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Subject:

School Capital Funding Announcement and School Expansion Programme 2016-2017

Summary statement:

This report details the recent school funding announcements from the Education Funding Agency (EFA) and also details the school expansion projects the Authority is currently undertaking.

#### 1. SUMMARY

1.1 This report details the recent school funding announcements from the Education Funding Agency (EFA) and also details the school expansion projects the Authority is currently undertaking.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.2 Schools Capital Maintenance Grant and Devolved Formula Capital allocations were announced by the EFA on the 12th February 2016 for all Authorities. These allocations were both stated as being provisional.
- 2.1 On the 18<sup>th</sup> March the EFA announced the level of Basic Need funding allocated for Bradford in 2018-2019. Basic Need funding is the money the EFA allocates to Local Authorities to use for School expansion projects so the Authority can fulfill its duty to make sure there are enough school places for children in the local area.

#### 3. FINANCIAL & RESOURCE APPRAISAL

#### 3.1.1 Schools Capital Maintenance Grant Allocations

3.2 Since 2008 the Schools Capital Maintenance Grant (CMG) made to the Authority has been as follows:

3.3 The Schools Capital Maintenance Grant is stated to be provisional and will be fully ratified by the EFA after March 2016. It has also been stated that the allocations for 2017-18 are expected to be set at the same level subject to adjustment for Schools which become Academies. Whilst the allocation for 2016 -17 is currently stated to be provisional the Authority's Building & Technical Services Team have been asked to identify the next batch of school building improvement projects which the money can be allocated to and provisionally 34 projects have been identified which include new boilers, roof renewals and re-wires.





### 3.4 School Devolved Formula Capital (DFC)

3.4.1 In addition to the Schools Capital Maintenance Grant, Schools also receive a DFC allocation. This money is allocated to the Authority who pass the amounts on to individual Schools once they put forward an appropriate maintenance/improvement project.

As previously reported Bradford Forster Secondary Academy and Idle were in excess of £2million in value. Of the remaining schemes Barkerend will exceed £2million in value.

For some schemes whilst the individual stages of expansion will be less than £2million over a number of stages the total cost may be in excess of this. Both Eldwick and St James have cost over £2million.
