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SUMMARY

The report sets out an overview of the governance arrangements for Bradford Children & Families Trust, outlining the Board and Executive Leadership Team, reporting arrangements to the Council and DfE as well as the risk, audit and assurance arrangements. 2. BACKGROUND

- Establishment of Bradford Children & Families Trust was announced by then Education Secretary Nadhim Zahawi on 25th January 2022, following a review by the Children's Commissioner which took place between September 2021 and January 2022.
- This decision was based on work of the Commissioner and the Improvement Adviser who chaired the Improvement Board to oversee progress in children's social care since services were rated as inadequate in 2018. The Commissioner's report and recommendations also brought through recognition from the Ofsted monitoring and focused visits, DfE reviews and the Improvement Board that the pace of progress was not sufficient and that there was a lack of impact on improved outcomes for children.
- The Trust went live on 1st April 2023 to provide children's social care and early help services for the council. Following this, service level agreements have been negotiated with the council, new governance and reporting arrangements have been embedded, auditors have been commissioned and an enhanced risk management approach has been adopted and is being embedded. These are all part of the Trust's operating approach and in line with the Articles of Association establishing the Trust and the Service Delivery Contract between the Council and the Trust.
