Subject: Speed humps on Caroline Street

I would like to object to the proposal to put speed humps on Caroline Street in Saltaire. Evidence shows that pollution increases when vehicles drive over speed humps or speed cushions. This is completely unacceptable especially as much of the traffic drives past the playground on Baker Street when it is busy with local children and their carers. Wycliffe school is nearby too. We need to stop the short-cut altogether. Speed bumps do not deter the larger vehicles many of which are trade type vans and most are diesel; the worst polluting engine type. The whole Shipley area needs a comprehensive and joined up approach to slowing traffic by using speed cameras on the main roads and by reducing the number of alternate routes for all through traffic. Much of the traffic cutting through the village is caused by parents driving their kids to and from local schools as well as delivery drivers and tradespeople. As I write it is half term and the street is noticeably quiet. Please rethink the proposal to put in speed humps if Bradford Council is serious about cutting pollution.
