th}}$  November –  $18^{\text{th}}$  November 2019.

## When are we proposing to increase provision?

An indicative timeline for completing the consultation and statutory processes is set out below:

### Why are we consulting with you?

Whenever the Local Authority propose to increase places or make changes to specialist provision, all interested parties who are likely to be affected by the proposals must be consulted in the development of the proposals.

It is important that the proposals are the subject of broad consultation with all interested parties to ensure that your views are considered and that you are fully informed and involved before a final recommendation to the Council Executive Committee is made.

The responses to this consultation for maintained schools must be fully analysed and considered before the Council decides to proceed with a full consultation and issue Statutory notices.
