## **Educational Outcomes for Looked After Children**

## Summary statement:

This report provides summary attainment data for Looked After pupils for the academic year 2014/2015 including a breakdown in respect of ethnicity and location to constituency level.

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#### 1. SUMMARY

This report provides summary attainment data for Looked After pupils for the academic year 2014/2015 including a breakdown in respect of ethnicity and location to constituency level.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 This data is as held by Bradford in October 2015.
- 2.2 The Department for Education (DfE) will report the outcomes of Looked After Children who had been in care a year or more on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015 (cohort), in December 2015.
- 2.3 The figures in this report are based on the results collected directly from schools by the Virtual School and will differ slightly from those released by the DfE (Department for Education). DfE figures include, for example, the voluntary participation of some independent schools.
- 2.4 The Government continues to give priority to supporting Looked After Children (LAC). The duty on Local Authorities to promote the achievement of Looked After children remains in place.
- 2.5 The Pupil Premium (PP) was introduced on 1 April 2011 to support vulnerable pupils, including Looked After Children (LAC). The Pupil Premium is paid at different levels: £1300 for primary age pupils eligible for free school meals, £935 for secondary aged pupils and £1900 for LAC. Pupil Premium for LAC is referred to as Pupil Premium Plus (PPP) in this report.
- 2.6 The Local Authority is responsible for paying Pupil Premium Plus (PPP) to all Bradford schools, including Academies, and also to schools outside the authority that have Bradford LAC on roll. The Virtual School Headteacher is accountable to the Assistant Director for Access and Inclusion for monitoring the impact of the grant.
- 2.7 From April 2014, maintained schools and non-maintained special schools also attracted Pupil Premium Plus (PPP) for children adopted from care, that left care under a Special Guardianship Order or left care under a Residential Order on or after 14 October 1991.
- 2.8 Financial support of £1,000, drawn from the Bradford Deprivation Fund, continues to be given for Looked After Children (LAC) in maintained and voluntary nurseries.
- 2.9 Schools submitted attainment data at the end of each term for each pupil until September 2015. This allowed comparison between expected and actual progress and a judgment about the impact of Pupil Premium Plus (PPP). The removal of levels of progress has resulted in new and diverse systems being employed by schools to track progress. The Virtual School is currently consulting on how this can be recorded centrally by the Virtual School for monitoring purposes.
- 2.10 The breakdown of data by constituency boundaries has been provided in response to a request from Councillors on 4th March 2015.

- 2.11 The provision of data at constituency level allows Councillors to gauge the relative strengths of each area and see where looked after children are studying.
- 2.12 Data will be significantly influenced by the location of children's homes within the District.
