I have endeavoured to be accessible to local residents and to note local concerns on various issues. I achieved this by identifying/introducing myself and working with grassroots organisations wherever possible and working in partnership with schools such as:

Frizinghall Community Organisation Upper Heaton Working Together Group Frizinghall Partnership Heaton Together Association Frizinghall Primary School St Bede's Upper School St Barnabas Primary School

Belle Vue Boys' School to get a better understanding of local needs and how I can best meet them as their representative.

Held weekly surgeries alternatively at St Martin's Church and St Margaret's Church over the last year to make myself accessible to local residents to which I have had a positive response to.

I have made my contact details available to as many residents as possible by posting surgeries leaflets through letter boxes.

I have responded to any enquiries or grievances residents have brought up with me.

Liaised closely with Belle Vue Boys' School and with Frizinghall Primary School and with parents, teachers and with children around health issues and raising confidence and self-esteem. This work is continuous and I hope to foster relations with all schools in my ward over the coming year.

Focused on issues such as littering, refuse collection, school places, street lighting, passport issues, immigration, housing, gritting, planning applications, school appeals. I have taken up these issues within Council and with individual officers and departments.

During the year I have represented the Heaton ward at charitable functions within Bradford.

As a member on the Bradford West Area Committee I have highlighted and represented my ward needs and issues such as road maintenance, speeding issues and the need for modern street lighting. Also community resources for local community organisations.

As a member of the Heath Scrutiny Committee I have scrutinised the health provision across the Bradford district as well as for the Heaton ward and highlighted local concerns of the lack of dental care available. Also acceptable G.P provision as well as mental health resources. Further I have been instrumental in highlighting and looking at ways to cut down the waiting time at the B.R.I for patients.

As part of the Grants Advisory Group I have argued and supported local organisations in securing funding to run local initiatives for the residents of Heaton and Frizinghall.
