#### 1. SUMMARY

1.1 This report provides a further update of Street Cleansing services in Bradford East in 2015 and provides current financial and staffing information.

### 2. BACKGROUND

2.1 This report provides an update on the operation and performance of the Street Cleansing Service.

#### 2.2 **Performance**

- 2.2.1 The service conducts regular surveys of each Ward to establish a local snapshot of environmental indicators for performance management purposes. The grading methodology is derived from the former Best Value National Performance Indicator NI 195 indicator and the sample selection process has been adapted to specifically suit Ward based surveying.
- 2.2.2 In each Ward approximately six to eight priority streets are graded every month. These are areas of high pedestrian footfall, main roads or retail areas. In addition the monitoring officer will select a further seven to nine streets to include in the survey.
- 2.2.3 Grades for litter, detritus, graffiti, fly posting and weeds are awarded as follows:
  - A None present
  - B+ Almost clear
  - B Some present but not below acceptable standard
  - B- Part of street falls below an acceptable standard (half-fail)
  - C Street falls below acceptable standard
  - C- Very poor condition
  - D Street is completely affected
- 2.2.4 Appendix 1 shows the performance in terms of measured cleanliness with regards to litter, detritus, graffiti and fly posting from 2011 to 2015.
- 2.2.5 These indicators give an overall picture of the cleanliness of the Ward and serve as early warning signs for specific problems. They can also provide the information needed to move resources in order to target problematic areas.
- 2.2.6 In terms of litter the figures show a slight change in the number of litter fails overall from 17.6% to 18.6%. However, of note some wards have shown an increase in fails (Bradford Moor, Little Horton and Eccleshill), whist Idle & Thackley, Bolton & Undercliffe and Bowling & Barkerend have shown improvements.
- 2.2.7 Detritus has shown an overall increase in the area from 7.1% to 9.0%. Of note Bolton & Undercliffe has seen a sharp increase from 4.0% to 9.1% and Eccleshill from 7.3% to 9.0%.
- 2.2.8 Graffiti has risen sharply in the area from 1.4% to 8.3% with increases in all wards with the exception of Bolton & Undercliffe and Fly posting also has risen from 0.1% to 5.5%.

# 2.3 Reports of Cleansing complaints. Appendix 2

- 2.3.1 Reports to the call centre for 2014/2015 to the previous year show mixed results with Bolton & Undercliffe, Eccleshill and Idle & Thackley showing slightly decreased calls whilst Bowling & Barkerend, Bradford Moor and Little Horton show increases in calls to the contact centre.
- 2.3.2 Fly tipping calls show a slight increase in Bolton & Undercliffe, Bowling & Barkerend, Eccleshill and Bradford Moor whilst Idle & Thackley and Little Horton show slight decreases in calls to the Contact Centre.

#### 3. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 Recently the roles of the Street Cleansing Managers and Warden Managers across the district have amalgamated to ensure closer working arrangements and relationships between the street cleansing and warden operations.
- 3.2 The service is currently developing new routes for the mechanical sweeping service with the intention of providing up to date routes based on frequency of clean. It will be the intention to provide a timetable of cleaning on the Council's app so that the public can see when streets will be swept. It is hoped to have new routes by December 2015.

#### 4. FINANCIAL & RESOURCE APPRAISAL

4.1 The budget and staffing resources for Street Cleansing in Bradford East is provided from within the existing resources of Neighbourhood Service and Customer Services (see Appendix 3).

#### 5. RISK MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE ISSUES

5.1 There are no significant risks arising out of the proposed recommendations in this report.






