#### 1. SUMMARY

1.1 This report considers objections to recently advertised proposals for traffic regulation ordes around the Parry Lane area, Bradford

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The West Yorkshire Combined Authority (WYCA) has attained planning approval for a new access road to enable development of the Parry Lane Enterprise Zone, and have funded the the works undertaken for the associated highway improvements at Parry Lane and at the junction of Sticker Lane / Broad Lane.
- 2.2 In order to facilitate safe vehicular and pedestrian movements, a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) was proposed to introduce No Waiting At Any Time restrictions on lengths of Parry Lane, Sticker Lane and the 'new access road' (which is an extension of the existing Lower Lane) constructed between Parry lane and Sticker Lane. A Yellow Box was introduced at the junctions of Sticker Lane/Broad Lane and Sticker Lane and the 'new access road' to prevent obstruction for turning vehicles.
- 2.3 A moving traffic order was also introduced to facilitate one-way traffic flow on Parry Lane between its junction from Sticker lane to its junction with Lower Lane, in a westerly direction, banned right turns in to and out of the new access road and Sticker Lane junction. In addition, there was a proposal for a short length of bus lane introduced on Broad Lane, with a prohibited right turn other than for buses and cyclists.
- 2.4 The TRO works forms part of the improvements works on Parry Lane to facilitate the new development. Approval to prepare and advertise the Orders was granted by the Strategic Director of Place on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2022.
- 2.5 The proposals are shown on drawing no. HS/TRSS/105233/CON-1D, attached as Appendix 1.
- 2.6 The proposals were advertised between 12<sup>th</sup> January 2023 to 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2023. This resulted in one objection.
- 2.7 A summary of the objection and corresponding officer comments is tabulated below:

Some of the works that have already been carried out I have been told by the council are illegal as they do not have the planning permission for this as yet.

This Fish and chip shop has been there for 70+ years and has complied with the road traffic act 1984 all along so why are these changes being implemented now? other footway users, they would also cause damage to the kerbs and footpath. The West Yorkshire Combined Authority had conducted its own consultation with residents and business owners regarding the changes and improvements around the Parry Lane area. As part of this consultation there was an agreement to mitigate any I loss of parking at the frontages, of the row of businesses located at No's 228 to 234, by constructing a new car park at the back of the premises. The scheme should help the flow of traffic around this busy junction increasing safety for all users.

The new car park is conveniently located.

#### 3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

3.1 Local ward members and the emergency services have been consulted on the proposals. No adverse comments have been received.

#### 4. FINANCIAL & RESOURCE APPRAISAL

4.1 The estimated cost of the proposals is £15,000. These works will be match funded through WYCA and Bradford Council's Development team..

#### 5. RISK MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE ISSUES

5.1 A failure to implement the Traffic Regulation and Movement Orders would result in the unsafe traffic manoeuvres and parking in the area.
